Celebration of Her Majesty's Jubilee in the Colony.

No. 126.

Government House, Perth, 30th June, 1887.

I have the honor to enclose, herewith, for your information, a copy of the "Government Gazette Extraordinary" of this Colony issued on the 18th instant, containing notices and particulars of arrangements connected with the celebration of Her Majesty's Jubilee in Western Australia.

2. The Addresses printed in the Gazette, together with others which I have received for transmission to Her Majesty, will be forwarded by next mail.

3. I would venture to suggest that the Gazette now enclosed should be laid before the Queen. I feel assured that Her Majesty's Jubilee has in no part of the Empire been celebrated with more enthusiasm and loyalty than in this distant Colony.

4. I may also mention that steps have been taken to further commemorate the Jubilee by the organisation of a Queen's Fund, to be applied in assistance of necessitous and deserving female patients on discharge from hospital. I enclose copy of a circular letter which has been issued by Lady Broome on this subject.

£200 Reward.

HEREAS on Tuesday, the 15th instant, a convict named WILLIAM THOMPSON (No. 10141) escaped from lawful custody in the Gaol, at Fremantle.

AND WHEREAS ON Wednesday, the 16th instant, a convict named THOMAS HUGHES (No. 10385) escaped from lawful custody in the Gaol, at Fremantle.

And whereas both the said convicts are now at large.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned is authorised by His Excellency the Governor to offer a Reward of

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS (£200)

for the capture of the said two convicts, or a Reward of

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS (£100)

for the capture of either of them.

Such Reward of £200 or £100, as the case may be, to be paid to the person, or divided among the persons, effecting the capture.

Any free person, not being a member of the Police Force, who shall desire or be willing to attempt the capture of the said convicts or of either of them, should, before attempting such capture, present himself to a Justice of the Peace, for the purpose of receiving his direction to act in this behalf, and should receive such direction, which direction will bring him under the protection of the 5th Section of the Ordinance 17 Vict., No. 7, which is as follows:—

"5. That if any convict illegally at large, and "being armed with any description of firearms, or "with any weapon or instrument adapted for cut-"ting or stabbing, and capable of inflicting a dan"gerous incised or punctured wound, shall be re"quired to surrender himself by any Justice of the
"Peace, policeman, constable, or officer of a con-"vict prison or depôt, or any free person acting "under the direction or in aid of any such peace or "other officer (whether such policeman, constable, "officer, or free person shall, or shall not, then have "a magistrate's warrant for the apprehension of "such convict), and such convict shall refuse or de-"cline so to surrender himself, and, still retaining "such firearms, weapon or instrument, shall, by "threats or gestures, give reasonable cause to believe "that he is about to use such firearms, weapon, or "instrument, for the purpose of preventing his apprehension, then, and in any such case, it shall be "lawful for such justice, policeman, constable, or "officer, having first declared and notified his official "character to such convict, or for any free person "acting in aid, as aforesaid, by the discharge of any "loaded firearms, or by the use of any weapon or "instrument whatsoever, to disable and overpower "such convict, with a view to his apprehension, "without bodily injury to his captor; and in case "the death of such convict shall be thereby caused, "the same shall be deemed an act of justifiable "homicide; and every such justice, policeman, con-"stable, officer, or free person, acting in aid as

"aforesaid, shall be and is hereby indemnified and "discharged from any indictment, penalty, action, or "other proceeding, for so doing."

Tenders for Wyndham, Derby, and Goldfields Mails.

General Post Office, Perth, 8th August, 1887.

TENDERS (endorsed "Tender for Wyndham, Derby, and Goldfields Mail") will be received at this Office until noon of Tuesday, the 31st January, 1888, for the conveyance of the undermentioned Mails for one, two, or three years:—

- From the Wyndham Post Office to the Warden's Camp, Kimberley, and vice versa, once in every four weeks, on horseback and by spring vehicle; to travel via Messrs. Durack Bros.' Ord River Station. The Mails to leave Wyndham on the 9th, and the Goldfields Station on the 18th, of every month. Distance, 220 miles.
- 2. For a similar service between Derby and the Goldfields, and vice verså, leaving Derby on the 1st, and the Goldfields Station on the 19th, of every month. Distance, 345 miles vehicle track, 300 miles packhorse track. When either of the above days fall on a Sunday, the Mails to be despatched the day previous.
- 3. Tenders must state the mode in which the Mails will be carried, whether in vehicle or on horse-back, the description of vehicle, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn, and must give the prices separately for each service.
- 4. The Contractors will have the right to purchase the Government mail horses and equipments at a valuation.
- 5. Every Tender must bear the bona fide signatures duly witnessed of the Tenderer and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the due fulfilment of the Contract in a sum not exceeding the gross amount of the Contract calculated for the whole period over which it extends.
- 6. Every Tender must be accompanied by the written consent, duly witnessed, of the persons proposed as bondsmen as hereinbefore provided to execute the bonds as aforesaid for the due performance of the Contract in the event of such Tender being accepted.
- 7. Every Tender must be accompanied by a deposit receipt for a sum equal to 5 per cent. of the annual amount for which the Tenderer is willing to undertake the service. The money to be lodged in the Western Australian Bank in the name and to the credit of the Postmaster General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose Tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond to the satisfaction of the Postmaster General within fourteen days of the date of notice being received by him of the acceptance of his Tender. The deposit will be returned to the successful Tenderers on their bonds being completed, and unsuccessful Tenderers will have their deposits returned to them on application and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.
- 8. The Postmaster General will reserve the power during the continuance of any Contract of varying the days and hours for despatching the Mails, so long as the rate of travelling is not altered. The Postmaster General will also have the power of ordering any deviation in the route that may appear desirable, but compensation for increased distance, if over one mile, consequent on such deviation, will be paid to the contractor at contract rate per mile; or in the event of the distance being lessened a similar proportionate deduction will be made, a

corresponding increased or decreased time for transit of Mails being allowed. The time table will in all cases be framed in accordance with the rate of speed.

- 9. Where the Mail is conveyed in a vehicle, the Contractor will have to provide, when required, a seat for a Post Office Guard, which must be separate from the seats provided for the passengers, and measure at least 24 inches. He will also have to provide a proper seat, free of charge, for the Postmaster General, or any officer travelling on the service of the Post Office and Telegraphic Department on the written order of the Postmaster General.
- 10. The Postmaster General reserves the right of terminating the Contract at any time after the first year, upon giving the Contractor three months' notice of such his intention.
- 11. The Contractor will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet by any of his servants to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under a penalty of not less than five pounds for each offence, and may be licensed to retail Postage Stamps, receiving discount of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on sales.
- 12. The words Postmaster General shall also include and mean any Officer duly authorised by the Postmaster General to act on his behalf.

Special Forms of Tender, with conditions attached, may be obtained on application to the various Postmasters, and at the General Post Office, Perth; and no Tender will be entertained unless correctly rendered on the prescribed form.

The Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any Tender.
