MONSIEUR L'AMBASSADEUR,—

In consequence of a letter which Mr. Egerton had addressed to me on the 6th October last, on the subject of a shipwreck at the Crozet Islands of thirteen mariners supposed to be French, I had asked the Minister of Marine and of the Colonies to give to the Chief of the Naval Division of the Indian Ocean orders to send a vessel in the direction indicated, to search for traces of the shipwrecked men. In reference to this communication, Admiral Krantz has just communicated to me the following telegram which he has received from the Chief of the Naval Division of the Indian Ocean :

"Mozambique, 11th January, 1888. The *Meurthe* has returned. Thirteen shipwrecked men from the *Tamaris*, after having exhausted their provisions, left the Isle of Pigs on the 30th September to go to the Isle of Possession. No trace was found of their arrival there, nor at any other island. Hope remains that fishing vessels may have picked them up."

I have the honor to bring this telegram to Your Excellency's notice, and to request that you will, if you think well, transmit it to the Government of Her Britannic Majesty.
