In continuation of my report, dated 10th December, 1886, I have the honor to forward to you, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, the following despatch containing information on matters of importance connected with the district of East Kimberley, up to the date of my departure.

ROADS.—Owing to the liberal sum of money granted by the Government for repairs of roads, I have been able to make great improvements, and by the time the money has been expended there will be little or no difficulty in taking heavy loads to the goldfields. A new line of road has been discovered by Mr. W. J. O'Donnell, avoiding all the heaviest and roughest parts; he states the distance to be 210 miles from Hall's Creek, the centre of the reefing district, thereby decreasing the distance from that locality to Wyndham by 40 miles, and in the event of a railway to the goldfields being decided upon, I think that if this line is taken, it will be made at a lower cost than any other.

JETTY.—I strongly recommend that the Government should commence this work at an early date. The present landing is of a very primitive nature, and, owing to the great rise and fall of tide, delays and difficulties of bringing cargo on shore are continually occurring; and now that heavy machinery will be shortly landed, and also that the great importance of the district is fully established, I impress upon the Government the necessity of having this work put in hand with as little delay as possible.

HARBOR.—During the last wet season three out of the five buoys laid down last October have sunk, but as the bearings were taken carefully by Mr. Surveyor Ranford and Mr. Butcher at the time they were put down, I anticipate no difficulty in their recovery. I wish to take this opportunity of mentioning that iron bell-shaped buoys are the most suited for these Northern latitudes. Wooden buoys are soon ruined by the heat, and no matter what care may be taken there is always a risk of the timber shrinking to such an extent that they soon sink.

WATER SUPPLY.—Efforts should be made to obtain a good supply of water on the New Townsite, and I am of opinion that the best plan to pursue would be to make use of a boring apparatus. Water can only be obtained at a great depth, and the boring will be through hard slate. The Engineer, Mr. Dowley, has examined the site for a reservoir, mentioned in my last report, and will doubtless give his opinion on the matter.

COAL.—Since writing my previous report on this subject, I am still more convinced that coal exists in the vicinity of Wyndham, and I would recommend that a bonus, say £5,000, be offered for the discovery of this precious mineral. Now that numbers of practical men are in the district, every encouragement should be given to induce miners to prospect for this most valuable article.

MINERALS.—Before leaving Wyndham reports reached me that a well-defined lode of tin had been discovered about 80 miles from the Gulf. Samples of ore were sent to Palmerston for assay, and the result was a return of 65 per cent. This will prove of great value to the country, and being on the direct line to the goldfields will show the necessity of providing cheap means of transit in that direction. The mineral country appears to run in a direct line from Wyndham to the goldfields, and a railway to Hall's Creek from the Gulf would therefore open up a vast area of country known to contain minerals of various descriptions.

GOLD.—Payable patches of gold have lately been discovered on the Panton River, and the gold-bearing country, from all the information I could obtain, appears to run in the direction of Wyndham. Diggers have informed me that a large strip of auriferous country lies between the Panton and Bowe Rivers, and when this locality is properly prospected I am convinced that gold will be discovered within 150 miles of the Gulf. Numerous reefs have lately been found, notably one on Hall's Creek, commonly known as Jackson's Reef, one at Mount Dockrell, and one on the Panton River. Machinery to work the two former will shortly be landed in the Kimberley District, and as soon as this has been erected on the Goldfields, a great impetus will be given to the reefing industry. The opinion of all practical miners is, that in Kimberley there is one of the grandest reefing countries ever yet discovered.

PASTORAL.—It gives me great pleasure to give satisfactory accounts of the stations upon the Ord River; the cattle are increasing in number, and are in grand condition. No disease exists, but I think that steps should be taken to have all cattle coming across the border carefully examined. The sheep belonging to the Victoria Squatting Company are doing well. The country belonging to this Company is reported to be of first class quality, and I am informed that there is a large area of magnificent land adjoining their runs.

And now, Sir, in bringing this report to a conclusion, I wish to point out the great importance of establishing greater facilities of communication to the Kimberley District, especially that of East Kimberley. Western Australia has a most valuable possession in her Northern country, but owing to its position there is and will be difficulty in bringing trade and traffic to her Southern ports. By low rates of freights by steamers, telegraphic and increased steam communication, I think that the greater part, if not all, the trade can be directed South. The rapid development of the Kimberley country necessitates immediate action on the part of the Government and the Legislature.

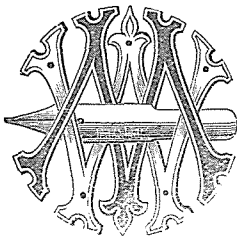
