THE following Minute of His Excellency the Administrator, with reference to the Works now being carried on at the mouth of the River Swan, together with the Report of the Acting Director of Public Works, is published for general information.

From His Excellency the Administrator to the Honorable Acting Colonial Secretary.

Ask the Acting Director of Public Works to prepare a careful report on the works now being carried on by the Dredge and party at the mouth of the Swan River:

Clearly showing—

1. What is designed.

- 2. What has been effected.
- 3. What remains undone.
- 4. The total estimated cost.
- 5. What has been spent.
- 6. What funds remain.

7. The present staff and labor employed.

8. How long the funds at command will suffice to maintain operations if carried on as at present.

Beyond this information, I wish for the opinion of the Acting Director of Public Works on the general progress and apparent result of the work so far as completed or in hand.

THE HONORABLE THE ACTING COLONIAL SECRETARY,

For His Excellency the Administrator's information, and in reply to the questions in the minute of 8-2-90, as to the works now being carried out at the mouth of the Swan River, I have the honor to forward to you the following Report:

# "WHAT IS DESIGNED?"

The details of the preliminary, experimental and part permanent works, already carried out, in course of execution, or designed to be executed when additional funds are available, are as follows:—

- 1. To protect from denudation and ultimate destruction the narrow neck of sand hills lying Northward of Rous' Head between the Ocean and the River, and at the same time stop the further silting of the river by sand wind carried from these hills.
- 2. To carry seaward from Rous' Head, in S.W. direction, a breakwater to shelter the entrance from N.W. weather, and also to deflect the coast travelling sand and shingle, and prevent silting in the channel cutting. To form a mole southward of and with same direction as the breakwater, with a water-way or entrance between, of from 200 to 300 feet wide, carried out into 17 feet water.
- 3. To confine the water of the River by training-walls and banks on N. and S. banks, and so induce a scour and regular current sufficient to carry any alluvium and sand in suspension, to sea.
- 4. To reclaim an area of about 70 acres of the now tide-covered sand-flat on S. side of river. This reclamation to be presently formed into wharves, and provided with appliances for dealing with the coastal and other small shipping, and also to afford sites for warehouses, stores, and an extension of the port installation and railway accommodation.
- 5. To remove, by blasting and dredging the Bar at the river mouth, and form a channel 14 to 18 feet deep; the depth being determined by the reductive effect of the entrance channel on the scend of the ocean wave.
- $6.\ {\rm To}\ {\rm dredge}$  and scour, to a depth of from 10 to 14 feet, an area of about 80 acres of land-locked protected water.
- 7. The general design, of which the foregoing are parts and details, being to form within the river mouth a small land-locked  $2\frac{\pi}{6}$  fathom harbor, with a protected entrance, with reclaimed areas of land to meet the requirements of the growing commerce of the port.

# "WHAT HAS BEEN EFFECTED?"

Operations were commenced in September, 1888, and now the sum of the work done is—

1. The neck of sand-hills northward of Rous' Head has been protected by fascine work, bushed, and sown with grass, and on the river side an area of about 5 acres has been reclaimed.

2. On the South side of river 1274 feet out of the 3000 feet of training works required, has been erected.

The quantities of the work done are—

- 3. Sand and silt dredged and filled to reclamations ... 42,000 cubic yards.
- 4. Seaweed dredged and collected and placed on sandhills ... 6,000
- 5. Stone taken from river bed and built into walls ... 3,500 ,,
- 6. Complete piled and sheeted training palisade on S. side ... 1,274 lineal feet.

# "What remains Undone?"

To save recapitulation I would ask His Excellency to compare the above replies to the questions "What is designed?" and "What has been effected?"

# "THE TOTAL ESTIMATED COST?"

I believe the project to improve the River Swan at its mouth was authorised and undertaken as an experimental work, upon which £5,000 was to be expended, and without any estimates of the cost of the completed permanent work being recorded, and it was not and is not practicable to form such an estimate of costs without first expending several months of study and fully elaborating the plans and calculations of the scheme—and this has not yet been done.

# "THE PRESENT STAFF AND LABOR EMPLOYED?"

The works are under the superintendence of the Resident Engineer ("Surveyor") part of whose emolument is charged to the Votes for this work, and the following is a list of the Officers, Mechanics, and Convict labor employed:

Officer in charge (H. Passmore).

Two Engine Drivers.

One Blacksmith.

One Carpenter. One Warder.

One Night-watchman.

Twenty-six Convicts.

"How long the Funds at command will suffice to maintain Operations if carried on as at present?"

Dredging on the north side is the only work now being done, and for this the average monthly expenditure is about £100 for supervision, skilled or mechanic labor, warding, and for fuel and other materials. And this average expenditure, so long as the scale of operations is not increased, will be maintained.

At this rate the funds at command will suffice to maintain operations! through this year.

# GENERALLY.

The progress of the work has been satisfactory in character, the results so far obtained from the still incomplete initial works being—

- 1. The almost entire stoppage of the denudation of the neck of sand-hills between the Sea and River, and the stoppage also of a sand drift. And I need not say that on the maintenance of this neck of sand-hills the continuance of the present river mouth depends. It therefore has been strengthened at its base on the river side by a walled reclamation several acres in extent.
- 2. The training works, although they are incomplete, have induced a perceptible scour, and with the removal of the old groins and the sand banks which had accumulated round them, the waterway of the proposed channel has been deepened.
- 3. The results from these operations, considered with those obtained by the experimental blasting done at the Bar, demonstrate, I think, that the Bar may be removed, and a channel formed and maintained without any practical difficulty—and are sufficient to warrant a further expenditure in prosecuting the works, and in the order of the following approximate Estimate:—
