HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-Law made under the provisions of Clause II of "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act":—

From and after the first day of November, 1887, any person shipping Pearl Shell from Sharks Bay within the limits defined by the Act (50 Vict., No. 14) shall, within 14 days after such shipment has been made, make a statutory declaration as to the quantity shipped, and shall lodge the same with the principal officer of Customs at the nearest port.

Any person convicted of a breach of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Code Messages.

THE Traffic Department of the Eastern Telegraph Company, Limited, advise as under:—

Some doubt having arisen with respect to the interpretation of the Berlin Service Regulations Nos. 6, 8, and 9, referring to Telegrams in Code, as embodied in this Company's Rules Nos. 6 and 7, the subject of charging for Code words exceeding ten letters has been referred to the British Post Office and the International Bureau.

Under the Convention Code, words containing more than ten letters cannot be accepted in Code telegrams, but in order to avoid the inconvenience which a prohibition would occasion, it has been decided that words exceeding ten letters in length shall be treated as letter cypher, and be charged for at the rate of three letters to a word.

This decision also applies to proper names exceeding ten letters in length, and which are not used in their natural sense.

Code telegrams may contain one or more passages in plain language, but such passage must be intelligible on the face of it, as, for instance, "Imperatrice arrived" (in Extra-European telegrams 3 words) or, "Pay Majoribanks hundred pounds" (in Extra-European telegrams 5 words.)

It must be understood from this, that an isolated word, although used in its natural sense, does not constitute a passage in plain language under the Convention. An isolated proper name in a Code telegram may, however, on the declaration of the Sender that it is used in its natural sense, be accepted and charged for according to the Rules applicable to plain language.

Attention is also drawn to the use, in telegrams, of the combination "alright" or "alright."

This is altogether illegal, and should not be passed at cypher rates. The public should, however, have the option of writing the words separately.
