ADDITIONAL CUTTINGS AND MARKS, GREAT SANDY ISLAND STRAIT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that three Cuttings between the Lower White Cliffs and the White Leading Marks South-east of Round Bush are now completed, giving at low-water an available depth of 10 feet.

The first Cutting is through the Flats, just below the Lower White Cliffs, and is in the same line as the second Cutting, which is made through a bank at the South-west end of the same reach. The centre of the Cutting is marked at the upper end by triangular leading beacons placed above the White Cliffs, and at the lower end by similar beacons on the bank above the Round Bush, bearing, when in line, N. 55° 30' E.

The limits of the second Cutting are marked by one red and two black buoys, the second of which points out the South-west end of the Cutting; before reaching it, a vessel bound south, must have hauled up to the southward into the next reach of the Channel, passing the red buoy on the port hand. Vessels going northwards must enter this cutting between the red and lower black buoys.

The third Cutting passes the site of the old green buoy, which has been removed; the centre line being shown by the two white leading beacons, marked on the chart, on Great Sandy Island, and two beacons on the bank above Round Bush; the shoal ground on its North-east side being marked by a red buoy.

INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAIT.
BEACONS IN LARK PASSAGE.

NOTICE is hereby given, that 3 Beacons have been erected in the following positions on Reefs, on the North side of Lark Passage:—

- 1st Beacon—N. 74° E., 11 miles;
- 2nd Beacon—N. 67° E., 17½ miles; and the
- 3rd Beacon—N. 60° E., 22½ miles from the S.E. high land of Cape Bedford.

The Reefs are shown on the Sheet Chart "Cape Tribulation to Cape Flattery," corrected to November, 1886.

The 1st Beacon being common to the Main Channel and Lark Passage, has its western half, rectangular, and painted black, and its eastern half, red and triangular.

Beacons 2 and 3 are red and triangular.

Vessels leaving Cooktown, intending to use Lark Passage, should steer N.E. 20 miles for No. 1 Beacon. When approaching it, a lookout should be kept for the sunken edge of the reef on the South side of the Passage, and a vessel should haul up to pass about half-a-mile to windward of the reef on which the beacon stands. When the beacon is on with Cape Flattery, steer N.E. ¼ E. for 6½ miles, until abreast of No. 2 Beacon, being careful to avoid the two small rocky patches on the starboard hand. Then N.E. ¼ N. 5½ miles to the 3rd Beacon, and through the Barrier 1½ miles beyond. The opening is nearly 1½ miles wide, and the centre bears N.E. by E. ½ E. from the 3rd or outer beacon.

At a distance of ¼ mile to the S.E. of the 3rd Beacon, is a 15-foot coral patch, with deep water on either side, which must be avoided by vessels of deep draft.

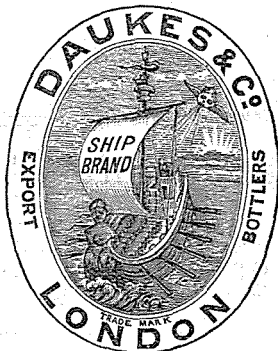
