# Trucking on Bunbury Jetty.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 29th February, 1888.

TENDERS will be received at this Office until noon of MONDAY, the 26th day of MARCH, proximo, from persons willing to undertake the Trucking on the Bunbury Jetty from the 1st April to the 31st December, 1888, in accordance with the undermentioned terms and conditions:

Conditions of the Work to be performed and Rates to be charged by Contractor for Trucking.

1. The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and from the shore end of the Jetty, and to find labor for loading and discharging the trucks. Trucks will be found by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged

through carelessness.

2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.

3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as direct-

ed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore

end of the Jetty.

4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881.

5. When the trucking is ordered by the principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor. tractor.

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.
7. The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to

the existing Jetty Regulations.

8. The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special

from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.

9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.

sea and shore end of Jetties.

10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of jetties), the Contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrangements with parties requiring his services.

11. A bond of £100, with two sureties in similar amounts,

will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Contract to terminate at any time on the Govern-

ment giving one month's notice.

12. When a Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most advantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of

rent will be made.

13. The principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods, and to fix and determine charges for tacking star goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.

14. The principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere

with the laws existing in the colony.

15. That any tender accepted for the service during 1888 will not commence until these conditions are signed

by the tenderer and his sureties.

# 50 & 51 VICTORIA.

#### CHAPTER 13.

AN Act to extend, in certain cases, the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, and to extend and otherwise amend the provisions of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts, 1865 and 1872. [5th July, 1887.]

E it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

This Act may be cited as the Pensions (Colonial Service) Act, 1887, and shall be construed as one with the Superannuation Act, 1859, and with the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts, 1865 and 1872.

Short title and con-

Where a person who has been employed in any office in  $_{\rm Application\, of\, Super}$ the permanent civil service of a colony has been employed also in some Imperial civil capacity, his service in the said office shall for the purposes of the Superannuation Act, 1859, and the Colonial 28 & 29 Vict. c. 26.

Governors (Pensions) Acts 1865 and 1979 Governors (Pensions) Acts, 1865 and 1872, and the Acts amending the said Acts, be deemed to be service in the permanent civil service of the State, and the said office shall be deemed to be an office in a public department, and the said person shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be qualified to receive a pension accordingly.

Provided that the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury shall determine the portion of every such pension which shall be paid from the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom or moneys voted by Parliament, but no payment shall be made therefrom in respect of any employment in the permanent civil service of a colony.

The expression "Imperial civil capacity" in this section means the permanent civil service of the State, and also the administration of the government of a colony within the meaning of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Act, 1865.

Provision as to pensions under 28 & 29 Vict. c. 113, and 35 & 36 Vict. c. 29.

3. A person shall not receive by way of pension, under the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts, 1865 and 1872, an amount which, together with any pension for service in the permanent civil service of the State or of a colony, exceeds the sum of one thousand pounds a year, or two-thirds of the salary and emoluments of his office in that service, whichever is greater. But his pension under the said Acts shall not be reduced by reason of his pension in respect of the said service being an emolument within the meaning of section seven of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Act, 1865.

Mode of computing superannuation allowance to be granted in certain cases. 4. Any pension to be granted in pursuance of section ten of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Act, 1865, as amended by this Act, to a person who has administered the government of any colony or colonies shall be computed, according to the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, on the salary and emoluments of his office in the permanent civil service of the State or of a colony, and not on the salary received by him in respect of the administration of the said government.

Application of 28 & 29 Vict. c. 113, and 35 & 36 Vict. c. 29 to High Commissioner in Cyprus.

5. Whereas by the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts, 1865 and 1872, provision is made for retiring pensions to persons, who have administered the government of any of Her Majesty's Colonies, and it is expedient to extend the said Acts to Her Majesty's High Commissioner in Cyprus: Be it therefore enacted as follows:

A pension may be granted in pursuance and subject to the provisions of the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts, 1865 and 1872, as amended by this or any other Act, to a person who has, either before or after the passing of this Act, administered the government of Cyprus as Her Majesty's High Commissioner, and those Acts shall apply as if Cyprus were a colony within the meaning thereof and were within Her Majesty's dominions.

Definition of permanent civil service of a colony.

6. For the purposes of this Act a person shall be deemed to be employed in the permanent civil service of a colony if he holds any such permanent office in the service of Her Majesty in the government of any colony as qualifies him to receive a pension out of the revenues of such colony.

Provision against double pensions.

7. A person shall not receive a pension under the Colonial Governors (Pensions) Acts, 1865 and 1872, or this Act, and also under section twelve of the Superannuation Act, 1859.

Explanation of terms.

8. The expressions "permanent civil service of the State," "permanent civil service of Her Majesty," and "permanent civil service of the Crown," are hereby declared to have the same meaning, and this Act and any enactment relating to salaries and pensions shall be construed accordingly.

In this Act "pension" includes superannuation allowance.

# 50 & 51 VICTORIA.

CHAPTER 54.

AN Act to enable Her Majesty to provide for the Government of Her Possessions acquired by Settlement.

[16th September, 1887.]

HEREAS divers of Her Majesty's subjects have resorted to and settled in, and may hereafter resort to and settle in, divers places where there is no civilised government, and such settlements have become or may hereafter become possessions of

Her Majesty, and it is expedient to extend the power of Her Majesty to provide for the government of such settlements, and for that purpose to repeal and re-enact with amendments the existing Acts enabling Her Majesty to provide for such government:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

This Act may be cited as the British Settlements Act, 1887. Short title.

It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen in Council from Power of the Queen time to time to establish all such laws and institutions, and con- in Council to make stitute such courts and officers, and make such provisions and laws and establish courts. regulations for the proceedings in the said courts and for the administration of justice, as may appear to Her Majesty in Council to be necessary for the peace, order, and good government of Her Majesty's subjects and others within any British settlement.

It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen from time to time, by any instrument passed under the Great Seal of the United by the Queen. Kingdom, or by any instructions under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual referred to in such instrument as made or to be made, as respects any British settlement, to delegate to any three or more persons within the settlement all or any of the powers conferred by this Act on Her Majesty in Council, either absolutely or subject to such conditions, provisions, and limitations as may be specified in such instrument or instructions.

Delegation of power

Provided that, notwithstanding any such delegation, the Queen in Council may exercise all or any of the powers under this Act: Provided always, that every such instrument or instruction as aforesaid shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as conveniently may be after the making and enactment thereof respectively.

4. It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen in Council to confer on any court in any British possession any such juris- Council to confer jurisdiction, civil or criminal, original or appellate, in respect of matters isdiction on certain occurring or arising in any British settlement as might be conferred by virtue of this Act upon a court in the settlement, and to make such provisions and regulations as Her Majesty in Council may think fit respecting the exercise of the jurisdiction conferred under this section on any court, and respecting the enforcement and execution of the judgments, decrees, orders, and sentences of such court, and respecting appeals therefrom; and every Order of Her Majesty in Council under this section shall be effectual to vest in the court the jurisdiction expressed to be thereby conferred, and the court shall exercise the same in accordance with and subject to the said provisions and regulations: Provided always, that every Order in Council made in pursuance of this Act shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as conveniently may be after the making thereof.

Power to the Queen in

It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen in Council from time to time to make, and when made to alter and revoke, Orders Making of Orders in Council, &c. for the purposes of this Act.

For the purposes of this Act, the expression "British possession" means any part of Her Majesty's possessions out of the United Kingdom, and the expression "British settlement" means any British possession which has not been acquired by cession or conquest, and is not for the time being within the jurisdiction of the Legislature, constituted otherwise than by virtue of this Act or of any Act repealed by this Act, of any British possession.

Repeal.

- 7. The Acts mentioned in the schedule to this Act are hereby repealed: Provided that—
  - (a.) Such repeal shall not affect anything done or suffered previously to such repeal in pursuance of any such Act, or in pursuance of any Order in Council, commission, instructions, law, ordinance, or other thing made or done in pursuance of any such Act; and
  - (b.) All Orders in Council, commissions, and instructions purporting to be made or given in pursuance of the Acts hereby repealed, or either of them, shall continue in force in like manner as if they had been made and given in pursuance of this Act, and such commissions had originally been instruments authorised by this Act, and shall be subject to be revoked or recalled accordingly.
