WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 17 of 1890, VV issued from this Department on the 30th May last, it now further notified that, on and after the 24th instant, there will be exhibited, from the highest part of Booby Island a Second Order Dioptric Revolving Light, flashing at intervals of one minute.
