LIGHTS AND BEACONS CHANNEL, BRISBANE RIVER. ATBOAT

NOTICE is hereby given that two leading lights, red and white, are now placed on the S.E. Fisherman Island which, when in line bearing S.E. ‡ S., lead through the cutting, which is still unfinished, in 3½ feet low-water springs.

In o_2 leet 10w-water springs.

By day the line of the cutting is marked by two triangular beacons placed beyond its south-eastern end.

To enter at night from the Bay keep the white leading Lights at Lytton in line bearing W. by N. ½ N. until the red and white Lights on Fisherman Island are coming in line, when haul up and keep them in line until within ½ a cable of the mangroves, when a vessel can anchor or proceed on as usual.

The back light, which is white, stands at an elevation of 30 feet, and is 1,258 feet E. 3 N. from the back Bar leading light.

The front light, which is red, stands 12 feet above high water, and is 1,240 feet from the back white light.

The line of lights passes about 1 cable north-eastward of the position of the outer black and white beacon as shown on the chart.

Regulation made by the Governor, in Executive Council, under "The Pearl Shell Fishery Regulation Act, 1875." (39 Vict., No. 13.)

Whereas Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, K.C.M.G., &c., late Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, did in Executive Council, under the provisions of the second section of the said Act, make, and did, in the Government Gazette of Western Australia of the 14th day of December, 1880, publish certain Regulations in respect of, inter alia, the circumstances under which diving for pearl shells should or should not be carried on; and it is expedient to alter or vary one of the said Regulations, in so far as it relates to the age of persons who may be employed in diving for pearl shells:

I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, direct and declare as follows, that is to say:—

In lieu of the words, "Any person who shall not have arrived at the age of puberty," which words form part of the first of the said Regulations, there shall be, and there are hereby substituted therefor the words following, that is to say:—

"Any person who shall not, in the opinion of the person endorsing the contract, be of the apparent age of sixteen years."

Regulation made by the Governor-in-Council under "The Goldfields Act, 1886."

(50th Vict., No. 18.)

Whereas by Section 79 of "The Goldfields Act, 1886," it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor-in-Council from time to time to make, alter, and repeal such Regulations as might be necessary for the purpose of giving effect to the said Act and for the management of Goldfields generally. Now THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint

George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do by these Regulations, made in pursuance of the said Act, by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, direct and declare as follows, that is to say:—

That No. 92 of the Regulations for the management of Goldfields, made and approved by the Governor in Executive Council on the 1st of October, 1886, shall be and is hereby repealed, and the following Regulation substituted in lieu thereof:—

No. 92. Rewards shall be paid to the discoverers of new Goldfields as follows:—A reward of not less than £500 and not more than £1,000 shall be paid to any person or persons who shall discover a Goldfield—deemed by the Governor in Executive Council to be a payable Goldfield—in any of the following Divisions of the Colony, as defined by the Land Regulations of the 2nd March, 1887, namely:—

South-West Division. Gascoyne Division. North-West Division. Eucla Division. Eastern Division.

Not more than one such reward shall be payable in respect of each of the said Divisions.

The reward shall be paid to such person or persons as may be deemed to be entitled thereto by the Governor in Executive Council, whose decision on any matter arising under this Regulation shall be binding and final without appeal.

Notice to Depositors in the Post Office Savings' Bank.

THE attention of Depositors in the Post Office Savings' Bank is directed to the following Clause in the Post Office Savings' Bank Regulations, framed under Act 28 Victoria, No. 1:

"Every Depositor shall, once in each year, on the "anniversary of the day on which he made the first "deposit, forward his Book to the principal office of "the Postmaster General, in a cover to be obtained "at any Post Office Savings' Bank, in order that the "entries in the said Book may be compared with "the entries in the Books of the Postmaster General, "and that the interest due to the Depositor may be "inserted in his Book."

And with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of Section 13, 27 Victoria, No. 5, that any Depositor who may have failed to comply with this Regulation is required within three calendar months from the date hereof to transmit his or her Deposit Book to the General Post Office, Perth, for such examination, or in default will be debarred from claiming rectification of any errors that may exist in such Depositor's Account. The non-observance of this Regulation in the future will also subject the Depositor to be similarly dealt with.

- 2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.
- 3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.
- 4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881.
- 5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.
- 6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by
- The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to the existing Jetty Regulations.

- The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails, if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods. with goods placed more than three yards from the rails,
- 9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.
- 10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the Principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of jetties), the Contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrangements with parties requiring his services.
- A bond of £300 for Albany and Geraldton and £100 for all other jetties, with two sureties in similar amounts, will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Contract to terminate at any time on the Government giving one month's notice.
- 12. When a Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most advantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of rent will be made.
- 13. The principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.
- 14. The Principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the colony.

15. That any tender accepted for the service during 1888 will not commence until these conditions are signed by the tenderer and his sureties.

TENDERS FOR PUBLIC WORKS.

To Telegraph Contractors and Others.

Offices, Perth, Western Australia, up to noon on Wednesday, 30th November, 1887, from persons willing to construct a line of telegraph from Derby to the Kimberley Goldfield, a distance of 280 miles or thereabouts, and a similar line from Wyndham (Cambridge Gulf) to the same place on the Goldfield, a distance of 220 miles or thereabouts.

The construction will consist of a copper wire (No. 14) carried on iron posts (Siemens' patent), and the whole of the materials, wire, insulators, and posts will be supplied by the Government at Derby and Wyndham respectively.
