THEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA Shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on Wednesday, the tenth day of October next, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTERNOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

Additional Regulation for the Management of Goldfields.

A "protection area" under the Regulations dated the 2nd February, 1888, may continue to be held under the terms of the said Regulations for fifty days, but no longer, from and after the day upon which such "protection area" shall be within the limits of a proclaimed goldfield.

The arrival and departure of Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alterations at any time during the year.

Every Tender must bear the bond fide signatures, duly witnessed, of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the due fulfilment of the Contract, in a sum not exceeding the gross amount of the Contract for the whole period over which it extends.

Every Tender must be accompanied by the written consent, duly witnessed, of persons proposed as bondsmen as hereinbefore provided, to execute the bonds as aforesaid for the due performance of the Contract, in the event of such Tender being accepted.

When mails are conveyed in wheeled vehicles, a free passage must be provided for any officer of the Postal and Telegraph Department travelling on duty.

The Government reserves the right of terminating the Contract at any time, by giving three months notice to the Contractor.

Special forms of Tender, with conditions attached, may be obtained on application to the various Postmasters, and at the General Post Office, Perth; and no Tender will be entertained unless rendered on the prescribed form.

A BILL for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of Gold found in or procured from the soil of the Colony.

THEREAS it desirable for public reasons to ascertain the quantity of Gold found in or procured from the soil of the Colony: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

ANY banker and any person other than a banker into whose possession may come any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such gold bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall, on such gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion coming into his possession, declare the weight or value of the same in and by an affidavit to be taken before a Justice of the Peace under the provisions of the Ordinance of the 18th Vict., No. 12.

Declaration as to gold in possession.

2. ANY banker and any person other than a banker exporting or taking away from the Colony any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall at the Customs declare the weight or value of the same.

Declaration as to

ANY person failing to comply with the provisions of this Penalty. Act may, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, or any sum not exceeding an amount equal to five per cent. on the value of the undeclared articles, whichever sum shall be the greater.

NO person possessed of or exporting or taking away from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall Exception as to manufactured gold. have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles, either under the provisions of the first or of the second sections of this Act, if such articles are or could be used for personal wear. person possessed of or exporting or carrying away from the Colony articles of jewellery, including watches, manufactured of gold found in or procured from the soil of the Colony for the purposes of trade, or in number that in the opinion of the Justices is greatly in excess of what might be fairly deemed to be for personal use by such person, such person shall be subject to the provisions of the first or second sections of this Act, as the case may be, respectively.

THIS Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of Operation of Act. January, 1889.

THIS Act may be cited as "The Gold Declaration Act, Short title. 1888."

A BILL to provide for the Conveyance of Shipwrecked Passengers.

THEREAS it is provided by the fifteenth section of an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 26th and 27th years of the reign of Her Majesty the Queen, and called and known as "The Passengers Amendment Act, 1863," that it shall be lawful for the Governor of a Colony to forward any passenger or cabin passenger to his intended destination who, not by his own fault, finds himself at a port other than that to which he was bound, unless the Master of the ship in which he was a passenger give, within forty-eight hours, a written undertaking to forward or carry on such passenger within six weeks, and fulfils that undertaking:

And whereas it is provided by the fifty-second section of an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 18th and 19th years of the reign of Her Majesty the Queen, and called and known as "The Passengers Act, 1855," that it shall be lawful for the Governor of a Colony to defray the whole or part of the expenses incurred in and about the picking up at sea from a boat, raft, or otherwise of a passenger or cabin passenger:

And whereas it is provided by the sixteenth section of the said first mentioned Act that all expenses incurred by a Governor of a Colony under the said fifteenth section thereof and under the said fifty-second section of the last mentioned Act shall become a debt due to Her Majesty and her successors from the owner, charterer, and master of the ship:

And whereas those provisions are applicable only to certain voyages of specified distance and duration, and it is expedient that similar provisions be enacted in reference to colonial voyages of shorter distance and duration than those specified in the said Imperial Acts:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Governor may pay expenses of taking off passengers at sea.

IF any passenger or cabin passenger of any passenger ship shall be taken off from any such passenger ship or picked up at sea from any boat, raft, or otherwise, if the port or place to which he shall be conveyed be within this Colony, including its dependencies, it shall be lawful for the Governor, or for any person, board, or body authorised by him for the purpose, to defray all or any part of the expenses thereby incurred.

ALL expenses incurred under the first and second sections of this Act, or either of them, by or by the authority of the Governor, including the cost of maintaining a passenger until forwarded to his ceding sections to be destination, and of all necessary bedding, provisions, and stores, shall a debt due to the become a debt to Her Majesty and her successors from the owner, charterer, and master of such ship, and shall be recoverable from them, or from one or more of them, at the suit and for the use of Her Majesty, in like manner as in the case of other Crown debts; and a certificate in the form in the Schedule hereto annexed, or as near thereto as the circumstances of the case will admit, purporting to be under the hand of the Governor or his representative as aforesaid, stating the total amount of such expenses, shall in any suit or other proceeding for the recovery of such debt be received in evidence without the proof of the handwriting or of the official character of the Governor or his representative as aforesaid, and shall be deemed sufficient evidence of the amount of such expenses, and that the same were duly incurred; nor shall it be necessary to adduce on behalf of Her Majesty any other evidence in support of the claim, but judgment shall pass for the Crown, with costs of suit, unless the defendant shall specially plead and duly prove any facts showing that such expenses were not duly incurred under the provisions of this Act.

A BILL to provide for the Inspection of Boilers.

THEREAS explosions dangerous to life and limb may occur by reason of boilers being unsound, and it is desirable to prevent the same: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

1. NO boiler, whether marine, stationary, or movable, shall be used in any city, town, municipality, or port, or within six miles All boilers to be inthereof, for any purpose whatsoever, unless and until the same be inspected and passed in manner hereinafter provided.

Inspectors of boilers to be appointed.

THE Governor may appoint Inspectors of Boilers in and for every city, town, municipality, and port in the Colony, who shall have jurisdiction for the purposes of this Act in such city, town, municipality, or port, and within six miles in any direction from any part of such city, town, municipality, or port. Provided always, that the Governor may appoint the same person as Inspector in and for more than one of such places.

Inspector to give certificate of fitness of boiler.

IF an Inspector on examining a boiler deem the same fit for use, he shall give a certificate to the effect that having inspected the same it is good for use for such period as he names in such certifi-Such certificate may be in the form given in Schedule A. to this Act.

Penalty for using boiler before inspection.

IF any person use any boiler for any purpose whatsoever in any city, town, municipality, or port, or within six miles in any direction from any part of such city, town, municipality, or port, in or for which an Inspector shall have been appointed, he shall, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not being under Five or over Twenty pounds.

Penalty for using boiler after expiry of certificate.

IF any person, when an Inspector shall have given a certificate that a boiler was good for use for a certain period, shall use the said boiler in any part of the Colony for any purpose whatsoever after the said period has expired, and without having obtained a further certificate of its fitness for use for a further period, such person shall, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not being under Five pounds or over Fifty pounds.

IF any person, when an Inspector shall have examined a Penalty for using boiler and shall have declined to give a certificate of its fitness for of certificate.

Use, shall use the said boiler in any part of the Colony for any use, shall use the said boiler in any part of the Colony for any purpose whatsoever, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall on conviction on indictment or information be imprisoned for a term of not under three nor over twelve calendar months with hard labor.

Inspector's fees.

THE fees due and payable to an Inspector in respect of the inspection of a boiler, and of a certificate, and of each of them, shall be paid by the owner of such boiler to such Inspector for such Inspector's personal use and benefit. The fees to be taken by an Inspector shall be those mentioned in Schedule B. to this Act.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Flour sacks will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.
