W HEREAS in the Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony holden in the fifty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, the following Bills were passed, viz. :--- "An Act "further to amend and extend 'The Telegraphic "'Messages Act, 1874,'" and "An Act to enable "Crown Lessees to proceed to Arbitration in respect " of Compensation for Improvements;" AND WHERE-AS such Bills were reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon : Now THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, do hereby signify and proclaim that such Bills have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

The Booby The Frigate Bird The Man-of-War Hawk The Noddy The Pelican The Curlew The Sea Pie The Sea Snipe The Mutton Bird The Red Bill, and The Cormorant or Shag

be added to and included in the Schedule to "The Game Act, 1874, Amendment Act, 1876." Now THEREFORE I, The Honorable SIR MALCOLM FRASER, K.C.M.G., Colonial Secretary, Governor's Deputy, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation include the above-named birds, and each and every and all of them, in the said Schedule; AND I ALSO dO, under the powers and provisions of the 4th Section of "The Game Act, 1874, Amendment Act, 1878," by and with the like advice, by this my Proclamatin odeclare that the close time for each and every and all the said birds shall be the months of June, July, August, and September in every year.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board the Draft of a Proclamation for giving currency to certain silver coins, called "Sixpences," with a new design therein described:

Her Majesty, having taken the same into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the coins described in the Proclamation be coined at Her Majesty's Mint:

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

# DRAFT PROCLAMATION referred to in the foregoing Order.

### BY THE QUEEN.

# A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Coinage Act 1870" it is (amongst other things) enacted that it shall be lawful for Us by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any Coin.

Now therefore We have, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to determine and do order that certain coins called "Sixpences," made and to be made at the Mint, and mentioned in the first Schedule to the aforesaid Act, of the weight and fineness specified in that Schedule, shall bear designs as follows:

For the Obverse Impression Our Effigy with the Inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia Britt: Regina F.D.," and for the Reverse the Words "Six Pence" placed in the Centre of the Piece, having an Olive Branch on one Side and an Oak Branch on the other, surmounted by the Royal Crown, and the Date of the Year between and below the Branches, and a Graining upon the Edge.

And whereas Coins of the above Description have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there in pursuance of Orders which We have given for that purpose, We have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said Coins so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful Money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that this Our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation forthwith on the date thereof.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twenty-eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Our Reign.

### Present.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of the Republic of Paraguay will be given under a Treaty between the Governments of Great Britain and Paraguay signed at Assumption on the 16th October, 1884:

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that, from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, seamen, not being slaves (and not being British subjects), who desert from merchant ships belonging to the Republic of Paraguay within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships; provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# Trucking on Bunbury Jetty.

Ferin, 29th February, 1888. noon of MONDAY, the 26th day of MARCH, proximo, from persons willing to undertake the Trucking on the Bunbury Jetty from the 1st APRIL to the 31st DECEMBER, 1888, in accordance with the undermentioned terms and conditions :

Conditions of the Work to be performed and Rates to be charged by Contractor for Trucking.

The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and 1. from the shore end of the Jetty, and to find labor for load-ing and discharging the trucks. Trucks will be found by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged through carelessness.

2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.

3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.

4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be com-puted in accordance with the scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881.

5. When the trucking is ordered by the principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.

The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to 7. the existing Jetty Regulations.

The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with 8. goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.

9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.

10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of jetties), the Contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrange-ments with parties requiring his services.

11. A bond of £100, with two sureties in similar amounts, will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Contract to terminate at any time on the Government giving one month's notice.

12. When a Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most ad-vantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of rent will be made.

13. The principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.

14. The principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the colony.

15. That any tender accepted for the service during 1888 will not commence until these conditions are signed by the tenderer and his sureties.

The Government do not bind themselves to accept the highest or any tender, and will require the guarantee of two responsible persons for the due performance of the Contract.
