PROCLAMATION

Western Australia,
to wit.

Western Australia and its Depend-

WHEREAS by an Act of the Legislative Council of the said Colony made and passed in the 40th year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 13, intituled "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," power is given to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to define the boundaries of any Municipality, and it is expedient to extend the limits of the Municipality of Albany by defining the boundaries of the said Municipality as hereinafter mentioned; AND WHEREAS by the said Act it is provided that if at any time subsequent to the constituting of a Municipality the population shall exceed one thousand but shall not exceed five thousand there shall be a council for the government of such Municipality consisting of a chairman and nine councillors; AND WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Councils Titles Act, 1885," the name and style of the Chairman of the Municipality of Albany was altered to the name and style of Mayor of such Municipality; AND WHEREAS the population of Albany now exceeds one thousand but does not exceed five thousand, and the Council of the Municipality of Albany now consists of a Mayor and six Councillors; AND WHEREAS it is lawful and right that the Council of the said Municipality should consist of a Mayor and nine Councillors; and whereas it is expedient that the said Municipality so extended as to its limits as aforesaid be divided into three Wards, each of such Wards returning three members to the said Council; and whereas by the said Act power is given to the

Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to define the boundaries of the Wards in any Municipality and the limits thereof: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby notify and proclaim the boundaries of the Municipality of Albany to be as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the Northern shore of Princess Royal Harbor, and extending North 20 chains 70 links along the most Eastern boundary of Plantagenet Location 33 to the South boundary of Plantagenet Location 2; then East along it 15 chains 40 links to its South-East corner; then North passing along the East boundary of Location 2 aforesaid to the North-East corner of Plantagenet Location 226; thence by a straight line to Scraggy Bluff on Strawberry Hill, passing along part of the Southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 42; thence to a spot on the Western shore of Oyster Harbor, from which the summit of Green Island bears due East, passing along part of the Southern boundary of Location 42 aforesaid, and the whole of the Southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 43. On the North-East by the shore of Oyster Harbor. On the South-East by the shore of King George's Sound, and on the South-West by the shore of Princess Royal Harbor; also that portion of land about Mount Martin which lies West of a line extending from the summit of Green Island to the largest Bird rock lying off Point Spencer.

And I do also, with the advice aforesaid, hereby notify and proclaim that the Municipality of Albany is hereby divided into three Wards; and I do also, with the advice aforesaid, hereby proclaim and define the boundaries of such Wards and the limits thereof to be as follows:—

NORTH WARD.

All that portion of the Municipality of Albany situated to the Northward and Eastward of a line starting from the South-West corner of Suburban Lot 91, and extending East to the South-East corner of Suburban Lot 102, thence Easterly to the North-West corner of Albany Lot 474, thence Easterly to the northernmost corner of Albany Lot 482, thence South-Easterly along the Eastward boundaries of Albany Lots 483 and 498 to the North-East corner of Albany Lot 271, thence Southerly along the East boundaries of Albany Lots 271 and 270 to the centre of Grey Street, thence Easterly along the centre of Grey, Gordon, and Short Streets, thence to the summit of Mount Clarence, thence to the South-West corner of Suburban Lot 3, thence Easterly along Suburban Lots 3, 2, 1, 13, and Reserve 495A to Wooding Point on the Sea Coast.

EAST WARD.

Bounded on the *North* by the North Ward, on the *East* and *South* by the Sea Coast and by the Northern shore of Princess Royal Harbor, and on the *West* by the centre of York Street.

WEST WARD.

Bounded on the *North* by the North Ward, and by a portion of the South boundary of Plantagenet Location 2. On the *East* by the centre of York Street, on the *South* by the Northern shore of Princess Royal Harbor, and on the *West* by the East boundary of Plantagenet Location 33.

And I do, by the like authority and the like advice, hereby appoint the nineteenth day of November, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be the day on which an Election shall be holden in and for each of the said Wards for the purpose of returning three persons for each of the said Wards to be Councillors in the said Municipal Council.

Present,

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British

merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of the Independent State of the Congo:

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the London "Gazette" seamen, not being slaves and not being British subjects, who within Her Majesty's dominions desert from merchant ships belonging to citizens of the Independent State of the Congo, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships: Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained till he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence, if any, has been carried into effect.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BEACON ON BUCCANEER ROCK, DAMPIER CREEK, ROEBUCK BAY.

A BEACON has been erected by the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries on the Buccaneer Rock, in Dampier Creek, Roebuck Bay.

The beacon consists of an iron telegraph pole, sunk in the rock and stayed, with an iron drum on the top, and is placed on the East side of the rock, being seven feet (7ft.) above high water spring tides (springs rise 28 feet).

Buccaneer Rock is half a mile from the townsite of Broome.

A buoy has also been placed by Capt. Pincombe, of the "Otway," in 2½ fathoms on end of spit, opposite Channel Rock, off Entrance Point, to be left to starboard on going in.

**BANK LYING OFF 80-MILE BEACH,
N.W. AUSTRALIA.**

THE Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries reports that, having sounded the bank lying off the eighty-mile beach, he finds that it extends in a N. Ely. and S. Wly. direction for about 30 miles in length, forming a narrow ridge with 3 to 7 fathoms L.W.S. on the bank, and 12 to 15 fathoms on each side of it.

The position of S.W. end of bank is Lat. 19° 14' S.; Long. 121° 02' East; and it is evidently a continuation of Patterson Shoal, of which the position is marked "Doubtful" on the Chart.

SOUTH ENTRANCE TO MORETON BAY.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Channel across the Bar at the South Entrance has shifted slightly to the eastward. To obtain the greatest depth, which does not exceed 11½ feet at low-water springs, the beacon on the Amity Point shore must now be kept open to the westward of the foot of the rise of the high land, bearing S. by W. and midway between that position and a clearly defined tree which stands above the rest of the wooded point.

The color of the outer buoy abreast the South end of Moreton Island has been changed from red to black, and the buoy is to be passed on the port hand by vessels entering and using the Rous Channel.

Separate Samples of all but Meat and Vegetables must accompany tenders for each service.

Gin, Brandy; Wine, Port, Sherry, or Colonial; English or Colonial Porter (Bottled), Vinegar, Lime Juice, Colza, Paraffine, and 150° test Kerosene Oil, @ per gallon.

Pipes, @ per dozen.

Coir for beds, @ per cwt.

Milk, @ per gallon.

Firewood, @ per cord of 128 feet, to consist of Banksia, to be delivered and stacked by the Contractor when and where required, and subject to measurement on delivery.

Firewood for Rottnest to be Banksia wood, in billets of 9 inches diameter and three feet in length.

Firewood @ per cord, or Coal @ per ton, for Breaksea Island, King George's Sound, delivered on the Island.

Firewood for Fremantle to be @ per cord, delivered at the Gaol and Asylum.

The whole of the supplies to be of unexceptional quality, and subject to approval or rejection by officers or persons duly deputed by the Government.

The Flour to be warranted to keep good for six months after delivery.

Fresh Meat to be delivered daily, when the Government or its representative may consider it practicable, and in proportion of three days' supply of Mutton to four days' supply of Beef per week, or alternate days of each. When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, excluding heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints.

The Government reserves the right to cancel the contract for Meat at the end of March, 1889.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week: Pumpkins, 2lb.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 1½lb.; or Onions, ¼lb., for every pound of potatoes.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Flour sacks will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.

2.—CARTAGE

That may be required at Perth and Fremantle during the year 1889—irrespective of Colonial Store Department.

The Contractor to, so far as it is practicable, give immediate attention to the orders sent; and should a flue remain unswept 36 hours after such an order has been given, other persons will be employed, at the Contractor's cost, to do the work.

5.—CESS PITS.
