IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that, by virtue of the powers vested in him by Her Majesty, and acting upon the unanimous advice of the Executive Council, he did on the 14th instant, by writing under his hand, interdict His Honor ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Esquire, from exercising the powers and functions of the office of Chief Justice of the Colony and of the other offices held by His Honor under Commission or Warrant granted by Her Majesty, or issued in Her Majesty's name, or under Her Majesty's authority.

The aforesaid interdiction has been issued for the reason that His Honor the Chief Justice, while certain charges against His Honor were under consideration by the Governor-in-Council, did cause to be published in the public press of the Colony, on the 14th of September, certain official matters and documents relating to confidential business of the Government, and to a confidential despatch of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State; among such matters and documents being a letter addressed, on the 7th September, to the Secretary of State by His Honor the Chief Justice (and duly forwarded by His Excellency the Governor by the mail of the 9th September), which letter submitted for the consideration of the Secretary of State charges and statements directed against His Excellency the Governor.

The aforesaid interdiction is to continue until the Secretary of State's telegraphic orders, which have been requested thereon, shall have been received, when a further notification will be issued.

Pending telegraphic communication with the Secretary of State, GEORGE WALPOLE LEAKE, Esquire, Q.C., has been appointed to act as Chief Justice of the Colony.

H IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for general information, that so soon as a Bill now before the Imperial Parliament shall have been passed, and shall have come into force, Officers of this Government entitled to pension from Imperial funds will no longer suffer any deduction from such pension on account of their employment at any rate of salary whatever by a Colonial Government. Timber Licenses for Special Area on the Darling Range.

T IS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to order and direct, in virtue of the powers vested in him, that all that portion of Crown land situate in the Swan District, and bounded on the *Westward* by the Western face of the Darling Range; on the *Northward* by the Newcastle Road; on the *Eastward* by Worriloo Brook, and by a line running South from near where the said Brook crosses the Northam Road to the Helena River; and on the *South* by the Helena River—shall be subject, in so far as the felling, cutting, splitting, and removing of timber is concerned, to the following Regulations.

Within the above defined area a block of 3 square miles will be retained by the Crown specially for the use of persons engaged cutting up timber by hand, commonly known as "Pit Sawyers."

REGULATIONS.

1. Applications will be received at the Crown Lands' Office for special licenses to cut over timber forest lots fronting on the railway or otherwise. Upon approval of an application, the lot comprised therein will be offered by Public Auction.

2. The conditions of such special timber licenses shall be:

- (a) Each lot fronting on the railway shall have a mean breadth of one mile or thereabouts, and a mean depth of three miles or thereabouts. An upset price of £100 per annum, for a term of 14 years, for each lot as aforesaid.
- (b) Each lot not fronting on the railway shall be of an area not less than 640 acres, except only in cases where such an area shall not be available for that purpose. An upset price at the rate of £20 per annum for each quantity of 640 acres, for a term of 14 years, for each lot.
- (c) In all the above cases the Crown reserves the right to sell, or to except from sale, or to reserve, or to lease, or to dispose of in any other manner the whole or any portion of the land over which the license shall exist. Provided that in the case of a sale, reservation, or other disposition as aforesaid of any portion of the said land not exceeding one-sixth of the same, notice in writing of the intention to sell, reserve, or otherwise dispose of as aforesaid shall be given at least two months previously to such sale, reservation, or other disposition of the sale, reservation, or other disposition of the sale, reservation, or other disposition of the whole of such land or of any portion thereof exceeding one-sixth of the same, notice in writing of the intention aforesaid shall be given at least 12 months previously to such sale, reservation, or other disposition. The licensee shall be at liberty to remove timber from the land to be sold, reserved, or otherwise disposed of as aforesaid during the term of two months or twelve months respectively after the giving of such notice.

3. Applications for licenses, under Clause 93 of the Land Regulations, for permission to fell, cut, split, and remove timber from Crown Lands within the beforenamed area, upon land not included in any reserve, or in any special license, shall only be received at the Crown Lands' Office, Perth, and shall be subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) All logs felled shall be cut across into one or more lengths, and not merely felled and left with the top and branches on.
- (b) All logs so cut across shall be removed to the mill, or to a platform alongside the Railway, or, in the event of the person felling being a person engaged "Pit sawing," to his sawpit, within one month from the date of felling.
- (c) Any breach of the above regulations, besides being punishable under Act 36 Vic. No. 8, shall also render the license of the offender, together with any timber remaining unremoved, liable to forfeiture; and a renewal of the license shall not be granted except on the special approval of the Governor.

4. The Land Regulations of the 2nd March, 1887, shall be held to apply to the beforementioned area, in so far as the said Regulations are not inconsistent with the present Regulations. No. 3177.-C.S.O.

Regulation made by the Governor, in Executive Council, under "The Pearl Shell Fishery Regulation Act, 1875."

(39 Vict., No. 13.)

WHEREAS Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, K.C.M.G., &c., late Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, did in Executive Council, under the provisions of the second section of the said Act, make, and did, in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia of the 14th day of December, 1880, publish certain Regulations in respect of, *inter alia*, the circumstances under which diving for pearl shells should or should not be carried on; and it is expedient to alter or vary one of the said Regulations, in so far as it relates to the age of persons who may be employed in diving for pearl shells :

I, Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, direct and declare as follows, that is to say:—

In lieu of the words, "Any person who shall not have arrived at the age of puberty," which words form part of the first of the said Regulations, there shall be, and there are hereby substituted therefor the words following, that is to say :---

"Any person who shall not, in the opinion of the person endorsing the contract, be of the apparent age of sixteen years."

2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.

3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.

4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be com-puted in accordance with the scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881.

5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.
