HEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA Shall commence and be holden for despatch of business ON WEDNESDAY, THE TENTH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTERNOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

For the information of Candidates.

- 1. Appointments to Naval Cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the under-mentioned exceptions:—
 - Four Cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.
 - Service Cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service Cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the Army, Navy or Marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty, within six months from the date of such action or injury, (b) sons of officers of the Navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the Active List not lower than that of Commander. Not more than two such latter Service Cadets will be nominated annually.
 - Applications for Service Cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Army; to the Secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Navy or Marines, and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and Service Cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will in all other respects be subject to these Regulations.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address Cannon Row, Westminster) who will deal with all questions connected with such examination and will announce the results. A fee of ten shillings wiil be required from each candidate.

- 2. Except in special circumstances, not more than onethird of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.
- 3. The nomination of candidates for Naval Cadetships will be made by the first Lord, by individual members of the Board, and by the Secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.
- A Flag Officer or a Commodore 1st Class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a Captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilege is exercised within six months of appointment.

No Captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of Captain, but a Flag Officer or a Commodore 1st Class may claim the privilege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the Officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.

- 4. The nominations will be made half-yearly, as soon as convenient after the Report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, and will commence on the second Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively.

- 6. No candidate will be eligible for the June examinations whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz., not less than 13 nor more than $14\frac{1}{2}$ years of age: nor for the November examinations, whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.
- 7. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined by the Civil Service Commissioners he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the Navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the Navy.
- 8. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a Registrar's certificate of the date of his birth, or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (a certificate of Baptism will not be accepted); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.
- 9. Candidates will be tested by examination in the following subjects:—

- 10. Colonial and Service Cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain 660 marks in the aggregate, as well as the proportion of marks in arithmetic and other subjects required from the candidates who compete.
- 11. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.

^{*&}quot;Gardiner's Outlines of Euglish History" (Longmans) has been selected as the present text book for Examination in English History. The subject will be divided into three periods, as follows:—

- 12. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.
- 13. For all Cadets entered under these regulations, the payment will be at the rate of £75 per annum for the period in the Britannia, to be paid half-yearly in advance to the Accountant-General of the Navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the Cadets entered at each half-yearly examination, a number, not to exceed eight, being sons of officers of the Navy, Army, or Marines, or of Civil Officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the Cadet.
- 14. In addition to the annual payments mentioned in the foregoing paragraph, the parent or guardian will be charged with the personal expenses incurred by the Cadet for washing, repairing boots and clothes, hair cutting, pocket-money, &c.
- 15. The period of training on board the Britannia will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

- 16. (a.) Examinations in Seamanship and Study will be held at the end of each term.
 - (b.) Cadets who fail at the end of their second term to obtain 40 per cent. of marks in Mathematical subjects will be ordered to be with-
 - (c.) Cadets who fail at the final examination to obtain 40 per cent. in the Mathematical subjects, including the Theory of Navigation and Nautical Astronomy, and 50 per cent. in the Technical subjects, combined with Physics and French, will be ordered to be withdrawn.
 - (d.) Cadets reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory conduct will be "warned," and should they be again reported they will be discharged: any Cadet however who is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the Britannia.
 - (e.) Any Cadet who shall at any time appear to their Lordships to be unfit for the Naval Service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the Britannia, and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution although no actual organic disease may have been developed.
- 17. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the Britannia is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every Cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the Cadet to the Britannia), to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the Navy.
- 18. Cadets will, on passing out of the Britannia, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the Britannia.
- 19. The parent or guardian of every Cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.
- 20. No pay will be allowed by Government to Cadets in the Britannia. The pocket-money allowed to Cadets will be charged to the parents.
- 21. As only Cadets who are able to swim are permitted to use the boats belonging to H.M.S. "Britannia," the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty desire to impress upon parents and guardians the importance of Cadets being taught to swim before they join the Training Ship, so as to enable them to obtain the full benefits of use of the boats.

By His Excellency Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS on the Twentieth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the Governor of the Colony of Tasmania reserved a certain Bill passed by the Federal Council of Australasia, intituled "An Act to regulate the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fisheries in Australasian Waters adjacent to the Colony of Queensland," for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure: And Whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and has been assented to by Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council: Now Therefore I, Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in pursuance of "The Federal Council of Australasia Act, 1885" (48 and 49 Victoria, Cap. 60, Section 19), and in exercise of the powers thereby vested in me, do hereby notify and proclaim that the said Bill has received the Assent of Her Majesty.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 48th and 49th years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is amongst other things enacted that:—

Saving Her Majesty's prerogative, and subject to the provisions therein contained with respect to the operation of the said Act, the Federal Council thereby constituted have legislative authority in respect to the several matters therein mentioned, including fisheries in Australasian waters beyond territorial limits; and that every Bill in respect of such fisheries shall, unless previously approved by Her Majesty, through one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure.

And it is by the said Act further enacted, that a Bill reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure, shall not have any force unless and until within one year from the day on which it was presented to the Governor for Her Majesty's assent, such Governor signifies, by message to the Council, or by proclamation, published as last aforesaid, that it has received the assent of Her Majesty;

And whereas a certain Bill passed at a session held in the Colony of Tasmania by the said Federal Council, entitled "An Act to regulate the Pearl Shell and Beche-demer Fisheries in Australasian waters adjacent to the Colony of Queensland," was presented to the Governor of the said Colony of Tasmania for Her Majesty's assent;

And whereas the said Bill was reserved by the said Governor for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon;

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty;

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Act, and in exercise of the power thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare Her assent to the said Bill.

ANNO QUINQUAGESIMO-PRIMO VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

No. 1.

AN ACT to regulate the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fisheries in Australasian Waters adjacent to the Colony of Queensland.

A.D. 1888.

Reserved 20th January, 1888; Queen's Assent Proclaimed, 19th July, 1888.

HEREAS by certain Acts of the Parliament of the Colony of Queensland provision has been made for regulating the Preamble. Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fisheries in the territorial waters of that Colony: And whereas, by reason of the geographical position of many of the Islands forming portion of that Colony, vessels employed in such Fisheries are, in the prosecution of their business, sometimes within and sometimes beyond the territorial jurisdiction of Queensland: And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the said Acts should extend and apply to such vessels during all the time during which they are so employed, and that for that purpose the provisions of the said Acts, so far as they are applicable to extraterritorial waters, should be extended to such waters by an Act of the Federal Council of Australasia:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Federal Council of Australasia, assembled at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

This Act may be cited as "The Queensland Pearl Shell and Short title, and com- Beche-de-mer Fisheries (Extra-territorial) Act of 1888," and shall commence and take effect on and from the date of Her Majesty's assent thereto being proclaimed in Queensland.

Interpretation. 45 Vict., No. 2, (Queensland), s. 1.

In this Act the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, have the meanings set against them respectively; that is to say—

"Australasian waters adjacent to Queens-land."

"Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland"—All Australasian waters within the limits described in the Schedule to this Act, exclusive of waters within the territorial jurisdiction of the Colony of Queensland;

"Ship."

"Ship"—Any vessel used in navigation or in Fishing, and not being a boat as defined by this Act;

"Boat."

"Boat"—Any vessel not exceeding two tons in burden which is usually hoisted to a ship's davits, or carried on board of a ship, or attached to a ship.

"Master."

"Master" or "Employer"—Any person other than a pilot who is for the time being in command or in charge of any ship or boat, or who is in charge of any Fishery as hereinafter defined;

"Native labourer."

"Native Labourer"—Any aboriginal native of Australia or New Guinea, or of any of the islands adjacent thereto respectively;

"Polynesian."

"Polynesian"—Any native of Fiji or New Caledonia or of any of the Loyalty, New Hebrides, Banks', or Solomon groups of Islands, or of any island in the Pacific Ocean not being in Her Majesty's Dominions, nor within the jurisdiction of any civilised power;

"The Fishery."

"Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fishery" or "The Fishery" —The business of diving for, collecting, preparing, storing, or carrying to or from any place within the Colony of Queensland or its dependencies, pearl oysters or pearl oyster shells, or the sea-slug commonly called beche-de-mer, or any other fish or shell of the like kind which the Governor of Queensland in Council may hereafter by Proclamation published in the Queensland Government Gazette declare to be within the provisions of this Act.

What ships or boats shall be deemed to be engaged in the fishery. Ib., s. 2.

Every ship and boat shall be deemed to be engaged in the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fishery, if she is used as a depôt or place of lodging or refuge for persons employed in such Fishery, or for storing provisions for the use of persons employed in such Fishery, or if she is used by any person to dive from, collect, or store pearl oysters, pearl oyster-shells, or beche-de-mer, or any other fish or shell which may be specified in any such Proclamation as aforesaid, or for carrying or conveying otherwise than as a sea-going vessel under a transire, pearl oysters, pearl oyster-shells, or beche-de-mer or any other fish or shell so specified, to or from any place within the Colony of Queensland or its dependencies.

Ships or boats employed in the fishery to be licensed. Ib., s. 3.

From and after the commencement of this Act it shall not be lawful to use or employ any ship or boat within Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland in the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fishery unless such ship or boat is duly licensed as required by the Act of the Parliament of the said Colony passed in the forty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign, and styled "The Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer

Fishery Act of 1881." as amended by an Act of the Parliament of the said Colony, passed in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign, and styled "The Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer Fishery Act Amendment Act of 1886," or any other Act in amendment of or substitution for those Acts.

5. If any ship or boat is employed in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland in the Pearl Shell and Beche-de-mer unlicensed ship or Fishery without being duly licensed as required by this Act, the boat. owner and master of such ship or boat shall each be liable to a (Queensland), s. 6. penalty not exceeding three times the amount of the license fee payable in respect of such ship or boat, which may be recovered in a summary way before any Police Magistrate or two Justices of the Colony of Queensland, at the suit of any Officer of Customs of the said Colony.

In default of immediate payment of such penalty, the ship or boat, and all things found on board thereof, shall be seized and Forfeiture in default kept for a period of sixty days, and if at the expiration of that period the penalty is still unpaid, then the ship or boat, together with all her tackle, apparel, furniture, and cargo, shall be forfeited to Her Majesty.

It shall be lawful for any Police Magistrate or Officer of Customs or Police of the said Colony to seize and take any ship or Unlicensed ship or boat may be seized. boat which is found employed in the Fishery in Australasian waters 1b., s. 7. adjacent to Queensland without being licensed as required by this Act, and to take any ship or boat so seized, or any ship or boat seized and taken under the provisions of the said recited Acts, to any port of Queensland, and to detain the same until a prosecution for breach of this Act or the said recited Acts is heard and determined.

Every ship or boat engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland shall keep her name, and the number to be painted on the of her license, prefixed by the letters No., painted in letters and bow in addition to figures of not less than three inches in length in the case of boats, and the name. Ib., s. 8. of not less than six inches in length in the case of ships, in white upon a black ground, or black upon a white ground, on each side of her bow above the water-line during the whole time her license remains in force.

If any ship or boat is found engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland without her name and the number of her license painted as herein prescribed, the master or owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

If the master of any licensed ship or boat refuses to produce Master refusing to the license of such ship or boat when required so to do by any produce license. Police Magistrate or Officer of Customs or Police of the said Colony, Ib., s. 9. he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Every person in charge of a ship engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland who is not required to in charge of ships hold a certificate of competency under the laws of that Colony, must and divers. Penalty. hold a license permitting him to be so employed; and if any such 50 Vict. No. 2, person is found in charge of a ship so engaged without being so (Queensland), s. 6. licensed, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

10. Every such person in charge of a ship engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland who fails to to officers.

show his license when called upon to do so by any Police Magistrate or Officer of Customs or Police of the said Colony, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Seamen, &c., to be employed only under written agreement.

It shall not be lawful for any master or other person to employ any seaman or other person in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland, unless under a written agreement recorded in some Custom House or shipping office of the said Colony, or to discharge any such seaman or other person except in the presence of an Officer of Customs or Shipping Master of the said Colony.

Penalty. 50 Vic. No. 2, (Queensland), s. 5.

If any master or other person in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland employs any seaman or other person in the Fishery, or discharges any seaman or other person so employed, contrary to the provisions of this Act, or fails to produce the agreement when required so to do by a Police Magistrate or Officer of Customs or Police of the said Colony, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Native labourers not to be employed unless under articles. 48 Vict. No. 20, (Queensland), s. 2.

No native labourer shall be employed or carried on board of any ship or boat engaged in the Fishery in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland, unless he is carried on ship's articles in like manner as a seaman, and has been engaged to serve in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the Parliament of Queensland passed in the forty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign, and styled "The Native Labourers' Protection Act of 1884."

Penalties. Ib., s. 6.

If any ship or boat engaged in the Fishery carries in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland any native labourer with respect to whom the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act have not been observed, the master and owner shall be jointly and severally liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.

Native labourers to be discharged and master. Ib., s. 7.

Every native labourer employed on board of, or in con-14. nection with, a ship or boat engaged in the Fishery in Australasian paid before shipping waters adjacent to Queensland, whether he was engaged before or is engaged after the commencement of this Act, shall be discharged and receive his wages in the presence of a shipping master of the said Colony.

Penalty.

If the master or owner of any such ship or boat, or any other person, in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland, discharges a native labourer who has been employed on board of any such ship or boat, or pays his wages, otherwise than as is herein provided, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Deaths and desertions to be reported. 45 Vic. No. 2, (Queensland), s. 13.

All deaths and desertions of Polynesians or native labourers employed in the Fishery which occur in Australasian waters adjacent to Queensland shall be forthwith reported by the master or employer of such Polynesians or native labourers to the principal Officer of Customs of the said Colony at the port nearest to the place where such deaths or desertions have occurred; and if any master or employer fails to make any such report as aforesaid, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five pounds.

Jurisdiction of Justices. Compare (Queensland), s. 14.

All offences against the provisions of this Act may be heard and determined by any Police Magistrate or two Justices of the Colony of Queensland, in accordance with the Laws of that Colony regulating summary proceedings before Justices, and any such Police Magistrate or Justices shall for that purpose have power to hear and determine the matter at any place within the said Colony where the

offender may be, or where any ship or boat with respect to which or in connection with which the offence was committed is found, or at any place in the said Colony appointed for holding Courts of Petty Sessions, and to make such orders for the safe keeping, detention, seizure, forfeiture, or sale of any such ship or boat, and all things found therein, as such Police Magistrate or Justices may think fit.

If any person thinks himself aggrieved by any determina- Appeal. tion or adjudication of any Police Magistrate or Justices with res- 45 Vict. No. 2, pect to any penalty or forfeiture under the provisions of this Act, (Queensland), s. he may appeal to the Supreme Court of Queensland or to a District Court of the said Colony in accordance with the Laws of that Colony regulating appeals from Justices.

18. In any proceeding under this Act, the averment in the information that any person named therein is a Polynesian or a native 48 Vict. No. 20, labourer shall be sufficient proof of the fact until the contrary is (Queensland), s. shown.

This Act applies only to British ships, and boats attached to British ships.
