Messages to be strictly confined to public business. As few words as possible to be used.

Messages not to be sent in the evening telegraph hour (i.e. from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.) unless such as require, in the interests of the Public Service, attention during that hour.

The Postmaster General has been requested to bring to notice any infraction of this Order, with a view to recovering payment from the senders of messages not complying therewith.
