LETTERS PATENT passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies.

Dated 25th August, 1890.

Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India: To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting

WHEREAS We did, by certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the Seventeenth ^{Preamble.} day of November 1877, in the Forty-first year of Our Reign, constitute, order, and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Recites Letters Patent of 17th Western Australia and its Dependencies (as therein described), and that the person who office of Governor. should fill the said office should be appointed by Commission under our Sign Manual and Signet:

And whereas an alteration in the Constitution of the said Colony has been effected Recites Imperial Act 53 and 54 Vict., ch. 26. by the Western Australia Constitution Act, 1890:

Now We do by these presents revoke Our said recited Letters Patent, but without Revokes said Letters Patent. prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

II. We do declare that there shall be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, extending from the parallel of thirteen degrees thirty minutes south latitude, to West Cape Howe in the parallel of thirty-five degrees eight minutes south latitude, and from the Hartogs Island, Boundaries. on the Western Coast, in longitude one hundred and twelve degrees fifty-two minutes to one hundred and twenty-nine degrees of east longitude, reckoning from the meridian of Greenwich, including all the islands adjacent in the Indian and Southern Oceans within the latitudes aforesaid of thirteen degrees thirty minutes south, and thirty-five degrees eight minutes south, and within the longitudes aforesaid of one hundred and twelve degrees fifty-two minutes, and one hundred and twenty-nine degrees east from the said meridian of Greenwich (which said Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies are herein-after called the Colony), and that appointments to the said office shall be made by Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet.

We do hereby authorize, empower, and command Our said Governor and Commander-in-Chief (herein-after called the Governor) to do and execute all things _{Governor's powers and autho-} that belong to his said office, and to exercise the powers and authorities vested in him ^{rities.} by the above recited Act, or by any other Act adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, or by these our Letters Patent and by such Commission as may be issued to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Colony.

IV. We do also by these Our Letters Patent declare Our Will and pleasure as follows: V. Every person appointed to fill the office of Governor shall, with all due solemnity, before entering on any of the duties of his office, cause the Commission appointing him to be Governor to be read and published at the seat of Government, in the

presence of the Chief Justice or some other Judge of the Supreme Court of the Colony, and of the Members of the Executive Council thereof, which being done, he shall then Oaths to be taken by Governor. and there take before them the Oath of Allegiance in the form provided by an Act passed in the Session holden in the Thirty-first and Thirty-second years of Our Reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Law relating to Promissory Oaths;" and likewise the usual Oath for the due execution of the office of Governor, and for the due and impartial administration of justice; which Oaths the said Chief Justice or Judge is hereby required to administer.

> VI. The Governor shall keep and use the Public Seal of the Colony for sealing all things whatsoever that shall pass the said Public Seal.

> VII. There shall be an Executive Council for the Colony, and the said Council shall consist of such persons as are now Members thereof or may at any time be Members thereof in accordance with any Law enacted by the Legislature of the Colony, and of such other persons as the Governor shall, from time to time, in Our name and on Our behalf, but subject to any Law as aforesaid, appoint under the Public Seal of the Colony to be Members of Our said Executive Council.

> VIII. The Governor, in Our name and on Our behalf, may make and execute under the said Public Seal, grants and dispositions of lands within the Colony, subject to the laws in force for the time being for regulating the sale or disposal of Crown lands.

> The Governor may constitute and appoint, in Our name and on Our behalf, all IX. such Judges, Commissioners, Justices of the Peace, and other necessary Officers and Ministers in the Colony, as may be lawfully constituted or appointed by Us.

> When any crime has been committed within the Colony, or for which the offender may be tried therein, the Governor may, as he shall see occasion, in Our name and on Our behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender, or of any one of such offenders, if more than one; and further, may grant to any offender convicted in any Court, or before any Judge, or other Magistrate within the Colony, a pardon either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence for such period as the Governor thinks fit; and further may remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures due or accrued to Us. Provided always that the Governor shall in no case, except where the offence has been of a political nature unaccompanied by any other grave crime, make it a condition of any pardon or remission of sentence that the offender shall absent himself or be removed from the Colony.

> XI. The Governor may, so far as We Ourselves lawfully may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, remove from his office, or suspend from the exercise of the same, any person holding any office or place within the Colony, under or by virtue of any Com-mission or Warrant or other Instrument granted, or which may be granted, by Us or in Our name, or under Our authority.

> XII. The Governor may exercise all powers lawfully belonging to Us in respect of the summoning, proroguing, or dissolving any Legislative Body, which now is or hereafter may be established within the Colony, and in respect of the appointment of Members thereto.

> XIII. In the event of the office of the Governor becoming vacant, or of the Governor being incapable, or of his departure from the Colony, Our Lieutenant Governor, or if there be no such Officer in the Colony, then such person or persons as We may appoint under Our Sign Manual and Signet, shall, during Our pleasure, administer the Govern-ment of the Colony, first taking the Oaths herein-before directed to be taken by the Governor and in the manner herein prescribed; which being done, We do hereby authorize, empower, and command Our Lieutenant Governor, and every other such Administrator as aforesaid, to do and execute, during Our pleasure, all things that belong to the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief, according to the tenor of these Our Letters Patent, and according to Our Instructions as aforesaid, and the Laws of the Colony.

XIV. In the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a Governor may appoint Deputy XIV. In the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a during his temporary absence short period from the seat of Government or from the Colony, he may in every such case, from seat of Government. by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Colony, constitute and appoint Our Lieuby an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Colony, constitute and appoint Our Lieutenant Governor, or if there be no such Officer, then any other person, to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by these Our Letters Patent, as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others. Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid, the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected, otherwise than We may at any time hereafter think proper to direct.

XV. And We do hereby require and command all Our Officers and Ministers, Civil Officers and others to obey and and Military, and all other the inhabitants of the Colony, to be obedient, aiding, and assist Governor. assisting unto the Governor or to such person or persons as may from time to time, under the provisions of these Our Letters Patent, administer the Government of the Colony.

XVI. And We do hereby reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, full power Power reserved to Her Majesty and authority from time to time to revoke, alter, or amend these Our Letters Patent as to revoke, alter, or amend pres-ent Letters Patent. to Us or them shall seem meet.

XVII. And We do direct and enjoin that these Our Letters Patent shall be read and Publication of Letters Patent. proclaimed at such place or places within Our said Colony as the Governor shall think fit.

WE do by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet appoint you, the said Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, to be during Our pleasure Our Governor Appointment of Sir W. C. F. and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Western Australia and its Depen- Governor. dencies, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining.

II. And We do hereby authorize, empower, and command you to exercise and perform all and singular the powers and directions contained in Our Letters Patent Recites Letters Patent consti-tuting the office of Governor. under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, constituting the Office of Governor, bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-fifth day of August, 1890, or in any other Our Letters Patent adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, according to such Orders and Instructions as Our Governor for the time being hath already received from Us, and to such further Orders and Instructions as you shall hereafter receive from Us.

And further We do hereby appoint that, so soon as you shall have taken the TTT prescribed oaths, and have entered upon the duties of your office, this Our present Commission to Sir F. N. Commission shall supersede Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, Governor, dated 14th December, bearing date the Fourteenth day of December, 1882, appointing Our Trusty and Wellbeloved Frederick Napier Broome, Esquire, Companion of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George (now Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Knight Commander of Our said Most Distinguished Order), to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Our said Colony and its Dependencies.

IV. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers and loving subjects in Our said Colony and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may Officers and others to give concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

HEREAS Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster, the twenty-fifth day of August, 1890, and in the fifty-fourth year of Her said Majesty's Reign, was pleased to constitute, order, and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies; and that the person who should fill the said office of Governor should be from time to time appointed by Commission, under Her said Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet; AND WHEREAS Her said Majesty was further pleased by a Commission under Her Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date at Balmoral, the twenty-sixth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and in the fifty-fourth year of Her said Majesty's Reign, to appoint me, the said Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the said Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, with all and singular the powers and authorities granted to the Governor of the said Colony in the said above recited Letters Patent; Now THEREFORE it is hereby proclaimed and made known that all and singular the powers and authorities granted in the said Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, dated at Westminster, the twenty-fifth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and ninety. have devolved on me, the said Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said Colony of Western Australia; and having taken the oaths prescribed by law to be taken in that behalf, I have this day assumed the Government of the said Colony, and all and singular Her Majesty's Officers Ministers, and Subjects in the said Colony, and all others whom it may concern, are required to take due notice thereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Governor. Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

HEREAS by the thirty-second section of the Imperial Act passed in the Session holden in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of the reign of Her Present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies," it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor and Legislative Council of Western Australia, from time to time, by any Act or Acts to alter the provisions or laws for the time being in force under the said Act or otherwise concerning the election of the Elective Members of such Legislative Council, and the qualification of Electors and Elective Members, or to establish in the said Colony, instead of the Legislative Council, a Council and a House of Representatives, or other separate Legislative Houses, to consist of such members to be appointed or elected by such persons and in such manner as by such Act or Acts should be determined, and to vest in such Council and House of Representatives, or other separate Legislative Houses, the powers and functions of the Legislative Council for which the same might be substituted; AND WHEREAS in accordance with the powers so granted to them by the said section, the Legislative Council of Western Australia, in the fifty-third year of Her Majesty the Queen passed a certain Bill intitutled "An Act to confer a Constitution on Western Australia, and to grant a Civil List to Her Majesty"; AND WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Imperial Parliament in the fifty-third and fifty-fourth years of Her Majesty the Queen, intituled "An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill conferring a Constitution on Western Australia," wherein the above first-mentioned Bill was included as a Schedule thereto, it was inter alia provided that it should be lawful for Her Majesty by Order-in-Council to assent to the said first mentioned Bill so scheduled as aforesaid, and it was also provided that the said last mentioned Act

and the Order in Council signifying Her Majesty's Assent to the said first mentioned Bill should be proclaimed by the Governor, or other person lawfully Administering the Government of Western Australia, within three months after he had received a copy thereof, and the said last-mentioned Act and the said first-mentioned Bill should (except as provided in section forty-two of the said first-mentioned Bill) take effect in the Colony from the day of such Proclamation; AND WHEREAS Her Most Gracious Majesty did on the 15th day of August, 1890, in accordance with the provisions of the said lastmentioned Act, by Order in Council signify Her Assent to the said first-mentioned Bill; AND WHEREAS I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, have within three months last past received a copy of the last-mentioned Act and of the said Order in Council; Now THERE-FORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Governor as aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation proclaim Her Majesty's assent to the said first-mentioned Bill, and do hereby declare that the said Bill taketh effect (except as to the forty-second section thereof) from this the twenty-first day of October, 1890, being the day of such Proclamation.

Rules for the Conduct of Examinations under "The Licensed Surveyors Act," 50 Vic., No. 6.

HE "Land Surveyors Licensing Board," appointed under the Act 50 Vic., No. 6, to recommend to His Excellency the Governor for appointment fit and proper persons, whose qualifications for the office shall have been satisfactorily ascertained (to be styled "Licensed Surveyors"), have, with the approval of the Governor, made the following rules for the conduct of examinations under the said Act :--

1. Examinations shall take place at Perth in the months of June and December, or at any other time in the discretion of the Board, provided that not less than two weeks notice shall in every case be given in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Each candidate shall give written notice to the President of the Board of his intention to present himself for examination; such notice must be received by the President of the Board not less than seven clear days previous to the date fixed for the examination to commence, and must be accompanied by documentary evidence—

- a. That he is over 21 years of age.
- b. That he is a person of good fame and character.
- c. That he has served for three years with a Surveyor or Surveyors, licensed under this or similar Acts in the Australian Colonies, Tasmania, or New Zealand, or that he has served for four years with a Surveyor or Surveyors of recognised standing in other countries; at least two years of such service shall have been in the field and one year in a Surveyor's office.
- d. That he has served in Western Australia with a Surveyor licensed under this Act, and that he is competent to undertake surveys on his own responsibility; the term of such service shall not be less than six months when the candidate has served his time in one of the Australian Colonies, Tasmania, or New Zealand, and not less than twelve months in other cases.

He must also forward at the same time a plan of a survey made by himself, with the original notes taken by him on the ground. The plan must be in strict accordance with the Rules and Regulations published for the guidance of Surveyors employed in the Surveyor General's Department.

3. A candidate presenting himself for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a set of scales, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.
