SIR,

5th June, 1890.

I have the honor to inform you, for the information of His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, that I arrived on my Station on the 18th May; and have since been employed, in Her Majesty's ship under my command, in determining the position of Cartier Island, and certain geographical positions between Troughton Island and Adele Island, as a basis for the survey of the inner route, along the North-West coast of Australia, which His Excellency is aware has been undertaken by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

- 2.—My head quarters on the Surveying ground is an uninhabited island near Condillac, in Latitude 14° 7′ 47″ S., Longitude 125° 35′ 43″ E. (approximate), called Baudin Island.
- 3.—In compliance with my instructions, I shall be surveying in the neighbourhood of Cape Bougainville, and Cape Voltaire (including the Holothuria banks), during the next 5 months.

IIIS Excellency the Administrator directs the publication of the following particulars as to the qualifications of voters, for general information.

That the enactments as to the requisite qualifications for persons claiming to be registered under "The Electoral Act, 1889," are not contained in that Act, but are contained in the 39th and 40th Sections of "The Constitution Act, 1889," which Sections are as follows:—

- 39. Every man shall be entitled to be registered as a voter, and when registered to vote for a member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for an electoral district, who is qualified as follows (that is to say):—
 - (1.) Is of full age and not subject to any legal incapacity; and
 - (2.) Is a natural-born or naturalised subject of Her Majesty, or a denizen of Western Australia; and
 - (3.) Has possessed for at least one year before being registered, and within the electoral district for which he seeks to be registered:
 - (a.) Either a freehold estate in possession at law or in equity of the clear value of One hundred pounds sterling above all charges or incumbrances affecting the same; or
 - (b.) A leasehold estate in possession of the clear value of Ten pounds sterling per annum; or
 - (c.) A lease or license from the Crown empowering him, subject to the payment of at least Ten pounds sterling per annum, to depasture, occupy, cultivate, or mine upon Crown lands; or
 - (4.) Has occupied for at least one year before being registered, and within the electoral district for which he seeks to be registered:
 - (a.) As householder a dwelling house of the clear value of Ten pounds sterling per annum; or
 - (b.) As a lodger a room or rooms or lodgings of the clear annual value, unfurnished, of Ten pounds sterling.

No man shall be entitled to vote at any election for the Legislative Assembly, or for the Legislative Council when constituted under Part III. of this Act, who has been attainted or convicted of treason, felony, or any infamous offence in any part of Her Majesty's dominions unless he shall have served his sentence for the same, or have received a free pardon for such offence, or a pardon conditional on his not leaving the Colony.

40. Where any premises are jointly owned, occupied, or held on lease or license within the meaning of the last preceding section, or of section fifty-three after Part III. of this Act shall be in operation, by more persons than one, each of such joint owners, occupiers, leaseholders, or licensees shall be entitled to be registered as a voter, and to

vote in respect of the said premises in case the value of his individual interest therein, separately considered, would, under the provisions of the last preceding section, or of section fifty-three, entitle him to be registered as a voter and to vote.

IS Excellency the Administrator directs it to be notified that he has received from the Right Honorable Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies a Circular Despatch, dated the 27th May, 1890, transmitting for publication in this Colony a Copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 1st of May, 1890, for carrying into effect an arrangement concluded on the 31st of December, 1889, between the Government of Her Majesty and the Government of the French Republic, acting in the name of His Highness the Bey of Tunis, for extending to Tunis the provisions of the Treaty between Her Majesty and the President of the French Republic, dated the 14th of August, 1876, for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive

It will be observed that the Treaty came into operation on the 16th May, 1890.

EXTRADITION TREATY: GREAT BRITAIN, FRANCE, AND TUNIS.

At the Court at Windsor, the 1st day of May, 1890.

Present:

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

Lord President. Earl of Coventry. Earl of Limerick.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with and foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, between Her Majesty and The President of the French Republic, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty the above-mentioned Acts of Parliament were applied by an Order in Council of the sixteenth of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight:

And whereas an Arrangement was concluded on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, between the Government of Her Majesty and the Government of the French Republic, acting in the name of the Government of His Highness the Bey of Tunis, for extending the provisions of the said Treaty of August 14, 1876, to Tunis, which Arrangement is in the terms following:—

The Government of Her Britannic Majesty on the one part, and the Government of the French Republic, acting in the name of the Government of His Highness the Bey of Tunis, on the other part, with a view to insure as far as possible the arrest and delivery to the competent jurisdiction of criminals who seek to escape by flight from the action of justice, have agreed as follows:—

The provisions of the Anglo-French Convention of the fourteenth August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, are extended to Tunis, except that the period of fourteen days, stipulated by Article IX of the said Convention, is prolonged to two months.

The present Arrangement shall have the same duration as the Convention of Extradition to which it relates.

In witness whereof the Undersigned his Excellency the Earl of Lytton, Her Britannic Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, and his Excellency M. Spuller, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the French Republic, have prepared the present Arrangement, and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done at Paris, the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Tunis in conformity with the said Arrangement with the French Republic.

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered that the operation of the said Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to Tunis and to the said Arrangement, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.
