IS Excellency the Governor, acting in this behalf by virtue of "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868," Section 2, has been pleased to order and direct that the area hereinafter defined shall be a place for the performance of Quarantine in the Port of Carnarvon, viz. :-

Babbage Island and the adjacent space or anchorage ground hereinafter defined.

Northern limit.—Anchor Hill, on Whitmore Point, or the North entrance of Whitmore Island, bearing East magnetic.

Southern limit.—Site of proposed beacon on Babbage Island, being the highest of the low hills in about centre of island, bearing East magnetic.

Eastern limit.—A line parallel to, and eight cables from, a line joining the above two points.

Western limit.—A line parallel to, and eight cables to the Westward of this line, or sixteen cables from the line joining the two points named.

The depths over this quarantine anchorage ground are from two and a-half to three fathoms and three-quarters (sand).

Additional Amended Regulation for the management of Goldfields.

Any Protection Area granted under the Regulations of 2nd February, 1888, which after the date of the grant thereof shall have come or shall come within the limits of a proclaimed goldfield, may, notwithstanding the proclamation of such goldfield, continue to be held under the terms of the said regulations, until the expiration of one year from the date of such grant or until the discovery of payable gold on such area, whichever shall first happen; in which latter case the Goldfields Regulations will immediately apply-provided that if the labor conditions requiring two men for each protection area, as provided by the Regulations of 2nd February, 1888, are not fully complied with, the above extension of time will cease and determine, and the protection area will be forfeited.

This Regulation is substituted for the Additional Regulation gazetted on October 1st, 1888, which is hereby cancelled.

Notice.—The attention of holders of Protection Areas is called to the above Regulation intended for their benefit, but they are warned that the Wardens of Goldfields are instructed not to grant any exemption from the labor conditions to persons availing themselves of this Regulation.

"The Building Act, 1884."

Proposed additional By-Laws, following those published in "Government Gazette" dated 8th April, 1886.

Every wall constructed of brick or stone, or other similar substances, shall be properly bonded and solidly put together with mortar or cement, and no part of such wall (except coping) shall overhang any part underneath it, and all return walls shall be properly bonded together.

- 6. Three days before any building, or any work to, in, or upon any building is commenced, and also if the progress of any such building or work is, after the commencement thereof, suspended for any period exceeding three months, three days before such building or work is resumed, and also if, during the progress of any such building or work, the builder employed thereon is changed, then two days before any new builder enters upon the continuance of such building or work, it shall be the duty of the builder engaged in building or re-building such building, or in continuing such building or work, to give the Town Surveyor notice in writing, stating the situation, area, and height, and intended use of the building or the Town Surveyor notice in writing, stating the situation, area, and height, and intended use of the building or buildings about to be commenced, or to, in, or upon which any work is to be done, and the number of such buildings (if more than one), and also the particulars of any such proposed work, and stating also his own name and address; but any works to, in, or upon the same building that are in progress at the same time may be included in the one notice. the one notice.
- 7. There shall be paid to the Town Surveyor, in respect of his services under this Act, the amount specified in the following schedule, viz :-

- 8. The above fees to be paid by the person applying for the license, on delivery of the same, and recoverable sum-marily before any two Justices of the Peace.
- That the Contractor for any new building about to 9. That the Contractor for any new building about to be erected after this date must apply to the Town Surveyor for the street frontage and levels, three days before he enters upon the work, and that the Contractor shall have no right to commence such work until he has the said authority in writing from the Town Surveyor, under penalty of £5 per day for acting contrary to the By-laws, the same to be recoverable under this Act.
- 10. That all buildings erected after passing these By-Laws intended for human occupation, the thickness of the walls shall not be less than the following:




