I have to request that you will take such measures as you may think desirable for giving publicity to the Prospectus, and inviting public attention to the advantages offered by the College.

The College will open on Tuesday, October 4th, 1887.

The College Session will extend from the beginning of October to the beginning of July, and will be divided into three terms of about eleven weeks each, with about three weeks' vacation at Christmas and at Easter.

The Charge for Board, Lodging, and Tuition will be £30 a term, payable in advance. This charge will include all expenses except Laundress, special Medical Attendance, Fees for University Examinations, and individual lessons in Music, Singing or Painting. Arrangements will be madetto allow Stadents whose circumstances render it necessary, and who obtain permission from the Principal, to reside in College during the vacations, under proper supervision, at a fixed weekly charge.

The Staff will consist of Resident Women Tutors and Lecturers, and of visiting Professors and Lecturers, men and women, from London and elsewhere.

The principal subjects of Instruction will be: Divinity, Classics, Mediaval and Modern Languages, Mathematics, Natural Science, History and Political Economy, Mental and Moral Science and Theory of Music.

The Curriculum will be so arranged as to prepare Students for the London University Degrees, for the Oxford Honor Examinations, and for such other Examinations as the Governors may hereafter find desirable.

There will be yearly courses of instruction in Hygiene, Ambulance work, Cookery and Needlework, as well as Classes for Gymnastic Exercises, Drawing and Vocal Music, and special lessons in Painting, Instrumental Music and Solo Singing for Students who desire them.

Students may select their course of study, subject to the approval of the Principal.

Those who do not wish to study for a University Examination will be admitted, provided they satisfy the Principal that they are bond fide Students, with some definite course in view.

No Student may enter for less than one year, or reside for more than four years, without special permission from the Governors. The Principal may require the withdrawal of any Student who is not profiting by the education of the College.

Candidates for admission must be over 17 years of age, must furnish to the Principal satisfactory references, and pass an Entrance Examination.

The following Examinations will be accepted in place of the Entrance

The London Matriculation.

The Oxford Women's First Examination.

The Higher Certificate Examination of the Oxford and Cambridge

The Cambridge Higher Local Examination in any two of the groups A, B and C.

The various Senior Local Examinations of the Universities of England, Scotland, Ireland and the Colonies, provided two Languages, or one Language and Mathematics, are included in the pass.

And such other Examinations as the Governors may from time to time deem equivalent.

An Entrance Examination will be held, for the convenience of Students, at Queen's College, 43, Harley Street, London, W., on Thursday and Friday, August 4th and 5th. If any Students are unable to attend this Examination, they may be examined at The Royal Holloway College on Thursday and Friday, September 29th and 30th. Forms of Entry may be obtained (with further information) from the Secretary, and must be returned to him filled up (if possible) not later than July 15th. The Examination will consist of:—

(1.) Obligatory subjects, viz., Arithmetic, (English Essay, and a paper on English History and General Geography.

(2.) Optional subjects, of which not less than two nor more than four may be taken, one, at least, being a language, viz., Latin, Greek, French, German, Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry.

Each Student will have a Bed-room and Sitting-room to herself, and every provision has been made in the internal arrangements of the College for the health and comfort of its inmates. The Building includes Chapel, Dining-hall, Library, Reading-room, Museum, and a Picture Gallery containing a valuable collection of modern British paintings. The Grounds and Gardens are extensive, and provided with Tennis Courts. There is also a Gymnasium.

No religious test will be imposed as a condition of admission. The domestic life of the College will be that of a Christian household, and Prayers will be said daily by the Principal. Provision will be made for the conduct of Divine Service in the Chapel on Sundays. Students will be allowed, under proper regulations, to attend the Services of any Religious denomination which their parents or guardians may desire.

The Founder has provided that in the third year from the opening of the College, and in all future years, twelve Foundation Scholarships shall be awarded.

Algebra.—To the Binomial Theorem, inclusive.

(A Candidate will pass in this subject if she shows sound knowledge up to and including simple equations.)

Geometry.—Euclid's Elements. Books i.—iv., vi., and xi. 1—21.

(A Candidate will pass if she knows the two first Books.)

Trigonometry.—So far as to include the solution of triangles. In all the papers great importance will be attached to sound elementary work.

Students who, from residence abroad or other sufficient cause, are unable to attend the Entrance Examination in August, may be examined at the Royal Holloway College on Thursday and Friday, September 29th and 30th.

SCHOLARSHIPS.

Fifteen Scholarships of £50 a year each, tenable in the College for three years from its opening, will be awarded on the results of the Entrance Examination in August.

A Scholarship may be awarded for special excellence in one or two subjects, or for a high aggregate of marks. A paper which falls below a certain standard of excellence will have no value assigned to it. The Governors do not pledge themselves to award all the Scholarships if Candidates of sufficient merit do not present themselves.

All Scholars will be expected to work for an Honor Examination of Oxford or London, and will hold their Scholarships subject to a yearly report from the Principal respecting their conduct and progress.

TENDERS (endorsed "Tender for Wyndham, Derby, and Goldfields Mail") will be received at this Office until noon of Tuesday, the 31st January, 1888, for the conveyance of the undermentioned Mails for one, two, or three years:—

- 1. From the Wyndham Post Office to the Warden's Camp, Kimberley, and vice versá, once in every four weeks, on horseback and by spring vehicle; to travel viâ Messrs. Durack Bros.' Ord River Station. The Mails to leave Wyndham on the 9th, and the Goldfields Station on the 18th, of every month. Distance, 220 miles.
- 2. For a similar service between Derby and the Goldfields, and vice versá, leaving Derby on the 1st, and the Goldfields Station on the 19th, of every month. Distance, 345 miles vehicle track, 300 miles packhorse track. When either of the above days fall on a Sunday, the Mails to be despatched the day previous.
- 3. Tenders must state the mode in which the Mails will be carried, whether in vehicle or on horse-back, the description of vehicle, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn, and must give the prices separately for each service.
- 4. The Contractors will have the right to purchase the Government mail horses and equipments at a valuation.
- 5. Every Tender must bear the bona fide signatures duly witnessed of the Tenderer and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the due fulfilment of the Contract in a sum not exceeding the gross amount of the Contract calculated for the whole period over which it extends.
- 6. Every Tender must be accompanied by the written consent, duly witnessed, of the persons proposed as bondsmen as hereinbefore provided to execute the bonds as aforesaid for the due performance of the Contract in the event of such Tender being accepted.
- 7. Every Tender must be accompanied by a deposit receipt for a sum equal to 5 per cent. of the annual amount for which the Tenderer is willing to undertake the service. The money to be lodged in the Western Australian Bank in the name and to the credit of the Postmaster General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose Tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond to the satisfaction of the

Postmaster General within fourteen days of the date of notice being received by him of the acceptance of his Tender. The deposit will be returned to the successful Tenderers on their bonds being completed, and unsuccessful Tenderers will have their deposits returned to them on application and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

- 8. The Postmaster General will reserve the power during the continuance of any Contract of varying the days and hours for despatching the Mails, so long as the rate of travelling is not altered. The Postmaster General will also have the power of ordering any deviation in the route that may appear desirable, but compensation for increased distance, if over one mile, consequent on such deviation will be paid to the contractor at contract rate per mile; or in the event of the distance being lessened a similar proportionate deduction will be made, a corresponding increased or decreased time for transit of Mails being allowed. The time table will in all cases be framed in accordance with the rate of speed.
- 9. Where the Mail is conveyed in a vehicle, the Contractor will have to provide, when required, a seat for a Post Office Guard, which must be separate from the seats provided for the passengers, and measure at least 24 inches. He will also have to provide a proper seat, free of charge, for the Postmaster General, or any officer travelling on the service of the Post Office and Telegraphic Department on the written order of the Postmaster General.
- 10. The Postmaster General reserves the right of terminating the Contract at any time after the first year, upon giving the Contractor three months' notice of such his intention.
- 11. The Contractor will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet by any of his servants to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under a penalty of not less than five pounds for each offence, and may be licensed to retail Postage Stamps receiving discount of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on sales.
- 12. The words Postmaster General shall also include and mean any Officer duly authorised by the Postmaster General to act on his behalf.

Special Forms of Tender, with conditions attached, may be obtained on application to the various Postmasters, and at the General Post Office, Perth; and no Tender will be entertained unless correctly rendered on the prescribed form.

The Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any Tender.
