IMPORTANT NOTICE.

To Lessees of Pastoral Crown Lands.

ATTENTION is especially called to Clause 64 of the Land Regulations, which provides that any Pastoral Lessee holding a lease under previous Regulations can surrender such lease and obtain a new one under the present Regulations at any time on or before the 1st March, 1888; after that date they will not be allowed to do so.

2. The advantages of the present Land Regulations are:—

a. Leases will not expire till 31st December, 1907 (*vide* Clause 65 of Regulations).

b. A far better security of tenure is given, especially in the Kimberley, North-West, Gascoyne, Eastern, and Eucla Divisions (*vide* Clause 52 of Regulations).

3. In the event of Lessees holding on to their present leases issued under previous Regulations, their position will be—

a. That on the expiration of any lease, if the land contained in such lease be open to lease, and a renewal granted, the new lease will be subject to the Regulations in force at that time, and not necessarily the present Regulations.

b. There will be no certainty that the land will be open to lease, and new Regulations—made specially to refer to leases not brought under the present Regulations—may at any time be proclaimed.
