WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { GENERAL.

Downing Street, 11th Öctober, 1890.

SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 2nd of July, 1886, respecting the Commercial Treaty with the Republic of Paraguay, I have the honour to acquaint you that the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope having expressed the wish to adhere to the Treaty, but to be exempted from the operation of Article VIII. relating to Military Service, it was proposed to the Government of the Republic who have consented thereto, that all the Colonies mentioned in Article XV., and adhering to the Treaty should be exempted therefrom; and I now transmit to you, for the information of the Colony under your Government, a printed copy of a Declaration signed at Assumption on the 19th of July last, recording the accession of certain of the British Colonies, including that under your Government, to the Treaty in question.

WHEREAS by Article XV of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and his Excellency the President of the Republic of Paraguay, signed on the 16th October, 1884, the ratifications whereof were exchanged on the 10th May, 1886, provision was made for the accession to the said Treaty of certain was made for the accession to the said Treaty of certain British Colonies; and whereas the Government of Para-guay have agreed that any of the said British Colonies may accede under the condition that, notwithstanding such accession, they shall not be bound by the stipulations of Article VIII of the said Treaty, the Undersigned, his Excellency Francis John Packenham, Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary to the Republic of Paraguay, and his Excellency Juan Crisostomo Centurion, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Paraguay. 2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras and Bombay, by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

3. The Calcutta Remount Depôt will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st of October, 1891, to the end of the purchasing season. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.

4. Horses and marces of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, and in the case of Australian horses 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high.

5. Greys will not be purchased for Horse and Field Artillery.

6 The average price for an Australian or Cape remount has been fixed at Rs. 650, which will be paid at the Indian port of purchase. The average price for Arabs and Persians is Rs. 550, but every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given provided that the averages fixed above are not exceeded.

In order to meet modern requirements, and to fit boys for Colonial life or for mercantile pursuits, it has been decided to make the study of dead languages optional. Parents of boys may however feel not less sure than heretofore of finding thorough classical instruction for their sons. The University Exhibitions, open for competition throughout the Colony, have in each case been awarded to a High School boy.

Scriptural instruction is given, out of school hours, to boys whose parents or guardians wish them to receive it.

Fees.

The present scale of fees is as follows :----

- For each boy over 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £3 6s. 8d. per term.
- For each boy under 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £2 13s. 4d. per term.
- In the case of two or more brothers attending the school, a reduction of 10 per cent. will be allowed in the fees for tuition.
- The fees for each resident boarder are at the rate of £60 per annum for a boy over 12 years of age, and £50 per annum under 12 years, inclusive of the tuition fee.

Boys are received from the age of eight years and upwards.

Scholarships.

There are two High School Scholarships of the annual value of £50, open to competition by boys from any of the Elementary Schools.

Terms and Vacations.

The year is divided into 3 terms, with vacations of 6 weeks at Christmas; 1 week at Easter, during which it is optional for boarders to remain at the School without additional charge; and 5 weeks at Midwinter.

The School reassembles for the September term this day.
