By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

N pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation appoint

Wednesday, the 2nd January proximo,

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the city of Perth and in the towns of Fremantle, York, and Northam, in the said Colony.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this 29th day of December, 1888.
