By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by certain Deeds Poll of Grant under the hand of the Governor and the Public Seal of the Colony, the lands hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, *Canning Locations No. 5, No. 7, No. 11, No. 3, No. 12, No. 13, and No. 50*, have been granted to various persons as in the said deeds of grant appears; AND WHEREAS by the said deeds of grant power was reserved to the Crown to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time by the Crown be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, canals, bridges, towing paths, or other works of public utility or convenience; AND WHEREAS the pieces or parcels of land hereinafter described are necessary for the purpose of a Public Road and Tramway. Now know YE that Her Most Gracious Majesty Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, doth hereby, and by virtue of the said power and authority reserved and contained in the said Deeds Poll of Grant, resume, for the purpose aforesaid, ALL those the pieces or parcels of land particularly mentioned and described in the Schedule hereto, and being portion of a strip of land one chain in width from the Perth-Albany Road to the Darling Range, and upon which is built a portion of the tramway extending from the Canning Landing to the Timber Mills. All measurements more or less, as shown in the authenticated plan in the Office of the Surveyor General in Perth.

The Schedule above referred to.

All that portion of Canning Location No. 50 which lies within half a chain on each side and from the centre of the tramway from the Canning Landing to the Timber Mills

which runs through the said Location and intersects the South Eastern and South Western boundaries. Contents about One and a quarter acres.

All that portion of Canning Location No. 13 which lies within half a chain on each side and from the centre of the tramway from the Canning Landing to the Timber Mills which runs through the said Location and intersects the North Eastern and North Western boundaries. Contents about Fifteen acres.

All that portion of Canning Location No. 12 which lies within half a chain on each side and from the centre of the tramway from the Canning Landing to the Timber Mills which runs through the said Location and intersects the South Eastern and North Western boundaries. Contents about Five acres.

All that portion of Canning Location No. 3 which lies within half a chain on each side and from the centre of the tramway from the Canning Landing to the Timber Mills which runs through the said Location and intersects the South Eastern and North Western boundaries. Contents about One and a quarter acres.

All that portion of Canning Location No. 11 which lies within half a chain on each side and from the centre of the tramway from the Canning Landing to the Timber Mills which runs through the said Location and intersects the South Eastern and North Western boundaries. Contents about One and a quarter acres.

All that portion of Canning Location No. 7 which lies within half a chain on each side and from the centre of the tramway from the Canning Landing to the Timber Mills which runs through the said Location and intersects the South Eastern and North Western boundaries. Contents about Eight acres.

All that portion of Canning Location No. 5 which lies within half a chain on each side and from the centre of that portion of the tramway which extends from the Perth-Albany Road in an Easterly direction until it intersects the South Eastern boundary of the said Location. Contents about Four acres.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication, for general information, of the following extract from the minutes of the Executive Council, relative to the applications for a reward in connection with the discovery of gold. His Excellency having been pleased to order that action be taken in accordance with the advice of the Executive Council, it is hereby notified that the offer of the reward of £5,000 referred to has lapsed, and is entirely withdrawn.

[EXTRACT.]

"With reference to the Government Notice dated 12th July, 1886, the Council advise that, the period of two years from the date of the Proclamation of the Kimberley Goldfield having now expired, without the * conditions specified under the Government Notice in respect of the reward of £5,000 mentioned under the said notice having been fulfilled, the said reward has lapsed, and notice should be issued accordingly.

"The Council further advise that the offer of the said reward of £5,000 be now entirely withdrawn, whether in respect of the Kimberley or any other Goldfield in the Colony, and that future applica-

tions for rewards should be made under Section 81 of 'The Goldfields Act, 1886,' and Section 4 of 'The Goldfields Act Amendment Act of 1888,' which Sections † should be published for general information.

"The Council further advise that the services of the late Mr. Hardman, Government Geologist, be recognised by placing a vote of £500 on the Supplementary Estimates as a gift to his widow: also that the services of Messrs. Hall and Slattery's prospecting party be recognised by requesting the Legislative Council to pass a vote of £500 to be paid to them."

* Conditions.

1. That such reward be not payable until Ten thousand ounces of Gold, either alluvial or crushed from quartz, and obtained from such Goldfield, be entered and cleared at a Customs House at some port in Western Australia, and actually shipped to Great Britain within a period of two years from the date of the registration in the office of the Colonial Secretary of the exact position of such Goldfield.

2. That the Governor of the Colony for the time being, in Executive Council, do finally adjudicate and determine to whom alone, or, if there be several claimants, to whom and in what proportions the above reward shall be payable and paid.

† The following are the sections of the Acts referred to:

"It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause to be paid a sum of money not exceeding One thousand pounds to the actual discoverers of any new Goldfield: such sum to be paid under the terms and conditions to be prescribed by the Regulations."

"The reward payable to the actual discoverers of new Goldfields, as provided in the eighty-first section of the Act, shall be payable only when a newly-discovered Goldfield is situate in a division of the Colony in which no Goldfield has been previously proclaimed."

LIGHT ON JARMAN ISLAND, COSSACK,
NORTH-WEST AUSTRALIA.

NOTICE is hereby given that from the 16th May, 1888, a fixed white light of the third order Dioptric will be exhibited on Jarman Island, Cossack, N.W. Australia, on the spot where a beacon has hitherto been standing. The light will be shown from sunset to sunrise from a circular iron tower in Latitude 20° 39' 06" South, Longitude 117° 13' 21" East, and will be visible all round the horizon for a distance in clear weather of fifteen miles.

The tower is painted, the lower half red, and the upper half white, the centre of lantern being elevated ninety-six feet above high water. The height of the tower from base to vane being fifty-one feet. The light hitherto shown on Reader Head will be discontinued from the same date.

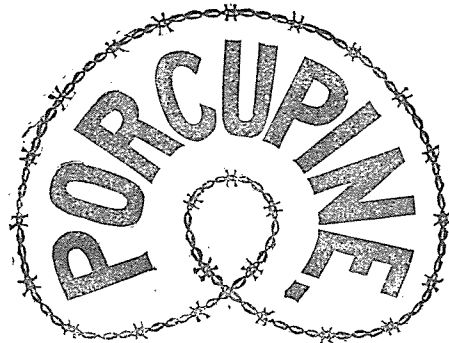
