South Australia, to wit.

JAS. P. BOUCAUT, Administrator. Proclamation by His Excellency the Honorable James Penn Boucaur, Her Majesty's Senior Judge of the Supreme Court of the Colony of South Australia, the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony of South Australia and the Dependencies thereof, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS the disease called scab exists in sheep in the colony of Western Australia, and whereas it is desirable to prevent the introduction of such disease into the province of South Australia: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by virtue of the provisions of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1888," do hereby proclaim, order, and direct that the importation or introduction of sheep from the said colony of Western Australia into the said province of South Australia shall be and is hereby prohibited for a period of two years from the publication hereof: And I further proclaim, order, and direct that no sheepskins shall be imported or introduced from the colonies of Western Australia or New Zealand into the said province of South Australia for a period of two years from the publication hereof, unless such sheepskins shall be securely packed in bales.

Given under my hand and the public seal of the said colony, at Adelaide, this twenty-ninth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and in the fifty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, His Excellency Sir George Cumine Strahan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies, did absolutely prohibit the importation into Tasmania of Sheep from the Colony of Western Australia: And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the importation into Tasmania of the Skins of Sheep or any part of any Sheep from the Colony of Western Australia and to vary such Proclamation accordingly: Now therefore I, SIR ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in Council, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by Section Three of "The Diseased Animals Importation Prevention Act" (47 Vict. No. 2), do, by this Proclamation, absolutely prohibit the importation into Tasmania of the Skins of Sheep or any part of any Sheep from the said Colony of Western Australia.

ALTERATION OF LEADING LIGHTS, NORTH OR HOWE CHANNEL.

IN pursuance of a Notice to Mariners issued from this office on 20th November relative to the proposed alteration in the Lights for the North Channel, at the entrance to Moreton Bay, consequent upon the growth westward of the East Bank, notice is hereby given that on and after the 5th February the position of the Light at Tangaluma will be shifted further to the North-east, and Vessels entering by that Channel will keep the Leading Lights in line, or slightly open to the westward, when passing the East Bank, and as soon as it is passed will be careful not to open them to the westward until they have proceeded a distance of one mile, when they can steer for proceeded a distance of one mile, when they can steer for Cowan Cowan as usual.

It is possible that the position of the Yellow Patch Light may not be shifted on the same day, but the range of the Red Sector will in either case be the same, and the Channel in that respect will be navigated as at present.
