publication, for general information, of the following Goldfield Regulation, made and approved by him in Executive Council, to be substituted for the present Regulation No. 91, which is hereby cancelled. The new Regulation will come into force this day.

Date of Lease and Payment of Rents.

91. All Gold Mining Leases granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of the approval by the Governor.

All rents of Gold Mining Leases shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st December, and shall be paid in advance to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his Agents, at the various Resident Magistrates' Courts in the Colony, or to the Warden of the Goldfield, on or before the 1st of March in each year.

Leases applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application, viz.: from the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October, as the case may be.

A book shall be kept at the Warden's Office on all Goldfields where ground is held under lease, to be called a Register of Gold Mining Leaseholds; in which book shall be entered the names of all lessees, the share each lessee holds, all transfers made, and all liens upon lessees' shares.
