THE following instructions are issued by direction of His Excellency the Governor for the information and guidance of all Officers of the Public Service of the Colony.

All Government Officers are strictly prohibited from doing any private work whatever in office hours, or with Government materials, or in the Public Offices at any time, or from using an official railway pass on any journey connected with any private work.

Except in the few special cases in which the practice may already have been allowed, all Officers are debarred from private work, for remuneration, in the profession, trade, or calling in respect of which they receive an official salary.

In default of special reasons and express stipulation beforehand to the contrary, future appointments, increases of salary, and promotions in the Civil Service of the Colony will carry the like prohibition.

No Officer who has been allowed to accept professional work in his private time is permitted to undertake such work at rates of charges lower than those recognised in the profession concerned.

OTICE is hereby given that, in accordance with the Resolution agreed upon by the Representatives of the Australasian Colonies at the Postal Conference held at Sydney in January last, and approved by His Excellency the Governor in as far as relates to this Colony, a reduced Rate of Postage for Correspondence passing between England and Australasia by the long sea route, on board the Imperial Mail Steamers, has been adopted by the Postmaster General in London with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, as also the further Resolution for the introduction of Post Cards into the Postal System between England and the Australasian Colonies.

In establishing these two services it has been decided to adopt the following Rates of Postage:—

For Letters sent $vi\hat{a}$ Brindisi or Naples, 6d. the ½oz. as at present.

For Post Cards sent via Brindisi or Naples, 3d. each.

For Letters sent by the long sea route, 4d. the $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

For Post Cards sent by the long sea route, 2d. each.

These rates to take effect from the 1st of January, 1889.

By the long sea route is meant the continuation of the Steamer's passage from Brindisi or Naples to England *viâ* Gibraltar; the difference in time is six days in favor of the route *viâ* Brindisi or Naples.
