BY-LAW No. 6, IN LIEU OF EXISTING BY-LAW No. 6.

To repeal By-Law No. 6 of the Council of the City of Perth, and to make further provision to prevent the mischief arising from fires in chimney flues, and other places within the City of Perth; as also to regulate the means for extinguishing the same.

1. Whereas by an Act of the Governor and Legis-lative Council of Western Australia, 40 Vic., No. 13, intituled "An Act to amend 'The Municipal Insti-tutions Act, 1871,'" power is given to the Council of the City of Perth to make such by-laws and regulations as to them shall seem meet, to enforce the taking of proper precautions against fires, and of proper means to extinguish the same, as also for the general good rule and government of the Municipality; and whereas great danger to life and pro-perty by reason of fire arises from chimney flues being suffered to become foul, and it is necessary that the same be guarded against in future: Be it ordered and directed by the Council of the City of Perth that the occupier of any premises within the said City, whereof any chimney flue shall take fire, shall, on conviction thereof before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten shillings.

2. And whereas great danger to life and property, by reason of fire, arises from the practice of allowing the accumulation of dangerous quantities of shavings, sawdust, straw, paper shavings, and other inflammable materials upon and in the yards, ways, and other premises within the said City: Beit ordered and directed by the Council of the City of Perth that, if after one week's notice given by the Supervisor for the said City, upon the order of the Council under the hand of the Mayor, and served upon the occupier, owner, or agent of the premises, such inflammable materials (being in dangerous quantities as aforesaid) shall not be removed, then the said occupier, owner, or agent shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law, and, on conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

3. And whereas it is necessary that proper means be adopted for extinguishing fires which may occur within the City, and to facilitate the extinguishing of such fires: Be it further ordered and directed that the Superintendent for the time being of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade shall at any fire have the command of the brigade or brigades engaged, and also of all appliances employed in extinguishing such fire. That the said Superintendent shall be empowered to enter upon or through any premises whilst in the execution of his duties, and to direct the action of the brigades engaged through or upon such premises. The Superintendent shall be empowered further to take water, either from tanks, reservoirs, or wells nearest or most convenient to the fire, and otherwise to do any other matter or thing which he shall deem expedient for the purposes aforesaid.

That the said Superintendent shall be authorised to employ such persons to assist the brigades in extinguishing fires as he may deem necessary. That the said Superintendent is hereby authorised to recover the expenses actually incurred by the brigade or brigades employed at any fire from the owner or occupier of such premises, any sum or sums not exceeding those mentioned in the Schedule hereunto annexed, such charges being recoverable by action in the Local Court of the said City.
