By His Excellency Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.,

WHEREAS certain telegraphic instructions have been addressed to the Governor of Western Australia by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies; Now Therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, do hereby, in pursuance of the said instructions, announce and proclaim that, on Tuesday, the 21st day of June instant, being the Fiftieth Anniversary of the proclamation of Her Majesty's accession to the Throne, and the day particularly appointed for the celebration of Her Majesty's Jubilee,

The Queen desires to render thanks to Almighty God for many mercies vouchsafed during Her reign, and for the loyalty of Her faithful subjects throughout Her dominions.

And, in further pursuance of the said instructions, I do hereby also announce and proclaim that a statement in the above words may be made on behalf of Her Majesty, by the proper authority in any Church or Chapel within the Colony of Western Australia, at any thanksgiving service, before any special prayers appointed to be said.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this 13th day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!!!

Address to Her Majesty from the Legislative Council of Western Australia.

The following Address was presented to His Excellency the Governor for transmission to Her Majesty, on the 16th instant; Mr. Speaker and Members of the Legislative Council having proceeded to Government House for the purpose:—

To Her Majestn, Victoria,

By the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India.

May it Please Your Majesty,

We, the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Council of Western Australia, in Council assembled, approach Your Majesty with feelings of the sincerest love and loyalty on this most happy and national occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of Your Majesty's accession.

As in the case of other portions of Your Majesty's vast Empire, the history and career of the Colony we represent had scarcely begun when Your Majesty inherited the Throne of Your Majesty's ancestors, and it is in Your Majesty's name that this territory has been administered from almost the first commencement of its settlement and civilisation, which therefore claim some place among the imperial achievements of Your Majesty's glorious reign.

For this, and for the other reasons common to Your Majesty's loyal subjects throughout the world, Your Majesty's Jubilee will nowhere be celebrated with greater joy than in Western Australia. We offer to Your Majesty our respectful congratulations; and we earnestly trust that—sustained amidst the cares of Empire by the affection of the Royal Family of England, and by the loving allegiance of a people whose pride and pleasure it is to acknowledge and revere the Sovereign who has ever respected their rights and liberties, the Friend who has ever sympathised with them in their triumphs and in their trials—Your Majesty may, for many years to come, continue, by the providence of God, to wisely wear the Royal and Imperial Crown which Your Majesty has so well and so nobly adorned, for half a century on this memorable day.

We humbly beg Your Majesty to accept the assurance of our continued devotion and loyalty to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

Jubilee Day celebrated in the Colony by contribution to Imperial Institute, foundation of Victoria Public Library in Perth, and many demonstrations of affectionate loyalty. Addresses will be sent by mail."

GOVERNOR OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

The following are the arrangements for the celebration of Her Majesty's Jubilee in Perth and Fremantle.

On TUESDAY, THE 21st INSTANT.

At 10 a.m. His Excellency the Governor, Officers of Government, Volunteers, &c., will attend a special service at St. George's Cathedral. Religious services will also be held in the various Churches and Chapels in Perth.at the same hour.

At 10.45 a.m. His Excellency the Governor, attended by the members of the Executive Council, will proceed to the Town Hall, where His Excellency will be met by the Municipal Council, to receive an Address for presentation to Her Majesty the Queen. (a)

At 11 a.m. a Procession will be formed in the Mayor's Parlor, in the following order, and proceed to the Platform:—

The Town Clerk.

Members of the City Council.

The Mayors of Fremantle and Guildford

and the Speaker of the Legislative Council.

Members of the Executive Council.

Governor's Staff.

His Excellency the Governor, and the Mayor of Perth.

On reaching the Platform the Band will play "God Save the Queen."

The Address to Her Majesty will then be read by the Mayor, and presented to His Excellency the Governor, for transmission to Her Majesty.

After the Ceremony, the Procession will re-form in reverse order and return to the Mayor's Parlor (Band playing).

At 11.30 a.m. His Excellency the Governor will proceed from the Town Hall to the site of the Victoria Public Library. The procession (over which, and the arrangements connected with the subsequent ceremony, Captain Phillips, Commissioner of Police, will have entire control) will be formed in Barrack Street, in the following order:—

Band.

Guard of Honour.

Societies.

Officials.

Heads of Departments.

Municipal Councils.

City Council.

Clergy.

Members of Legislative Council.

Members of Executive Council.

Their Honours the Chief Justice and Puisne Judge.

His Excellency the Governor and Staff.

Mounted Escort.

The procession, in the foregoing order, will move off from the Town Hall by way of St. George's Terrace.

On arriving opposite the site of the Victoria Library, the Guard of Honour will form across the street, and the procession will pass into the enclosure.

The public will be accommodated in the surrounding space.

His Excellency the Governor having taken his position on the platform, the Guard of Honour will present arms, the Band playing "God Save the Queen."

His Excellency will then lay the Foundation Stone of the Library. (b)

The school children, accompanied by the Band, will sing the National Anthem, the Guard presenting arms.

His Excellency the Governor will then proceed to the New Recreation Ground, where he will be received by the Volunteer Force in Review Order

The Volunteers will fire a Royal Salute and feu de joie, after which the Colours will be Trooped.

The Volunteers will be marched to the Town Hall, where they will be entertained at Luncheon.

His Worship the Mayor will entertain His Excellency the Governor, and invited guests, at Luncheon at the Town Hall at 1.45.

Athletic Sports will take place during the afternoon on the New Recreation Ground.

A Ball in honour of the occasion will be given by His Excellency the Governor at Government House in the evening.

Note.—Children from different Schools will assemble, under charge of their teachers, not later than eleven o'clock, at the Boys' Government School, St. George's Terrace, in the space allotted for them, entering the ground by the school gates. Teachers are requested to be punctual, to avoid confusion.

On WEDNESDAY, THE 22nd INSTANT.

His Excellency the Governor will leave Perth by special train at 10 a.m., arriving at Fremantle at 10·30 a.m., to attend the ceremonial of the opening of the Town and Jubilee Hall.

A procession to the Town and Jubilee Hall will be formed at the Fremantle Railway Station, under the direction of the Fremantle Municipal Authorities. (c)

On conclusion of the ceremony, His Excellency the Governor will return by special train to Perth.

In the evening His Excellency the Governor and suite will attend a Ball at the Fremantle Town and Jubilee Hall, given by His Worship the Mayor and the Corporation of Fremantle, in honour of Her Majesty's Jubilee.

His Excellency the Governor will give a Tradesmen's Ball at Government House, in honor of Her Majesty's Jubilee, on Friday, the 24th inst., and a Children's Fancy Dress Ball on Tuesday, the 28th inst.

We, the Mayor and Corporation of the Borough of Fremantle, in the distant province of Western Australia, on the auspicious occasion of Your Majesty's Jubilee, humbly desire to assure Your Majesty of our continued Loyalty and Allegiance to Your Majesty's Throne and Person, and our unswerving attachment to the Dynasty of which Your Majesty is the head and representative.

We recognise with thankfulness the Divine Goodness which has spared Your Majesty for so many years to reign over the great British Empire; and we congratulate Your Majesty upon the wonderful extension of British power, prestige, and influence, especially in this Island Continent of Australia, during the fifty years of Your Majesty's reign.

- Geraldton.—(1st day)—Procession of Children singing National Anthem, Presentation of Address to Government Resident, Naming of Victoria Square, Children's Picnic and Sports, Opening of Geraldton-Greenough Railway, Presentation of Jubilee Medals, Firework display, Torchlight Procession and general Illuminations.
 - (2nd day)—Thanksgiving Service, Volunteer Parade, Naming of Victoria Hospital, Review of Volunteers, Volunteer Sports and Volunteer Ball.
 - (3rd day)—Athletic Sports, Free Musical Union Concert, Free Ball, Aboriginal Natives' Fête and Distribution of Presents to Natives.
 - [Local fêtes for Children will be held at Northampton, North Greenough, South Greenough, and Dongara.]
- Murray.—Thanksgiving Service, Free Public Banquet, Athletic Sports, Firework display, and Public Ball.
- Northam.—Naming of Jubilee Recreation Ground, School Fête, Athletic Sports, Illuminations, and Public Ball.
- Roebourne.—Opening of Cossack-Roebourne Tramway, Laying of Foundation Stone of Post and Telegraph Offices, Laying of last stone of Hospital, Children's Fête, and Ball.
- Vasse.—Children's Fête, Sports, Illuminations, and Ball.
- York.—Thanksgiving Service, Procession of Children singing National Anthem, Firing of Royal Salute, Children's Feast, Athletic Sports, Torchlight Procession, General Illumination, Free Concert, Firework display, and Ball.

Copy of Circular addressed to Heads of Government Hospitals, Poor Houses, Prisons, &c.

 $\frac{2 \cdot 2 \cdot 2 \cdot 5}{8 \cdot 7}$ His Excellency The Governor to The Honorable The Colonial Secretary.

I think that arrangements should be made, by the Departments concerned, to render the 21st of June, the Day of Her Majesty's Jubilee, a day, as far as possible, of relaxation, and even—within proper limits—of pleasure, in every Public Institution in which men or women are domiciled and maintained at the Public Expense. This will include all Hospitals, Poor Houses, and Prisons. Every inmate should be provided with a really exceptionally good dinner. Tobacco should be given to those who smoke.

- 2. The officer officially responsible for each Institution should be charged with the duty of seeing that the necessary arrangements are made. He should receive a copy of this Minute, and should report without delay what is proposed, so that I may know. This Minute should be read to the inmates of each Institution.
- 3. After the Jubilee, each officer should report what has been done, and how the day has passed off, as I shall be very interested to learn.
 - 4. No work that can be properly left undone should be done on Jubilee Day.

His Excellency has been also pleased to direct the Release of twenty-five Aboriginal Native Prisoners, now confined on Rottnest Island.
