NEW CHANNEL, UPPER END CENTRAL

ISLAND.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a New Channel has opened out near the Upper End of Central Island, carrying 7 feet at low-water spring tides.

By Night.—In passing the Upper End of Central Island keep the two white leading lights, which will open out on the South, in a line; this will lead 60 feet from the Upper End of Central Island and 200 feet clear of Hawk Point. Vessels must be careful not to get above the line of the two white lights in passing the end of Central Island. A black buoy is laid 300 yards below the line of Lights.

By Day.—The beacons upon which the lights are exhibited are to be kept in line.

The Old Channel will be kept buoyed and lighted as heretofore for a fortnight.

IIS Excellency the Administrator has been pleased to approve the following By-Laws passed by the Ashburton Roads Board, relative to the depasturing of Cattle, Sheep, &c., on the Commonage lands.

JOHN FORREST,

Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. That the sum of £1 per head per annum be charged for all cattle and horses up to 12 head running on the Commonage, and £1 10s. per head per annum if they exceed that number; the total number allowed not to be over 20 head, the property of one owner.

That sheep kept for killing purposes be paid for at the rate of 1s. per head per annum; and sheep kept for other than killing purposes at the rate of 5s. per head per annum. Butchers to be allowed to run not exceeding 250 sheep, for killing purposes; private houses or firms not exceeding 50 head.

That goats be charged for at the rate of 5s. per head per annum; and that no person be allowed to run more than 12 head.

- 2. That it shall be compulsory for all and every owner of stock situated within the Onslow Commonage, and making use of the Commonage, to give a correct list of horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or any other stock he or they intend to run during the year, and to obtain from the Ashburton Roads Board, or the lessee of the Commonage, a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.
- 3. That no stock be kept on the Commonage unless the property of persons residing within the bounds of Onslow or Commonage.
- 4. That all arrears in respect of Commonage fees, remaining unpaid for 3 months after they have become due, shall be sued for by the Board in the Local Court.
- 5. All fees and fines recovered shall be for and on account of the Ashburton Roads Board.
- 6. That the only persons exempt from these rules shall be bonû fide drovers travelling stock, and teams or packers travelling: drovers to be allowed to remain free of charge on the Commonage for not exceeding 24 hours, and teams 1 week, packers 48 hours.

Should they remain over and above the time allowed they are liable to be charged 5s. per head per week for horses and cattle, and 3d. per head per week for sheep.

- 7. That any person running stock on the Commonage may change them at any time irrespective of brands, so long as such person does not exceed the number for which he pays.
- 8. That stray stock from adjoining runs, if proved to be accidentally on the Commonage, shall be liable only to poundage and trespass fees, if at once removed
- 9. That no entire horse or bull, except the property of the Board, be allowed to run permanently on the Commonage.


