W HEREAS by "The Colonial Attorneys Relief Act," passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, it is enacted that Her Majesty may from time to time, by Order in Council, direct that Act to come into operation as to any one or more of Her Majesty's Colonies or Dependencies, and thereupon, but not otherwise, the provisions of the Act shall apply to persons duly admitted as Attorneys and Solicitors in the Superior Courts of Law and Equity in such Colonies or Dependencies, but no such Order in Council shall be made in respect of any Colony, except upon application made by the Governor or person exercising the functions of Governor of such Colony or Dependency, and until it shall be shown to the satisfaction of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies that the system of jurisprudence as administered in such Colony or Dependency, and the qualification for admission as an Attorney or Solicitor in the Superior Courts of Law and Equity in such Colony or Dependency, answer to and fulfil the conditions specified in section three of the said Act, and also that the Attorneys or Solicitors of the Superior Courts of Law or Equity in England are admitted as Attorneys and Solicitors in the Superior Courts of Law and Equity of such Colony or Dependency on production of their certificates of admission

in the English Courts, without service or examination in the Colony or Dependency:

And whereas by the Colonial Attorneys Relief Act Amendment Act, 1884, it is enacted that upon application made by the Governor or person exercising the functions of Governor of any of Her Majesty's Colonies or Dependencies, and after it has been shown to the satisfaction of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, that the system of jurisprudence as administered in such Colony or Dependency answers to and fulfils the conditions specified in section three of the Colonial Attorneys Relief Act, and also that the Attorneys and Solicitors of the Superior Courts of Law or Equity in England are admitted as Attorneys and Solicitors in the Superior Courts of Law and Equity of such Colony or Dependency on production of their certificates of admission in the English Courts, without service in the Colony or Dependency or examination, except in the laws of the Colony or Dependency, in so far as they differ from the laws of England, Her Majesty may from time to time, by Order in Council, direct the Colonial Attorneys Relief Act to come into operation as to such Colony or Dependency, although persons may in certain cases be admitted as Attorneys or Solicitors in such Colony or Dependency without possessing all the qualifications for admission, or having fulfilled the conditions specified in the said section three, and thereupon, but not otherwise, the provisions of the Colonial Attorneys Relief Act shall apply to persons duly admitted as Attorneys and Solicitors in such Colony or Dependency shall be admitted as a Solicitor of the Supreme Court in England, unless, in addition to the requirements of the Colonial Attorneys Relief Act, he prove by affidavit that he has served for five years under articles of clerkship to a Solicitor or Attorney-at-law in such Colony or Dependency, and passed an examination to test his fitness and capacity before he was admitted an Attorney or Solicitor in such Colony or Dependency; and further, that he has since been in actual practice as Attorney or Solicitor in such Colony o

And whereas application has been made by Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, that the Colonial Attorneys Relief Acts may be directed to come into operation within the said Colony:

And whereas it has been shown to the satisfaction of Baron Knutsford, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, that the system of jurisprudence as administered in the Colony of Western Australia answers to and fulfils the conditions specified in section three of the Colonial Attorneys Relief Act, and also that the Attorneys or Solicitors of the Superior Courts of Law or Equity in England are admitted as Attorneys and Solicitors in the Superior Courts of Law and Equity of Western Australia on production of their certificates of admission in the English Courts, without service or examination in Western Australia;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above-recited Acts, and in execution of the powers thereby in Her Majesty vested, Her Majesty is pleased, with the advice of Her most Honourable Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the date of the publication of this Order in Council by the Officer administering the Government of the Colony, the Colonial Attorneys Relief Act shall, subject to the qualifications enacted by the Colonial Attorneys Relief Act Amendment Act, 1884, come into operation as to the Colony of Western Australia, although persons may, in certain cases, be admitted as Attorneys or Solicitors in the said Colony without possessing all the qualifications for admission, or having fulfilled the conditions specified in section three of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies is to give the necessary instructions herein accordingly.

# Government University Exhibition.

THE Examination for the Government University Exhibition will take place on Monday, May 26th, and following days.

Applications must be with the Secretary by the 17th May, 1890.

## CONDITIONS AND RULES.

- 1. An Exhibition, to be held at any one of the Universities hereinafter mentioned, shall be open for competition to any boy between the ages of 16 and 18 years, whose parents, or either of them, shall be bona fide residents in the Colony of Western Australia, and who himself shall have been a resident therein for a period of 3 years at least previous to the holding of the Examination provided for by these Rules.
- The said Exhibition shall be tenable for a period of 3 years, and shall be of the value of £100 for each of the said 3 years.
- 3. All competitors for the said Exhibition shall pass an examination to be held in Perth by two examiners appointed by the Governors of the High School.
- The Examination shall be held during the month of May in each year, and shall comprise the following subjects, viz.:-

1. Arithmetic: all.

- 2. Algebra: including quadratic equations.
- 3. Trigonometry: including solution of triangles.
- 4. Euclid: Books I., II., and III., and riders thereon.
- Virgil, either Books I., III., III. of the Eneid, or the Livy: Book XXI. 5. Æneid, or the four Georgics.

6.

- Greek: Homer's Iliad, Books I., II., and III.
- 7. Greek: Homer's James, 8. French: Fénelon's Télémaque. 9. English Composition and Modern Geography.
- 10. Outlines of English, Greek, and Roman History.
- Every competitor shall forward to the Secretary of the said Board a notice of his intention to compete at such Examination, together with
  - (a.) A certificate attesting his good character and repute.
  - (b.) A certificate of the date of his birth.
  - (c.) Proof of residential qualifications.
- 6. In the case of competitors from any school, the certificate (a.) shall be signed by the Head Master; in all other cases such certificate shall be signed by the clergyman, priest, or minister of the religious denomination to which such competitor shall belong, and of the district in which such competitor shall be residing, or by the Resident Magistrate of that district.
- The said examiners shall within a reasonable time, and without previous communication to any other person, report to the Board the result of such examination, showing the marks obtained by each candidate in each subject; and the Governors shall proceed to adjudicate thereon, and shall award or withhold the Exhibition accordingly, submitting their decision to the Governor, which decision shall, on the approval of His Excellency, be notified in the Government Gazette.
- 8. The Exhibition shall be held under the following conditions, viz.:-
- (a.) The Exhibitioner shall, within 12 months of the Gazette notice, obtain admission as a resident at one of the following Universities, viz.:—Oxford,

Cambridge, London, Dublin, Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide.

- (b.) He shall begin residence at the University as soon as the regulations thereat shall allow.
- 9. The holder of the Exhibition shall be entitled to receive the said sum of £100 by half-yearly instalments, so long as he shall continue in residence at such University, subject to the production of such certificates or other evidence as the Governors may from time to time direct.
- The Board of Governors of the High School may from time to time, with the approval of the Governor, revoke, add to, or amend these rules.
