Code Messages.

Postal and Telegraph Department, General Post Office, Perth, October 3rd, 1887.

THE Traffic Department of the Eastern Telegraph
Company Limited advisor Company, Limited, advise as under:

Some doubt having arisen with respect to the interpretation of the Berlin Service Regulations Nos. 6, 8, and 9, referring to Telegrams in Code, as embodied in this Company's Rules Nos. 6 and 7, the subject of charging for Code words exceeding ten letters has been referred to the British Post Office and the International Bureau.

Under the Convention Code, words containing more than ten letters cannot be accepted in Code telegrams, but in order to avoid the inconvenience which a prohibition would occasion, it has been decided that words exceeding ten letters in length shall be treated as letter cypher, and be charged for at the rate of three letters to a word.

This decision also applies to proper names exceeding ten letters in length, and which are not used in their natural

Code telegrams may contain one or more passages in plain language, but such passage must be intelligible on the face of it, as, for instance, "Imperatrice arrived" (in Extra-European telegrams 3 words) or, "Pay Majoribanks hundred pounds" (in Extra-European telegrams 5 words.)

It must be understood from this, that an isolated word, although used in its natural sense, does not constitute a passage in plain language under the Convention. An iso-lated proper name in a Code telegram may, however, on the declaration of the Sender that it is used in its natural sense, be accepted and charged for according to the Rules applicable to plain language.

Attention is also drawn to the use, in telegrams, of the combination "alright" or "allright."

This is altogether illegal, and should not be passed at cypher rates. The public should, however, have the option of writing the words separately.

Conditions of the Work to be performed and Rates to be charged by Contractor for Trucking.

- 1. The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and from the shore end of the Jetties, and to find labor for loading and discharging the trucks. Trucks will be found by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged through carelessness.
- 2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.
- 3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.
- 4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881.
- 5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.
- 6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.
- 7. The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to the existing Jetty Regulations.

- The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is re-quired, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.
- 9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.
- 10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the Principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of jetties), the Contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrangements with parties requiring his services.
- A bond of £300 for Albany and Geraldton and £100 for all other jetties, with two sureties in similar amounts, will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Contract to terminate at any time on the Government giving one month's notice.
- 12. When a Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most advantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of rent will be made.
- 13. The principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.
- 14. The Principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the colony.

15. That any tender accepted for the service during 1888 will not commence until these conditions are signed by the tenderer and his sureties.
