1448 PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 26th day of July, 1886, made by me, the said Governor, under the provisions of an Act of the Legislative Council, passed in the 43rd year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 23, intituled "An Act for the prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock," by which said Proclamation the importation into and landing in Western Australia, either by land or sea, from any place beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies, of horned cattle, sheep, and swine, was forbidden: AND WHEREAS under the provisions of the said Act, the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time to vary or annul the restrictions imposed on importation by any such Proclamation: And Whereas it is expedient to vary the restrictions imposed on such importation by the said Proclamation: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers possessed by me under the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do by this Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, vary the said Proclamation of the 26th day of July, 1886, by removing the restrictions therein imposed on the importation of horned cattle, sheep, and swine from Europe.

AND WHEREAS under the said Act the Governor has power, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time to make regulations for regulating

the conditions upon which any cattle or animals may be introduced into the Colony, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulation:—

"That no horned cattle, sheep, or swine be imported into and landed in Western Australia, either by land or sea, from Europe, unless such horned cattle, sheep, or swine shall have been inspected and declared free from disease by a qualified Veterinary Surgeon, before being shipped for this Colony."

VI HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Poor Houses Discipline Act, 1882," it is lawful for the Governor in Council to make regulations for the purpose of maintaining a proper discipline in any Poor House, and for the proper control and management of the inmates thereof; And whereas the Depôt on Mount Eliza, in the city of Perth, and the Poor House for Fe-

males, in the city of Perth, are each of them a Poor House within the meaning of the said Act: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation make the following Regulations, to be observed in the said Poor Houses:—

- 1. Any money in the possession of any person other than an Imperial Pensioner, who is an inmate either of the Depôt on Mount Eliza, in the city of Perth, or of the Poor House for Females, in the city of Perth, and who is receiving relief therein, shall be daily applied in payment for the relief of such person at the rate of one shilling per diem.
- 2. Any money in the possession of an Imperial Pensioner, who is an inmate of either of the said Poor Houses, and who is receiving relief therein, shall be daily applied in payment for the relief of such person at the rate of nine pence per diem.
- 3. In calculating the number of days an inmate of either of the said Poor Houses remains an inmate, a broken day shall count as a whole day.
- 4. In the event of any person who is an immate of either of the said Poor Houses ceasing to be an immate before such money has been exhausted by such daily payment, the unexpended balance of such money shall be returned to such person on leaving the Pocr House.

Government House, Perth, 13th March, 1888.

SIR,—You have doubtless noticed, in the press, telegraphic and other reports of the disastrous floods which occurred on the night of the 3rd of last month in the Greenough District of the Colony.

- 2. This calamity took place when I was absent in Victoria, and the action required on the part of the Government was judiciously and promptly taken by my Deputy, the Honorable Sir Malcolm Fraser, K.C.M.G., and by the very energetic and excellent Government Resident at Geraldton, Mr. Maitland Brown, a copy of whose official report I enclose (*dated 24th February, 1888), together with copy of the telegram (*dated 29th February, 1888) which, after perusing and considering the report, I caused the Colonial Secretary to address to Mr. Brown.
- 3. The losses occasioned by these floods to the Greenough farmers and settlers have been severe. Much sympathy for the sufferers has been excited throughout the Colony, and all classes have joined in the movement to raise subscriptions, in money or in kind, for those requiring relief.
- 4. I cannot but think and hope that the enormous body of water which has inundated the Greenough District, and much of which will probably remain for some time standing on the lower levels of the country, will, in the end, by enriching and fertilising the soil for a considerable period to come, bring, in many cases, a substantial compensation for the immediate losses occasioned by the flood. But, however this may ultimately be, the calamity is for the time severe, and many families of hardworking settlers are brought to the brink of ruin.
- 5. The public subscriptions which have been raised, coupled with the aid from public funds mentioned in the Colonial Secretary's telegram, will, I hope, be sufficient to deal with cases of distress.
- 6. Four persons met their deaths during the floods. It is indeed a wonder that the sudden and extraordinary rush and height of waters over a large expanse of country did not occasion a far greater loss of life.
- 7. I desire to bring to your special notice the energetic and judicious action of the officer whose name I have already mentioned (Mr. Maitland Brown, Government Resident at Geraldton), in at once proceeding to the spot, and in rendering continued and indefatigable assistance to both the settlers and the Government.
- 8. Full accounts of the floods will be found in the files of the local newspapers forwarded to your office.

At a meeting held at Apsley House, on February 21st, 1888, it was announced that the above Committee had been formed, on the invitation of His Excellency the Lord Vivian, Her Majesty's Minister at Brussels, for the purpose of raising funds for the erection and preservation of a monument in memory of the British officers, non-commissioned officers, and men who lost their lives in the Waterloo campaign.

No memorial at present exists, and the opportunity is now taken of the old cemeteries at Brussels being removed, and the remains of our soldiers buried there, and in the farms round Mont St. Jean, being placed in the new cemetery at Evère outside the town, to appeal to the country for funds to erect a monument, worthy of those who fought for England in the battles of 1815.

It was also proposed that the object of the meeting should be communicated to the whole of Great Britain and her Colonies, in order that the subscription should assume a thoroughly National form. Lord Vivian estimates that £3,500 will be required to carry out the object in a desirable manner. Over £2,000 has already been collected.

"The Council further advise that the services of "the late Mr. Hardman, Government Geologist, be "recognised by placing a vote of £500 on the Sup-"plementary Estimates as a gift to his widow: also "that the services of Messrs. Hall and Slattery's "prospecting party be recognised by requesting the "Legislative Council to pass a vote of £500 to be "paid to them."

* Conditions.

1. That such reward be not payable until Ten thousand ounces of Gold, either alluvial or crushed from quartz, and obtained from such Goldfield, be entered and cleared at a Customs House at some port in Western Australia, and actually shipped to Great Britain within a period of two years from the date of the registration in the office of the Colonial Secretary of the exact position of such Goldfield.

2. That the Governor of the Colony for the time being, in Executive Council, do finally adjudicate and determine to whom alone, or, if there be several claimants, to whom and in what proportions the above reward shall be payable and paid.

† The following are the sections of the Acts referred to:

"It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause to be paid a sum of money not exceeding One thousand pounds to the actual discoverers of any new Goldfield: such sum to be paid under the terms and conditions to be prescribed by the Regulations."

"The reward payable to the actual discoverers of new "Goldfields, as provided in the eighty-first section of the "Act, shall be payable only when a newly-discovered "Goldfield is situate in a division of the Colony in which "no Goldfield has been previously proclaimed."
