## 3299 PROCLAMATION

Mestern Anstralia, to wit.

> (L. S.) F. Napier Broome, Governor.

By His Excellency Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Kuight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886" (50 Vic., No. 17), the Governor did by his Proclamation, dated and published in the Government Gazette on Thursday, the 30th day of September, 1886, proclaim and describe the boundaries of certain Magisterial Districts, including among others the Toodyay Magisterial District and the York Magisterial District; AND WHEREAS the Toodyay Magisterial District abuts upon the York Magisterial District; I THEREFORE, for the purpose of more accurately defining the limits of the said Districts, in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the said Act, hereby Proclaim that the boundaries of the said Magisterial Districts are and shall be as hereinafter described: And I hereby cancel the description given of the boundaries of the said Districts in my said Proclamation.

### Toodyay Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by a line starting from the sea coast and extending due East, passing through the summit of Mt. Lesuer to a spot due North from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan Hills, thence due South to the said summit, and from thence by a due East line to longitude 119° E.; on the West by the sea coast including the islands adjacent; on the South and South-west by lines extending East from the coast aforesaid to a spot on the North branch of the Moore River where the South boundary of Melbourne location 93, at Gillingarra, crosses it, thence downwards along the said North branch to the junction of the North and East branches of the Moore River, thence in a South-south-easterly direction to the 60th mile mark on the road from Perth to New Norcia, thence to the South-west corner of Swan location 95 at Bailup, thence by a South-easterly line to a spot on the Eastern Railway, due North from the North-east corner of Helena Location 22, and on the South-east by the Southeast boundary of the reserve for the Railway aforesaid (the said reserve being a strip of land one chain wide on each side of the centre of the rails) in an East-north-easterly direction till it intersects the western boundary of Avon

Location e1, thence by that location's western and southern boundaries, and crossing the Avon River by its right bank downwards to the south corner of Avon Location P, then East-north-easterly along its southern boundary; then in a South-south-easterly direction along the western boundary of Avon Location 62, and East-north-easterly along the southern boundaries of Avon Locations 62, 1066, 0, and 61 to the western boundary of Avon Location N1, and South-south-easterly to its South corner: thence East-north-easterly along its southern boundary and by a line in about the same direction, till it meets a due East line from the summit of the highest peak in Wongan Hills, at longitude 119° East aforesaid.

### York Magisterial District.

Bounded on the Westward by a due South line from a spot on the Eastern Railway passing along the Eastern boundary of Helena location 22 to its South-east corner, thence in a Southerly direction to the summit of Mount Dale, thence South-easterly to a spot 20 miles East of the 41-mile mark on the Perth-Albany road, then in about the same direction to the Hotham River at Reserve 225A at Cojatotine Pool; on the North-West by the South-east boundary the reserve for the Railway aforesaid (the said reserve being a strip of land one chain wide on each side of the centre of the rails) in an East-north-easterly direction till it intersects the Western boundary of Avon Location e1, thence by that location's Western and Southern boundaries, and crossing the Avon River by its right bank downwards to the South corner of Avon location P, then East-north-easterly along its Southern boundary, then in a South-south-easterly direction along the Western boundary of Avon location 62, and East-north-easterly along the Southern boundary and by a line in about the same direction till it meets a due East line from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan Hills, at longitude 119° East, and thence due East to longitude 124° E.; on the Southward from the South end of the Western boundary extending in a North-easterly direction along the Hotham River upwards to Millingnalling Pool, from thence by an East line to Mt. Glasse in the Bremer Range, and from thence by an East-north-easterly line till it meets the East end of the North boundary, at longitude 124° East aforesaid.

By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BEOOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Ordinance passed in the nine-VV teenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 12, intituled "An Ordinance for the better Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of Western Australia," it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may for the purpose of such Ordinance divide the said Colony into such and so many Registry Districts as he shall think fit, one of them being the Registry District of Perth, and may in like manner, by any subsequent Proclamation, from time to time alter such division; AND WHERE-As by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 14th day of April, 1886, the West and East Kimberley Magisterial Districts as therein defined were constituted Registry Districts for the purpose of the said Ordinance; AND WHEREAS since the date of the said Proclamation the said West and East Kimberley Magisterial Districts have been divided into three Magisterial Districts, viz.:-West Kimberley, East Kimberley, and Kimberley Goldfield, as appears by a notice published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of September, 1886; Now Therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, as such Governor, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the West Kimberley, East Kimberley, and Kimberley Goldfield Magisterial Districts aforesaid be, and the same are hereby constituted Registry Districts for the purpose of the said Ordinance.

Broome, to invite the attention of your Government to the present apparently unsatisfactory nature of the agreements made with imported Chinese coolies, as brought to notice in the enclosed letter, which has been received from the Government Resident of the North District of this Colony, where this class of labor is somewhat extensively employed; with a view to ensuring the more accurate definition of the nature of the work for which

the laborer is engaged.

His Excellency will be glad to receive and consider any suggestion for the improvement of the agreement system

which you may wish to offer.

SIR,-I would respectfully recommend this Government to draw the attention of the authorities at Singapore to the desirability of ensuring the agreements, made there, with Chinese immigrants, under the Imported Labor Act, being more accurately defined than is the practice at present.

present.

Several Chinese imported here lately as "general servants" assert on arrival that they were given to understand at Singapore that they would not be required to work "out of doors," but only as house servants.

Now the term "general servant" is so vague that it

Now the term "general servant" is so vague that it may be taken to mean almost anything that the employer chooses, and this does not always meet the views of the imported laborer. Strictly speaking, a "general servant" in Europe would not mean a cook, but these Chinese are mostly good cooks, and therefore all expect to be employed as such. Whereas the employers generally require their services as shepherds, or for fencing, and such like general station work.

All that is needed to put matters on a clear footing is that, when the agreements are drawn up at Singapore, the exact nature of the labor demanded should be accurately

specified.

SIR,—I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No.  $\frac{73}{13}$  of the 3rd August, with reference to the agreements made with Chinese coolies imported from Singapore.

2. In reply, I am to inform you that the Acting Protector of Chinese for this Government has given instructions that, in all cases where it is possible, the nature of the work for which the coolies are engaged shall be specified, and that where the term "General Servant" is used, "indoor and outdoor" shall be added.

3. I enclose copies of letters from Messrs. Behn, Meyer, & Co., and McAlister & Co., firms acting as agents for engaging Chinese labor for Western Australia, to whom I sent a copy of your letter for any remarks or suggestions they might wish to offer.

4. The contracts are generally made out by them, but in all cases they are carefully explained to the Coolies by the officers of the Chinese Protectorate

Sir,—In reply to your letter Colons. \* \$\frac{1}{6}\frac{3}{6}\fra W. Australia never give any further explanation about the work required, unless in case a man is to be specially em-ployed as cook, carpenter, or for any other special purpose. As far as we are aware, the Protector of Chinese always

explains to the coolies that they are engaged for general station work, but in order to be precise we shall in future insert a clause in the contracts, stipulating that the men will be obliged to work either indoors or out of doors, as directed by the employer; which clause, if duly explained by the Protectorate here, will no doubt obviate any reasonable complaints, which some of the coeffice might have to offer otherwise, when called upon in Australia to do work different to what they had been led to expect here.

So far as we are concerned, and acting as we do as agents in engaging Chinese labor for Western Australia, we adhere very strictly to our instructions in specifying the nature of the work required.

It seems to us that if the Government of Western Australia.

It seems to us that if the Government of Western Australia is dissatisfied, or has cause to consider that the coolies sent from here are not being employed in a proper manner, the cure for this rests very much in its own hands. For example, we might engage a Chinaman to act as cook or house servant, or in any other special capacity, and when he arrived in Western Australia his employer wight require him to est in a deathly empirich require him to est in a deathly empirich and deathly experience. might require him to act in a double capacity, or do some work different altogether to that specified in his agreement. This we should think is a matter for the Government of Western Australia to adjust.

As regards engaging men as "general servants," we have repeatedly done this, but have always explained the full meaning of the employment. It is not an unusual thing for a Chinaman to be engaged as a general servant, that is to act in lawful work for his master indoors or

outside, as his capacity or powers may justify, and the requirements of his master necessitate.

We should consider that if any restrictions are to be exercised in this matter, these should be imposed by the Government of Western Australia.

HEREAS on Tuesday, the 15th instant, a convict named William Thompson (No. 10141) escaped from lawful custody in the Gaol, at Fremantle.

And whereas the said convict is now at large.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned is authorised by His Excellency the Governor to offer a REWARD of

### ONE HUNDRED POUNDS (£100)

for the capture of the said William Thompson.

Such Reward of £100 to be paid to the person, or divided among the persons, effecting the capture.

Any free person, not being a member of the Police Force, who shall desire or be willing to attempt the capture of the said convict, should, before attempting such capture, present himself to a Justice of the Peace, for the purpose of receiving his direction to act in this behalf, and should receive such direction, which direction will bring him under the protection of the 5th Section of the Ordinance 17 Vict., No. 7, which is as follows:-

"5. That if any convict illegally at large, and "being armed with any description of firearms, or "with any weapon or instrument adapted for cut-"ting or stabbing, and capable of inflicting a dan"gerous incised or punctured wound, shall be re"quired to surrender himself by any Justice of the "Peace, policeman, constable, or officer of a con-"vict prison or depôt, or any free person acting "under the direction or in aid of any such peace or "other officer (whether such policeman, constable, "officer, or free person shall, or shall not, then have "a magistrate's warrant for the apprehension of such convict), and such convict shall refuse or de-"cline so to surrender himself, and, still retaining "such firearms, weapon or instrument, shall, by "threats or gestures, give reasonable cause to believe "that he is about to use such firearms, weapon, or "instrument, for the purpose of preventing his apprehension, then, and in any such case, it shall be "lawful for such justice, policeman, constable, or "officer, having first declared and notified his official "character to such convict, or for any free person "acting in aid, as aforesaid, by the discharge of any "loaded firearms, or by the use of any weapon or "instrument whatsoever, to disable and overpower "such convict, with a view to his apprehension, "without bodily injury to his captor; and in case "the death of such convict shall be thereby caused, "the same shall be deemed an act of justifiable "homicide; and every such justice, policeman, con-"stable, officer, or free person, acting in aid as "aforesaid, shall be and is hereby indemnified and "discharged from any indictment, penalty, action, or "other proceeding, for so doing."
