BEACON ON BUCCANEER ROCK, DAMPIER CREEK, ROEBUCK BAY.

A BEACON has been erected by the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries on the Buccaneer Rock, in Dampier Creek, Roebuck Bay.

The beacon consists of an iron telegraph pole, sunk in the rock and stayed, with an iron drum on the top, and is placed on the East side of the rock, being seven feet (7ft.) above high water spring tides (springs rise 28 feet).

Buccaneer Rock is half a mile from the townsite of Broome.

A buoy has also been placed by Capt. Pincombe, of the "Otway," in $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on end of spit, opposite Channel Rock, off Entrance Point, to be left to starboard on going

BANK LYING OFF 80-MILE BEACH, N.W. AUSTRALIA.

THE Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries reports that, having sounded the bank lying off the eighty-mile beach, he finds that it extends in a N. Ely. and S. Wly. direction for about 30 miles in length, forming a narrow ridge with 3 to 7 fathoms L.W.S. on the bank, and 12 to 15 fathoms on each side of it.

The position of S.W. end of bank is Lat. 19° 14′ S.; Long. 121° 02′ East; and it is evidently a continuation of Patterson Shoal, of which the position is marked "Doubtful"

on the Chart.

Additional Regulation for the Management of Goldfields.

A "protection area" under the Regulations dated the 2nd February, 1888, may continue to be held under the terms of the said Regulations for fifty days, but no longer, from and after the day upon which such "protection area" shall be within the limits of a proclaimed goldfield.

**ENDERS (endorsed "Tender for [as the case may be] Mail") will be received at this Office until noon of Monday, the 26th November, 1888, for the conveyance of the undermentioned Mails for one, two, or three years, viz.:-

1. Between Guildford Post Office and Swan, in

a spring vehicle, once a week.

2. Between Guildford and Chittering, once a fortnight, in a spring vehicle, visiting the various homesteads for the purpose of delivering and receiving letters, &c.

3. Between York Post Office and the Railway Station, once daily, or oftener if required, in a spring vehicle.

4. Between Fremantle Post Office, the Railway Station, and Sea Jetties, as often as re-

quired, in a spring vehicle.

9. Between Vasse and Quindalup, viâ Newtown, twice a week, on horseback.

- 11. For whole service between Guildford and Geraldton, viâ Gingin, Bindoon, New Norcia, Walebing, Berkshire, Marah, Carnamah, Nairn's, Long's, Arrino, Yandenooka, Irwin, Strawberry, Dongarra, and Greenough, once a week, in a spring vehicle, to Marah, thence on horseback to Geraldton, with alternative Tenders for services:
 - (1.) Between Guildford and Long's Station, once a week, in a spring vehicle, to Marah, and from thence to Long's, on horseback.
 - (2.) Between Long's and Geraldton, once a week, on horseback.
- 12. Between Bridgetown and Jayes, once a week, on horseback.
- 13. Between Bunbury and Balbarrup, viâ Dardanup, Preston, Balingup, and Bridgetown, once a week, in a 4-wheeled spring vehicle.

The arrival and departure of Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alterations at any time during the year.

Every Tender must bear the bonû fide signatures, duly witnessed, of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the due fulfilment of the Contract, in a sum not exceeding the gross amount of the Contract for the whole period over which it extends.

Every Tender must be accompanied by the written consent, duly witnessed, of persons proposed as bondsmen as hereinbefore provided, to execute the bonds as aforesaid for the due performance of the Contract, in the event of such Tender being accepted.

When mails are conveyed in wheeled vehicles, a free passage must be provided for any officer of the Postal and Telegraph Department travelling on duty.

The Government reserves the right of terminating the Contract at any time, by giving three months notice to the Contractor.

Special forms of Tender, with conditions attached, may be obtained on application to the various Postmasters, and at the General Post Office, Perth; and no Tender will be entertained unless rendered on the prescribed form.

The Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender.
