Order in Council.

Order made by the Administrator in Executive Council under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44th Victoria, No. 5).

 W_{HEREAS} an Order duly made under the provisions of the Second Section of the 44th Vic., No. 5, is now in force, forbidding any person to land or introduce into the Colony any Grape Vine or any portion thereof from any of the Australian Colonies, and it is expedient that the operation of such Order should be limited as hereinafter mentioned, I, Sir MALCOLM FRASER, Knight Commander of the Most

Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by this Order made in Executive Council in pursuance of the said Act do direct and declare that it shall at any time during the six calendar months next after the date of the publication hereof in the Government Gazette of Western Australia be lawful for any person to land or introduce into the Colony any Grape Vine *cuttings* being the produce of the Province of South Australia, any previous order to the contrary notwithstanding.

GUILDFORD MUNICIPALITY. By-Laws.

THE COUNCIL-WHEN AND WHERE TO MEET.

1. The Council shall meet in the place appointed by them, for the transaction of their ordinary business, on the first Thursday in every month at 8 p.m., and the business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors.

QUORUM OF MEMBERS NECESSARY.

2. The Council shall commence business so soon after the above mentioned hour as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum, but if at the expiration of thirty (30) minutes from the above-mentioned hour there is not a quorum present, the Council shall stand adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETINGS.

3. A special meeting of the Council may be convened at any time by the Mayor, by notice to that effect to the Councillors, and the Mayor shall convene a special meeting within seven days of the receipt of a Requisition signed by three Councillors requiring him to do so; the said notice shall state the business for which such special meeting is called, and such business alone shall be discussed at such meeting.

4. At all meetings of the Council the Minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

By-Laws.

5. No By-Law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed until twenty-eight days afterwards; and every such By-Law shall, for these twenty-eight days, remain open for the inspection of the burgesses at the office of the Council.

How Notices to be given.

6. Whenever the Guildford Municipal Council is required to give any public notice, such notice shall be given (unless in any particular instance, in which some special form of notice shall be required) by affixing the same to the notice board at the Council's ordinary place of meeting.

RATES-TO WHOM PAYABLE.

All rates, whether in arrear or current, and all license fees, fines, rents, and other sums due to the Council, shall be paid to such person as the Council may from time to time appoint to be their Collector by notice affixed to notice board at door of their ordinary place of meeting. The receipt of the Collector shall be a full and sufficient discharge for any rates or fees paid to him. All sums so received by the Collector shall be paid by him to the Treasurer once a month or oftener, who will pay such sums into one of the Banks to the credit of the Municipality.

RATES-HOW PAYABLE.

8. All Municipal rates amounting to Ten shillings and upwards may be paid half-yearly; those under Ten shillings to be paid annually; and the Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall, at the commencement of each halfyear, leave with the person liable to pay the same, or at his residence, a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring payment thereof within fourteen days, and shall afterwards apply personally for payment of the same; and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of fourteen days after such application, shall take legal proceedings for its recovery.

DEPASTURING STOCK ON PUBLIC RESERVES.

9. Any person who shall depasture on any Public Reserve belonging to the Guildford Municipal Council any cattle, sheep, horses, or goats, without having obtained a license so to do, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

FEES FOR DEPASTURING STOCK.

DUTIES OF HERDSMEN.

11. Any person herding cattle for other people, and driving or depasturing them on the Guildford Commonage, shall, at the end of every month, fur-nish the Mayor of the Municipality with a correct statement of the number of cattle in his herd, together with the names and addresses of the respective

owners of the same; and any such person failing to comply with this provision shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

RIDING OR DRIVING IN "STIRLING SQUARE."

12. Any person or persons riding or driving horses or cattle on the Recreation Ground or Square, except on the defined carriage drives, or who shall tie any horse to any tree or fence thereon, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, in addition to amends for any damage caused by so doing.

SUFFERING STOCK TO BE AT LARGE.

13. Any person or persons who shall knowingly or carelessly suffer any horse, mare, gelding, foal, bull, ox, cow, heifer, calf, pony, ass, mule, swine, sheep or goats belonging to him, or in his apparent ownership, or in his charge, to be tethered, or to depasture, feed, or roam about, whether attended by a keeper or not, in or upon any street or public thoroughfare, forming a portion of the Municipality, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence, in lieu of the penalty imposed by the 3rd Section of the 39 Vict., No. 19, the following fines, agreeably to the provisions of the aforesaid Section of the said Act :—

Such rates to be charged for each day of twentyfour hours, half-rates only to be charged for less than twelve hours, and no charge to be made for less than three hours.

INSPECTOR OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

14. The Inspector of weights and measures has, by order of the Council under its common seal, been appointed Inspector, Keeper and Examiner of all weights, measures, and balances within the jurisdiction of the Council, and the standard weights and measures are deposited in the office of the Council; and the said Inspector shall demand and receive, by virtue of the Ordinance 3rd William IV., No. 2, Sec. 2, a fee of sixpence for each and every weight and measure compared, whenever such comparison is made at the request of the owner of such weights and measures.

RESISTING MUNICIPAL OFFICERS IN DISCHARGE OF THEIR DUTIES.

15. Any person who shall obstruct or resist any officer appointed by the Council in the discharge of his duty shall, independent of any penalty which he or she may otherwise incur, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

CARTS AND CARRIAGES.

16. Any person residing within the Municipality of Guildford who shall keep and use on any road a carriage, car, cart, waggon, or other vehicle for seven days, without having obtained a license signed by the Collector of the Council, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction any sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every such offence.

Obstructions in Public Streets to be guarded at Night by a Light.

17. When any building material, rubbish, or other things shall be laid, or any hole or excavation shall be made in any of the streets or footpaths within the Municipality, the person depositing or causing such materials or other things to be so laid, or the said hole or excavation to be made, shall at his own expense cause a sufficient light to be placed in a proper place upon or near the same, and continue such light every night from sunset to sunrise during the time such materials, hole, or excavation shall remain; and in case such person shall refuse or neglect so to light and keep lighted such materials and other things as aforesaid, the person so offending shall for every such offence forfeit and pay, upon conviction, any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

BATHING AT PROHIBITED HOURS.

18. Any person bathing at or near any public jetty, bridge, or ferry, within the Municipality, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., without a proper bathing dress, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

LIGHTING UNGUARDED FIRES.

19. Any person lighting any unguarded fire, or burning any straw, wood, or rubbish, within the boundary of the Municipality of Guildford, between the first day of October and the thirty-first day of March, both inclusive, of each year, without having obtained permission from the Council so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

STACKING HAY, STRAW, &C., &C.

20. Any person stacking any straw, hay, or other inflammable material, within fifty feet of any house or other such building, and who shall not remove the same within forty-eight hours after notice so to do is given by the Council, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

DISCHARGING FIREARMS.

21. Any person who shall, during the day-time, discharge any firearm within the boundaries of the Municipality, without having the written consent of the Mayor, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings.

OVERHANGING ROOFS TO HAVE PROPER GUTTERING.

22. Any occupier or owner of any house, shop, store, or other building, within the town boundary, whose roof shall overhang or project over any thoroughfare or footway, without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or who shall construct or have any cornice, crane, or hoists, or any other fixture or projection overhanging any footway or thoroughfare, without the sanction of the Council, and who shall neglect to abate and remove such nuisance within 14 days after being required, in writing, by the Mayor or his deputy to do so, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
