Order made by the Administrator in Executive Council under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44th Victoria, No. 5).

WHEREAS an Order duly made under the provisions of the Second Section of the 44th Vic., No. 5, is now in force, forbidding any person to land or introduce into the Colony any Grape Vine or any portion thereof from any of the Australian Colonies, and it is expedient that the operation of such Order should be limited as hereinafter mentioned, I, Sir MALCOLM FRASER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by this Order made in Executive Council in pursuance of the said Act do direct and declare that it shall at any time during the six calendar months next after the date of the publication hereof in the Government Gazette of Western Australia be lawful for any person to land or introduce into the Colony any Grape Vine cuttings being the produce of the Province of South Australia, any previous order to the contrary notwithstanding.

ALTERATION IN SAILING DIRECTIONS, JOHNSTONE RIVER.

N proceeding up the River, a mid-channel course should be steered, until a sand spit on the starboard hand (which is marked by two white beacons) is rounded. The right-hand bank should then be kept on board until abreast of a large white triangular beacon standing on a clearing, from whence a smaller white triangular beacon on south shore is seen, showing the opening between mainland and the Banana Island. Then, steering for opening, the mainland must be kept well aboard until the township is neared, when a vessel may anchor or haul alongside the wharf.
