II S Excellency the Administrator directs the publication of the Finding of the Court together with the evidence taken—held at Broome, on the 29th ultimo, for the purpose of inquiring into the circumstances attending a casualty that happened to the British barque "Lois," when entering Roebuck Bay, on the morning of Thursday, the 17th ultimo.

Proceedings held at Broome, W.A., inquiring into the casualty to the Barque "Lois," July 29th, 1890.

JOHN STRONACH, sworn, saith: I am master of the Barque "Lois." I anchored the vessel in Gantheaume Bay about noon on the 16th of July, in 8 fathoms at low water, with one Thomas Clarke, of the Cutter "Governor Weld," to assist in navigating the Barque "Lois" into the Port of Broome; having no local Plan Chart of the Port—not being procurable in Newcastle or Sydney, N.S.W.—on board. When anchored in Gantheaume Bay the Gantheaume Point bearing S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., estimated distance about 3 miles. Got the vessel under weigh at 6'30 a.m. on the morning of the 17th July, with light easterly wind; trimmed on the starboard tack at 6'50 a.m. Tacked ship to the Southward, steering to pass Gantheaume Point $\frac{3}{2}$ of a mile to the West of the Point. Lead was constantly kept going by myself during the time I was under weigh. When the vessel had Point Gantheaume bearing E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., the vessel grounded forward and swung round with her head to the Northward, and took amidships on the starboard bilge, struck heavy aft and remained fast for a half hour. Whilst on the reef took cross bearing of extreme point of Gantheaume and Entrance Points, bearing E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. by S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; meanwhile the Cutter "Governor Weld" took sounding round the vessel; no bottom at 12 fathoms; immediately sounded the well and found the vessel making water fast. Flood tide making, ship floated off in about half an hour. Got assistance from the "Governor Weld" to assist in keeping the vessel free. Beached her at noon, with seven feet of water in her hold, off Mangrove Point, in the Port of Broome.

Broome, 17th July, 1890.

I, Thomas Clarke, went on board the barque "Lois," at 10 a.m. on the 16th, off Station Hill, as Pilot for Roebuck Bay. Came to anchor at noon, on the 16th, in 8 fathoms of water; Gantheaume Point bearing South. At 6 a.m. on the 17th weighed anchor, set all sail, and proceeded towards Roebuck Bay, wind moderate from East. At 7:30 a.m., Gantheaume Point bearing East by North half North, distant half a mile, ship struck heavy on a rock and stuck fast for about three quarters of an hour, when she floated off. Sounded pumps, and found her making water very rapidly. Got some aborigines from the "Governor Weld" to assist the ship's crew in pumping. Proceeded towards the anchorage in Roebuck Bay, but found the ship making too much water to keep her afloat with the pumps. Beached the ship to save her from sinking, with Look Out Hill bearing North, seven feet of water in the hold, pumps going all the time since she struck. While the ship was stuck fast on the rock the "Governor Weld" sailed all round, sounding, but could get no bottom at twelve fathoms.

FINDING OF THE COURT.

After hearing the evidence of the Master, Mate, and Second Mate of the Barque " Lois:"

WE are of opinion that the vessel struck about two cables W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. of the $2\frac{1}{4}$ fathom patch, laid down on the plan chart of Port Broome. As the Captain of the Barque "Lois" only had a Coastal Chart, he had no way of verifying his position except of using the lead, which he did.

We exonerate the Master, Mate, and Second Mate from all blame, and return them their Certificates, and think they deserve great credit for the energy they displayed in getting the vessel beached in the position they did.

We wish to draw attention to the loose way in which vessels are allowed to leave for unknown ports, where there are no pilots available, without proper charts.
