(L. S.) F. Napier Broome, Governor. By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA Shall commence and be holden for despatch of business ON WEDNESDAY, THE TENTH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTERNOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

(L. S.) F. Napier Broome, By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by Proclamation dated the Twentyninth day of June, 1878, Roebourne has been appointed a place where a Court of General Sessions of the Peace should be held; AND WHEREAS it has been by such Proclamation aforesaid directed that such Court shall be held from time to time in every year on the first Wednesday in the months of January, April, July, and October; AND WHEREAS it is expedient to alter the times for holding the said Court; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the provisions of an Ordinance passed in the ninth year of Our Lady the Queen, and intituled "An Ordinance to make provision for the Trial of Criminal Offences at Albany, and other remote Districts of the Colony of Western Australia," which said Ordinance was made perpetual by an Ordinance passed in the twelfth year of Our Lady the Queen, do hereby appoint and direct that the said Court shall be held on the first Wednesday in the months of March, June, September, and December, instead of in the months of January, April, July, and October as heretofore, and that the said alteration in the dates of the sittings of the said Court shall take place after the usual sitting of the said Court in the month of October now next ensuing.

Geraldton, 11th August, 1888.

- I have the honor to tender through you, for submission to His Excellency the Governor, my first progress Report relating to the administration of the funds entrusted to me up to the present time to be applied towards the relief of those persons who suffered from the effects of the Greenough Flood of February last.
- 1. The warm-hearted and munificent manner in which the people of Western Australia, and individuals in our sister colonies as well as in England, contributed funds and goods to be applied to the needs of the Greenough sufferers, has already been particularly and fully acknowledged through the medium of the Press.
- 2. When it became known that, as the outcome of this wide-spread liberality, large sums of money (including a grant of £500 from the Government), and valuable contributions in kind, would be available to ward off distress from the Greenough sufferers, and to assist them in re-establishing themselves in their homes and holdings, the best means of applying these moneys and contributions to the purpose intended became a question which was seriously considered and discussed.
- 3. At public meetings held respectively at the Greenough and Geraldton, it was unanimously resolved to request me to undertake the sole responsibility of applying the funds and contributions referred to.
- 4. I communicated this fact to you in my letter $^{A33}/_{88}$, dated 24th February, 1888, and requested the permission of His Excellency the Governor to undertake the work.
- 5. About the end of March last, His Excellency, after conferring with me personally upon the subject and ascertaining my views, was pleased to grant me the permission solicited.
- 6. At that time it was impossible for me to arrive at the limit of the losses sustained by several of the farmers; amongst other reasons because some large farms, and portions of farms, together with valuable farming implements, were still covered by water for which there was no outlet, and because several farm buildings and one hotel were standing in this water and subject to constant fretting away by the action of waves. Therefore, to have fixed even approximately upon any period at which the holders of the farms referred to would be able to resume farming operations, or to determine the extent of the ultimate damage that the waves would effect to the partially submerged buildings, was then impossible.
- 7. This fact in my judgment formed a bar to an immediate and final apportionment and distribution of the relief funds; therefore, and upon other grounds pending the time when these large losses could be estimated and a basis obtained, whereby an equitable apportionment of the funds would become possible, I proposed to administer such funds as might be placed at my disposal upon the following general lines, viz.:
 - a. In all cases to ward off actual distress.
 - b. To utilise the funds for the benefit of the sufferers, by providing them with all necessary requirements by way of loan, to be returned to the fund after next harvest, to be then utilised again in the same manner, or finally apportioned and distributed as the then circumstances might seem to render desirable.
- 8. His Excellency the Governor was pleased to express his concurrence as to the desirability of this course.
- 9. By request of His Lordship Bishop Parry, I attended a meeting in the Town Hall at Perth, composed of members of the Central Relief Committee, some of whom are also members of the original Perth-Greenough Relief Committee. This meeting was held for the purpose of ascertaining my views as to the extent of the losses by the flood, the needs of the people, and the best means of applying, in the way of assistance, the funds then in the hands of the Perth Committees. I duly furnished the members with every information in my power, and after much discussion, during which I explained to them that the only position I could take in applying the subscribed relief funds was one of absolutism, I understood that they were prepared to fall in with the desire of the Greenough people, that the apportionment and distribution of such funds should be left solely in my hands, and further that they approved of the general plan for the administration of the funds suggested by me.
- 10. I have now reason to believe that the original Greenough Relief Committee of Perth contemplate following another course, and employing some medium other than myself in distributing the funds subscribed through them.
- 11. So far, no distress has been permitted to occur, and every requirement that was in my judgment reasonable, expedient, and practicable has been provided.

- 12. My cash receipts to date amount to £1,175 13s. 8d., and disbursements to £977 14s., leaving £197 18s. 10d. on hand, as shown by balance sheet herewith.
- 13. All clothing has been distributed, with the exception of some pilot cloth jackets recently contributed by Messrs. H. Gray & Co.; and the following supplies have been made, viz.:-

- 14. Eighty-three families have received assistance.
- A return showing distribution of supplies is appended.
- 16. May I request that this Return be published, together with this Report, and that my return and estimate of losses by the flood, forwarded to you with my letter A33/88, of 24th February last, be also published at the same time; for this latter, although laid upon the table of the Legislative Council, has not been made public, and the original Greenough Relief Committee of Perth have written to me asking for particulars of needs which I have not time to furnish to them direct, owing to the amount of official and private work which it is imperative I shall perform, but which may in some degree be gathered by an examination of the Returns referred to. I would, however, earnestly suggest that the names of persons given in the Returns be suppressed in the published account, and there replaced by corresponding numbers or letters. The only object I can see in publishing the names would be to better assure the distrustful portion of the public that I am not filching the funds; whereas no little soreness would probably be occasioned to recipients of assistance by the publicity of their names in connection with all the details which the Returns disclose.
- 17. The seed supplied has been procured from the following places, viz.:—South Australia; Victoria; Northam; Strawberry, in the Irwin District; the Bowes; Dalby's Gully; Glenfield; the Greenough, and the Swan; and it is expected that the change of seed thus effected will prove beneficial. The varieties include those named hereunder, viz.:-

From South Australia:

Wheat, White Tuscan,

Purple Tuscan, Do.

Purple Straw, Do.

and a magnificent donation of 300 bushels of specially selected seed wheat forwarded by the Hon. J. H. Angus, of Colingrove; its variety was not stated, but it has been distributed, and will henceforth be known here under the name of "Angus Wheat."

From Victoria:

Oats, Brown Tartarian.

West Australian grown:
Wheat, Diamond Grain,

Do. Golden Drop,

Do. White Lammas,

Do. Red Lammas.

Care has been taken to keep the varieties separate, and I have a record of where each is being grown.

- 18. Some persons who did not suffer directly from the flood have had seed lent to them: I was enabled to do this because, although in the exercise of my discretion I did not purchase or receive anything like the quantity of seed applied for by direct losers, still when provision had been made to allot them all the seed they could sow a balance of seed remained on hand, which had I attempted to sell late in the season must have been sold at a loss. There is still a small quantity of wheat and barley on The former I purpose getting converted into flour for the purposes of future relief.
- In all cases where seed has been supplied, and in some cases where flour, tea, and sugar have been issued, the recipients have executed stamped agreements to refund the advances not later than 31st January next.
- 20. I have, on behalf of the Greenough people, thankfully to acknowledge the action of the Government in permitting seed and goods from the fund to be carried free of charge upon our railways; also the liberality of the Adelaide Steamship Company in conveying, freight-free from Adelaide to Geraldton, a considerable quantity of seed wheat; also that of Messrs. Symon, Hammond, and Hubble, in conveying seed wheat, in a like manner, from Fremantle to Geraldton; also Messrs. E. & F. Wittenoom, in trucking goods upon the Geraldton Jetty free of charge, and Messrs. Wainwright & Co., in handling and storing seed and goods without charge.
- 21. Mr. C. F. Hicks most kindly undertook the receipt, weighing, and delivery of such of the seed as was supplied from the Walkaway Railway Station, charging nothing for his services, and thereby saving appreciable expense to the fund.
- 22. Mrs. Thomas Clinch, assisted by Corporal and Mrs. Kennedy, and later by P.C. Newton and Mrs. Newton, performed the task of selecting and delivering to the recipients the large quantities of clothing and other drapery forwarded from Perth and many parts of the Colony.

- 23. The amount of land brought under cultivation at the Greenough is estimated to be quite up to average where cultivation has been possible, and sowing is still proceeding as the flood waters recede. Although latterly the season has been unusually dry, crops look well, and there is still reason to hope that a good harvest may result.
- 24. The flood waters at the South Greenough have abated considerably. In some wells in this locality still covered by the flood water, charges of dynamite have been exploded with the object of freeing the mud accumulated at the bottom and thereby giving vent for the water to drain away. In one instance, viz., that of Mr. Edward Poole's well, operated upon by Mr. Maley in my presence, the experiment appeared to be successful, and I am informed upon reliable authority that the well continues to drain off a considerable quantity of water. Encouraged by this experiment and by the fact observed by myself and many others that wells in similar geological formation at Mid Greenongh carried off marvellous quantities of the flood water, I have arranged to incur an expenditure from the relief funds of about £20 to sink to sea level a shaft in a favorable spot selected by Mr. Maley and myself, in the expectation that it will materially assist in draining off the flood water from the lands still submerged. It may now be reasonably anticipated that during the approaching summer this water will subside sufficiently to enable the greater portion of these farm lands now submerged to be tilled next season.
- 25. Should this anticipation be realised, the basis for an equitable apportionment of the Relief Funds can then be arrived at, and perhaps the funds should then be finally distributed.
- 26. Meanwhile—viz., till next seed time, as far as I can at present judge, not more than from £600 to £800, in addition to the balance now in my hands, will be required to keep the most needy of the sufferers fairly going.
- 27. I would ask that half of the Government Grant be forwarded to me by the end of this month, for disposal in my discretion or in such manner as His Excellency the Governor may direct, as by that time the amount of money remaining in my hands will be much reduced.
