By His Excellency Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-F. NAPIER BROOME, Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia Governor, &c. and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

> To the Honorable Sir Malcolm Fraser, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Colonial Secretary of Western Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**COLDETERS** by Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom and dated the 17th of November 1877 Her Most Gracious Majesty Victoria by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen Defender of the Faith Empress of India &c. &c. &c. did amongst other things constitute order and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the said Colony;

And by the said Letters Patent Her said Majesty did authorise and command the said Governor to do and execute in due manner all things that should belong to his said command and to the trust Her said Majesty had reposed in him according to the several forms and authorities granted or appointed him by those Letters Patent and of such Commission as might be issued to him under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual and Signet and according to such instructions as might from time to time be given to him thereunder or by order in the Privy Council or by Her said Majesty through one of Her principal Secretaries of State and to such laws as were then or should thereafter be in force in the said Colony;

AND WHEREAS after reciting that it might be necessary or expedient that the said Governor should absent himself occasionally for a short period from the seat of Government or from the Colony whereby the affairs of the said Colony might be exposed to detriment if there were no person on the spot authorised to exercise the powers and authorities by those Letters Patent granted to the said Governor or some of them Her said Majesty did authorise and empower the Governor in every such case as occasion should require by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the said Colony to constitute and appoint the Lieutenant Governor for the time being of the said Colony or if there should be no such officer then any other person to be his Deputy in the said Colony during such temporary absence and in that capacity to exercise perform and execute for and on behalf of the said Governor during such absence but no longer all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by those Letters Patent as should in and by such Instrument be specified and limited but no others;

And whereas by the said Letters Patent it was further declared that in the event of the death incapacity removal or absence of the said Governor out of the said Colony all and every the powers and authorities therein granted to him should be until Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen's further pleasure should be signified therein vested in such person as might be appointed by Her under Her Sign Manual and Signet to be Her Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony or if there be no such Lieutenant Governor then in such person or persons as might be appointed by Her under Her Sign Manual and Signet to administer the Government of the same;

And whereas by certain instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to the said Governor bearing date the 26th day of August 1886 it was thereby declared that no temporary absence of the said Governor for any period not exceeding one month previously stated by him to the Executive Council of the said Colony in writing to be so intended by him or such extension of the said period not exceeding fifteen days as may have been sanctioned by one of Her Majesty's principal Secretaries of State should be deemed absence from the said Colony within the meaning of the clause in the said Letters Patent in that behalf last hereinbefore recited;

And whereas I the said Governor purpose to be so temporarily absent from the said Colony and whereas I have obtained the necessary leave from Her said Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonial Department for so doing and have made the required statement in writing to the Executive Council;

AND WHEREAS there is no Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony:

Now therefore I the said Governor by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid do by this instrument under the public seal of the Colony constitute and appoint you the Honorable Sir Malcolm Fraser from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the said Colony and during such absence not exceeding one month and fifteen days to exercise perform and execute for and on my behalf as such Governor all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent Always provided that you shall whenever possible obtain by telegraph my instructions on any important matter and act accordingly.

HEREAS I, the said Governor, am empowered under and by virtue of Her Majesty's Instructions to assent in Her name and on Her behalf to Bills passed by the Legislative Council, I do by this Proclamation declare my assent, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to the undermentioned Bills, namely:—

- "An Act to amend 'The Goldfields Act, 1886.'"
- "An Act to provide for the payment by the Colony of Western Australia of a Proportional Part of the Cost of the Establishment and Maintenance of an Additional Naval Force to be employed for the Protection of the Floating Trade in Australasian Waters."

Parcel Post.—Parcels for despatch per Parcel Post to the United Kingdom must be booked before 2 p.m. on the day preceding the closing of the Mail by which they are to be forwarded.
