7 HEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit, and also to prorogue the said Council from time to time by proclamation or otherwise whenever he shall deem it expedient; Now THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, deeming it expedient to prorogue the Legislative Council of Western Australia, do hereby announce and proclaim that the said Legislative Council is prorogued accordingly to THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, at NOON, then to meet in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, for the despatch of business; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place.

The first starting from the South-east corner of North Location 36 and (passing through a spot situate fourteen chains and eighty-one links West from the Trigonometrical Station on Mount Welcome) extending North three hundred and sixty chains, the second thence extending East to the South-east corner of North Location 38 one hundred and seventy-six chains, the third thence extending South (passing along the Western boundary of North Location 32) three hundred and sixty chains, and the fourth thence extending West one hundred and seventy-six chains to the starting point. Bearings true.

REGULATIONS UNDER PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, Respecting the Introduction of Animals from all places beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies and New Zealand.

At the Executive Council Office, Adelaide, Oct. 26th, 1887.

Present-

His Excellency the Governor. The Hon. the Premier. The Hon. the Attorney-General.

The Hon. the Commissioner of Public Works. The Hon. the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

The Hon. the Minister of Education.

WHEREAS by the Public Health Act, the Governor in Council is empowered to make such orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regu-lating the introduction into this province from any country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist) of all sheep,

cattle, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever: And whereas various diseases in camels and other animals are known to exist in places beyond the limits of the Australian colonies and New Zea-land: And whereas it is desirable to regulate the introduc-tion into the province from those countries of camels and other animals mentioned in the schedule hereto, and also of such other animals as the Governor shall, by notice in

the Government Gazette, declare the undermentioned regulations, or any of them to apply to: Now therefore I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the above-mentioned Act, and of all other powers and authorities me hereunto enabling, and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said province, do order that the regulations and orders hereinafter set forth for regulating the introduction into the province from places beyond the limits of the Australian colonies and New Zealand of camels, deer, antelope, and goats, and such other animals as the Governor shall, by notice in the Government Gazette, declare these regulations, or any of them, to apply to, shall be forthwith published in the Government Gazette, and from the date of such publication shall have the force and effect of law within the province.

THE SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Orders Regulating the Introduction of Animals from all places beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies and New Zealand.

ORDER 1. In the interpretation of these regulations, the following words in inverted commas shall have the following meanings :---

- "Animal" shall mean camels, deer, antelope, goats, of every age and sex, and such other animals as the Governor shall from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare these regulations, or any of them, to apply to:
- "Destroy" shall mean kill and burn, so that the carcase be consumed, or kill and bury at least twelve inches under the surface of the ground, or throw overboard at sea:
- "Inspector" shall mean the chief inspector, or any inspector of sheep appointed under Act No. 19 of 1859, and any person authorised in writing by the Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Immigration to act as an inspector under these regulations :
- "Land" shall include farms, pasturage, paddocks, enclosures, yards, stables, and buildings:
- "Disease" shall mean any of the diseases known as foot-and-mouth disease, rinderpest, tuberculosis, scabies, lice, and any other disease in any animal which the Governor may hereafter, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare to be infectious or contagious:
- "Owner" or "Consignee" shall include any person having the custody or right to dispose of any animal, fodder, or fittings, whether for his own benefit, or for that of any other person :
- "Fittings" shall mean any pens, boxes, any materials used for penning, yarding, or confining animals, halters, brushes, clothes, buckets, and other articles whatever which may have been brought into contact with any other animal, and also any wool or hair taken from, and any excrement voided by, any animal:
- "Fodder" shall mean any food or bedding used, or which shall have been brought into contact with any animal:
- "Quarantine ground" shall mean any land or vessel now or hereafter to be defined by the Governor, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, as a quarantine ground or place for the reception and keeping of animals, and also any land to which any inspector shall direct the removal of any animal.
- And in every case where the plural number is used, the singular number shall be included, and *vice versa*.

ORDER 2. The captain, or master, or agent of any vessel with any animal on board shall, within twenty-four hours after arrival at the port of Port Adelaide, give notice in writing to the chief inspector of sheep, at Adelaide (or if at any other port in the province of South Australia, then to the nearest inspector) of the arrival of such animals, and stating their description and number. The captain or master shall also forward to the chief inspector, or inspector, a declaration as to the health of the animals on board his vessel during the voyage as in schedule A.

ORDER 3. All deer, antelope, and goats, if on inspection by an inspector are certified free from disease, shall be removed to the Zoological Gardens, Adelaide, and there dressed as directed by the chief inspector of sheep, and shall be detained there for not less than 120 days.

ORDER 4. All animals on board any such vessel shall forthwith be examined by the Government veterinary surgeon, or such veterinary surgeon as the chief inspector shall appoint, and may be washed or disinfected in such manner as the chief inspector shall direct; and an inspector shall, if such animals are certified free from disease, grant a permit that such animals, or such of them as he may in such permit specify, be landed, and no animal of any description shall be landed until such permit shall have been granted. ORDER 5. Any animal suffering from "foot-and-mouth" or rinderpest shall be destroyed.

ORDER 6. All camels arriving by sea into the province shall be landed under the supervision of an inspector, and shall forthwith be removed by the owner or consignee thereof to such land as shall be directed by the said inspector, there to be kept in strict quarantine for 120 days, and to be there dressed and treated in such manner as the inspector shall direct; and should such camels not develop or show scabies, lice, or any contagious or infectious disease at the expiration of the said 120 days, the said camels may be released by an inspector from quarantine; but should any camel develop or show any signs of any contagious or infectious disease, then the said camel or camels shall, at the expense of the owner or consignee thereof, be detained and treated for such further period as the inspector may deem necessary to enable him to certify them as free from disease.

ORDER 7. Any ship named, or any land defined by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* as a quarantine station for animals, shall be a quarantine ground for the purpose of these regulations; and any land to which an inspector shall direct any owner or consignee to remove any camels for the purpose of being dressed or treated for scabies, lice, or any skin disease, shall be a quarantine ground for the purpose of these regulations; and any ship named or any land defined as a quarantine station, and any land used as a quarantine ground, shall be under the control of the chief inspector of sheep.

ORDER 8. No animal shall be removed from a quarantine ground without a permit, to be obtained from an inspector, and the chief inspector may, in any case, cancel, suspend, or refuse the granting of any permit to remove any animals from a quarantine ground until the same shall have been examined by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, and certified by him to be free from disease.

ORDER 9. All animals landed from any vessel or removed to or from a quarantine ground without a permit from an inspector, and all animals not removed from a quarantine ground within twenty-four hours after an inspector shall have granted a permit for their removal, may be sold or destroyed under order of the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Immigration.

ORDER 10. All fodder on board of any vessel conveying animals to the province, and all fittings used in connection with such animals, or any of them, shall be disinfected and cleansed by the owner or consignee in such manner as an inspector shall direct, or shall, if the chief inspector deem it advisable and so order, be destroyed by the owner or consignee; and on neglect by the owner or consignee so to do, may be destroyed by order of an inspector.

ORDER 11. No compensation or claim shall be allowed or payable to any person whatever for any animal, fodder, or fittings sold or destroyed under these regulations.

ORDER 12. All animals on board of any vessel for the use of the passengers or crew may, or, if the chief inspector so order, shall, be removed by the owner in such manner, and to such quarantine ground, as the chief inspector shall direct, and be there kept until such vessel is about to leave port, when the same may, under an inspector's permit, be re-shipped.

ORDER 13. All expenses of landing, removing to, maintaining, and keeping in quarantine, and of disinfecting or otherwise treating any animal, and all expenses in connection therewith, shall be paid by the owner or consignee of such animal to an inspector, upon demand, and before such animal shall be removed from quarantine.

ORDER 14. All expenses of destroying any animal, or of disinfecting or destroying any fodder or fittings, shall be paid by the owner or consignee thereof to an inspector upon demand.

ORDER 15. No skin, horn, or hoof of any animal which has died on board shall be landed from any vessel, except for the purpose of being destroyed under order of an inspector.

ORDER 16. Any inspector may at any time require the owner or consignee of any animal or fittings to deposit with him such sum of money as shall be deemed by such inspector sufficient to pay all the expenses of inspection, maintenance, disinfection, medicine, attendance, housing, transhipment, or conveyance to or from the quarantine ground of such animal or fittings respectively, of disinfecting the vessel or conveyance in which such animal or fittings shall have been conveyed to the province, or to or from a quarantine ground, veterinary surgeon's fees for inspection, and all costs, charges, and expenses, of every description in connection with or attendant upon the introduction of any animal or fittings; and such sum of money shall be payable to the inspector requiring the deposit thereof upon demand by him.

ORDER 17. Every person who shall touch, handle, examine, or inspect, or come in contact with any animal suffering from foot-and-mouth disease on any vessel prior to its being landed, or who shall touch or come into contact with any fittings or fodder on any vessel, shall disinfect his clothes, or have his clothes disinfected in such manner as an inspector may direct.

ORDER 18. No person shall enter or leave a quarantine ground without the permission of an inspector, and every person who shall enter a quarantine ground shall clothe himself in such manner as shall be directed by an inspector, and shall, before leaving the quarantine ground, disinfect himself and his clothes in such manner as an inspector shall direct

ORDER 19. Any animal which shall be first imported into New Zealand, or any of the Australian colonies, and shall be introduced from any such colonies into South Australia, shall be treated in all things as an animal intended to be introduced under these regulations; and the owner or consignee shall produce and give to the inspector a certifi-cate of the health of such animals, signed by an Inspector for the colony in which any such animals shall have been landed, stating also the treatment, if any, which such animal shall have received.

ORDER 20. Every captain or master of any vessel who shall land, or attempt to land, or permit or suffer to be landed, any animal or any fitting of any description used in connection with any animal, or who shall remove, or attempt to remove, or permit or suffer to be removed, from or to his vessel to or from any other vessel whilst in any port in the province, any animal, folder, or fittings, with-out a permit for such landing or removal from an inspector first had and obtained, shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than £10 and not more than £50.

ORDER 21. Every owner, consignee, or person who shall land, or attempt to land, or assist or be in any way con-cerned in landing or attempting to land, any animal or fittings from any vessel before a permit shall have been obtained from an inspector for that purpose, or who shall remove, or attempt to remove, or assist or be in any way concerned in removing or attempting to remove, any animal or fittings from a quarantine ground without a permit from an inspector authorising such removal first animal for notings from a quarantine ground when a permit from an inspector authorising such removal first had and obtained, or who shall neglect to remove any animal from quarantine within twenty-four hours after an inspector shall have given a permit for its removal, or who shall refuse or neglect forthwith to obey any requisition, order, or direction under these regulations or any of them of any inspector, or who shall enter or leave any quarantine ground without the permission of an inspector, or shall obstruct or hinder any inspector in the execution of any of his duties or powers under these regulations, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty of not less than £10 nor more than £50.

not less than £10 nor more than £50. ORDER 22. Every person who, being thereunto required by these regulations, shall neglect to forward declaration as required in Order 2 to the chief inspector of sheep, at Adelaide, within twenty-four hours of the arrival of any animal at the port of Port Adelaide, or if at any other port in the province of South Australia, then to the nearest inspector, or who shall neglect to give notice of their arrival pursuant to the second of these regulations; and every person who shall land, or attempt to land, or permit to be landed, or be concerned in landing, or attempting to land, any fodder, or the skin, horn, or hoof of any animal which died on board of any vessel, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty of not less than £10 nor more than £50. more than £50.

ORDER 23. Every person who shall touch, or handle, or place himself in contact with any animal, fodder, or fittings contrary to the nineteenth of these regulations, shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a penalty of £5.

ORDER 24. Every person being thereunto liable, who shall neglect or refuse to pay on demand by an inspector the cost of all expenses incurred under these regulations, shall for every day during which such neglect or refusal shall continue, forfeit and pay a penalty of £25.


