Report on a Geological Section on the line of the Eastern Railway.

> To the Honorable the Colonial Secretary, &c., &c.,

SIR,—The attempt, which I have made with your approval, and by the assistance of the Hon. the Commissioner of Public Works, to trace a Geological Section of the country on the line of the Eastern Railway, has resulted in the ascertainment of facts, as unexpected as I think you will consider them to be interesting and important.

As far as Clackline Gully the granitoid rock (not true granite) appears homogeneous, or only traversed by a few comparatively small dykes of greenstone, and is capped, for the most part, with what is known as ironstone, either massive, up to 10 feet in thickness, or disintegrated into the form of gravel. The percolation of rain water through the superficial stratum disintegrates the surface of the granitoid rock, which contains a large proportion of feldspar, into the white clay which is the water-bearing stratum of the district.

At Clackline, however, a great change is perceptible, a line of schists being found trending northward, very varied in character, containing actinolite and asbestos, which forms a division between distinct geological formations, and which from my own, and Mr. Anstey's subsequent observations, I conclude to extend as far at least as the Moore River. principal member of the series is quartz-schist, and it was where this cropped out near Newcastle that it has proved to be auriferous.

At Spencer's Brook also, and from thence to Woodside, five (5) miles, schistose rocks are again apparent, forming portions of opposite sides of anticlinals, the crowns of which have been denuded; and as, from their dip, these are measurable, I am able to estimate the thickness as probably exceeding 200 feet. At Woodside I found the colour of gold accidentally (I was not looking for it) in the quartz-schist, which here also is the principal member of the series. Beyond these again, metamorphic rocks, gneiss, &c., prevail up the Avon valley to Beverley, the limit of my researches in that direction, but probably much further. The range to the west of Clackline appears to be the limit of the crystalline schists in that direction, and is continuous to Jumberling, those rocks prevailing in the Avon valley to that point, and continuing northward across it. The large number of specimens which I have collected makes it impossible for me to enter more minutely into detail until I shall have had time to examine them. I think it better therefore not to delay, but to give you the general results at once, as the knowledge of the wide distribution of metamorphic rocks (some of which are identical with those found in the auriferous district discovered by Mr. Anstey) in the Eastern district may lead to further profitable research by the inhabitants.
