Sir,

Downing Street, 27th August, 1890.

I have the honour to transmit to you the Act "to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill "conferring a Constitution on Western Australia," together with the Order in Council declaring Her Majesty's assent to the scheduled Bill; and it is the hope of Her Majesty's Government that this measure will be found to secure the prosperity and good government of the Colony.

- 2. The measure was subjected to a very careful examination by a Select Committee of the House of Commons, before whom the Delegates from the Colony gave very valuable and useful evidence, and by whom you were yourself examined. The proceedings of this Committee have already been forwarded to the Colony, and the exhaustive nature of the inquiry, as also the subsequent discussions in Parliament, will have demonstrated effectively the great interest taken in this country in the introduction of Responsible Government into Western Australia.
- 3. It is unnecessary for me to enter into any detailed statement respecting the provisions of this Act, and I need only draw attention to the omission of the clause of the Bill by which it was proposed that the lands North of the 26° of S. Latitude should be subject to regulations passed with the sanction of the Home Government. You are aware that much objection was raised in this country to placing under the control of the present small population of the Colony the whole of the vast territory comprised within its boundaries, and with the view of meeting this objection, which at one time appeared likely to endanger the passing of the Bill, the clause to which I have referred was framed with the concurrence of the Colonial Legislature, so as to reserve to Her Majesty's Government a control over the disposal of the lands in the Northern and less inhabited districts.
- 4. Parliament, however, has decided that the new Legislature shall have complete control of the whole of the lands of Western Australia, and expunged the clause. I feel confident that the full reliance thus shown in the good sense of the Colonists to administer the trust thus reposed in them with judgment in the present, with full regard to the interests of future generations, will not have been misplaced; and it only remains for me to wish to Western Australia, in this and every other branch of public affairs, continuous and rapid progress.
- 5. It will be your duty, on receipt of this Despatch, to issue a Proclamation under Section 7 of the Act, in order that the Act and Scheduled Bill may take effect in the Colony.

I have the honour to transmit to you new Letters Patent and Instructions which, in consequence of the change in the Constitution, Her Majesty has been advised to issue for Western Australia, together with your Commission as Governor under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet.

- 2. In the Letters Patent the only change of any consequence beyond the omission of the clause relating to the issue of Marriage Licenses and Probate of Wills, is in the clause providing for the Executive Council, the appointments to which are, subject to any Law of the Colony, placed entirely in the hands of the Governor. It is no longer thought necessary to state that the Members hold their places at Her Majesty's pleasure; but the power of removing a Member, should occasion arise, is vested in the Governor and included in the general powers conferred by the 9th clause of the Letters Patent.
- 3. The Royal Instructions have been simplified in language throughout, and made shorter by the omission, not only of clauses which are unsuited to the conditions of a Colony under Responsible Government, but also by the omission of clauses relating to matters of detail in legislation and in the keeping of records which, although necessary to the proper conduct of Government, are not of sufficient importance to be retained in Instructions passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet. Your Ministers, to whom you will be good enough to communicate this Despatch, will doubtless do what is necessary to enable you to comply with the wishes of Her Majesty's Government in these respects.
- 4. It is expedient, as a matter of convenience to the Secretary of State, in dealing with the Laws sent home for consideration, as well as one of practical importance to the Colony affected by such Laws, that each different matter should be dealt with in a separate Law, so that things which have no proper relation to each other should not be intermixed in one and the same Law, and that no clause be inserted in any Law which is foreign to what the title of such Law imports, and that no perpetual clause be part of any temporary Law.
- 5. It is also desirable that all Laws transmitted by you should be fairly abstracted in the margins; and be accompanied with a Report by the Attorney General, and in such cases as appear to you to require it, with statements explanatory of the reasons for passing such Laws.
- 6. You will continue to transmit, for my information and that of other Departments of the Public Service and for record in this Office, a sufficient number of copies of the Journals and Minutes of the Proceedings of both Houses of the Legislature, and of such Annual Returns as have been ordinarily transmitted relative to the Revenue and Expenditure, Defence, Public Works, Legislation, Civil Establishments, Population, Schools, Imports and Exports, Agriculture, Manufactures, and other Statistics of the state and condition of the Colony.
- 7. In conclusion, it is right that I should allude to the clause which directs the Governor to protect and care for the persons and property of the native inhabitants of the Colony. This clause is now omitted, for the Governor in these matters no longer acts independently of his Ministers, except in so far as he is empowered to do so by "The Aborigines Act, 1889." But I feel sure that to secure the well-being of the natives will be the object not only of yourself but of your Ministers, and that all the influence which you can exercise will be directed to ensure their welfare and to provide that they shall obtain their equal rights before the Law.

Downing Street, 24th July, 1890.

I have the honor to transmit to you, for the information of the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Act passed in the present session of Parliament entitled "An Act to amend the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to Load Line," and I would suggest the advisability of steps being taken to carry out its provisions, which, it will be observed from section 3, will not apply in the case of a ship registered in a British Possession until the expiration of twelve months after the passing of the Act (9th June, 1890).

I transmit also a copy of a memorandum on the Act drawn up by the Board of Trade; and I have further to refer you to the Report of the Load Line Committee to the President of the Board of Trade, with Tables of Freeboard for the various types of steam and sailing vessels; a copy of which accompanied the Board of Trade "Instructions to Surveyors" enclosed in my circular despatch of the 29th of January, 1886.

A.D. 1890.

An Act to amend the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to Load-line.

[9th Fune, 1890.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Compulsory marking of Load Line.

- 1. The Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, shall, from and after the expiration of six months after the passing of this Act, be construed as if in the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh sections thereof the following sub-section were inserted instead of the sub-sections numbered (2) in those sections respectively:
 - "(2.) The centre of this disc shall be placed at such level below the deck-line marked under the provisions of this Act as may be approved by the Board of Trade, and shall indicate the maximum load-line in salt water to which it shall be lawful to load the ship."

Provided that the position of the disc shall be fixed in accordance with the tables framed by the Load Line Committee appointed before the passing of this Act, subject to such allowance as may be made necessary by any difference between the position of the deck-line marked under the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, and the position of the line from which freeboard is measured under the said tables, and subject also to such modifications, if any, of the tables and the application thereof as may from time to time be sanetioned by the Board of Trade.

In sanctioning any such modifications the Board of Trade shall have regard to any representations which may be made to them by any corporation or association for the survey or registry of shipping for the time appointed or approved by the Board of Trade for the

Regulations.

- 2.—(1.) The Board of Trade shall appoint the Committee of Lloyd's Register of British and Foreign Shipping, or, at the option of the owner of the ship, any other corporation or association for the survey or registry of shipping, approved by the Board of Trade, or any officer of the Board of Trade specially selected by the Board for that purpose, to approve and certify on their behalf from time to time the position of any such disc as aforesaid, and any alteration thereof, and may appoint fees to be taken in respect of any such approval or certificate.
 - (2.) The Board of Trade may make regulations—
 - (a) determining the lines or marks to be used in connexion with the disc, in order to indicate the maximum load-line under different circumstances and at different seasons, and declaring that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, are to have effect as if any such line were drawn through the centre of the disc;

- (b) as to the mode in which the disc and the lines or marks to be used in connexion A.D. 1890. therewith are to be marked or affixed on the ship, whether by painting, cutting,
- (c) as to the mode of application for, and form of certificates under this Act; and
- (d) requiring the entry of such certificates, and other particulars as to the draught of water and freeboard of the ship, in the official log-book of the ship, or other publication thereof on board the ship, and as to delivering copies of such entries.

All such regulations shall, while in force, have effect as if enacted by this Act.

3. Where the legislature of any British possession by any enactment provides for the Provision as to fixing, marking, and certifying of load-lines on ships registered in that possession, and it colonial ships. appears to Her Majesty the Queen that the provisions of that enactment are based on the same principles as the provisions of this Act, and are equally effective for ascertaining and determining the maximum load-lines to which such ships can be safely loaded in salt water, and for giving notice of the load-line to persons interested, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to declare that any load-line fixed and marked and any certificate given in pursuance of that enactment shall, with respect to ships so registered, have the same effect as if it had been fixed, marked, or given in pursuance of this Act.

Sections one and two of this Act shall not apply in the case of a ship registered in a British possession until the expiration of twelve months after the passing of this Act.

4. Where the Board of Trade certify that the laws and regulations for the time being in force in any foreign state with respect to overloading and improper loading are equally foreign ships. effective with the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts with respect thereto, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to direct that, on proof of a ship of that state having complied with those laws and regulations, she shall not, when in a port of the United Kingdom, be liable to detention for non-compliance with the said provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts, nor shall there arise any liability to any penalty which would otherwise arise for non-compliance with those provisions.

Provided that this section shall not apply in the case of ships of any foreign country in which it appears to Her Majesty that corresponding provisions are not extended to British ships.

5. For the purposes of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, as amended by this Act, the expression "amidships" shall mean the middle of the length of the load water-line as "emidships." measured from the fore side of the stem to the aft side of the stern-post.

6. This Act may be cited as the Merchant Shipping Act, 1890.

Short title

MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1890.

Under sections 26 and 27 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, it is provided that every British ship shall have marked on each of her sides amidships a circular disc, twelve inches in diameter, with a horizontal line, eighteen inches in length, drawn through its centre, "the centre of the disc to indicate the maximum load line in salt water to which the owner intends to load the ship (Sub-sec. 2)."

A statement, in writing, of the distance, in feet and inches, between the centre of the disc and the upper edge of each of the lines indicating the position of the ship's decks which is above that centre is required to be handed to the Collector or other Principal Officer of Customs, and the Master of the ship is required to enter a copy of the statement in the Agreement with the crew and also in the official Log

Under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1890, an alteration has been made in the requirements of sub-section 2 of section 26 and 27 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, the sub-section now reading as follows, viz.:-

> (2) "The centre of this disc shall be placed at such level below the deck line marked "under the provisions of this Act as may be approved by the Board of Trade, and shall "indicate the maximum load line in salt water to which it shall be lawful to load the ship."

Provided that the position of the disc shall be fixed in accordance with the Tables framed by the Load Line Committee in 1885, subject to certain conditions set forth in section 1 of the Act in question.

Under section 2 of the Act in question, the Board of Trade are empowered to appoint the Committee of Lloyd's Register, or, at the option of the owner of the ship, any other Corporation or Association for the survey or registry of shipping approved by the Board of Trade, &c., to approve and certify on their behalf from time to time the position of such disc as aforesaid and any alteration thereof.

Since the report of the Load Line Committee in 1885, Load Lines in accordance with the Tables in that report have been assigned to a considerable number of British Ships by the Committee of Lloyd's. The Board of Trade have not, as yet, authorised the assignment of freeboards by any other Association or Corporation, nor have any regulations, as yet, been issued as to the form of disc or discs to be used, or the manner in which the requirements of sub-section 2 of section 2 are to be carried out.

A copy of the Report and Tables of the Load Line Committee is also attached.

In order to meet modern requirements, and to fit boys for Colonial life or for mercantile pursuits, it has been decided to make the study of dead languages optional. Parents of boys may however feel not less sure than heretofore of finding thorough classical instruction for their sons. The University Exhibitions, open for competition throughout the Colony, have in each case been awarded to a High School boy.

Scriptural instruction is given, out of school hours, to boys whose parents or guardians wish them to receive it.

Fees.

The present scale of fees is as follows:-

For each boy over 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £3 6s. 8d. per term.

For each boy under 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £2 13s. 4d. per term.

In the case of two or more brothers attending the school, a reduction of 10 per cent. will be allowed in the fees for tuition.

The fees for each resident boarder are at the rate of £60 per annum for a boy over 12 years of age, and £50 per annum under 12 years, inclusive of the tuition fee.

Boys are received from the age of eight years and upwards.

Scholarships.

There are two High School Scholarships of the annual value of £50, open to competition by boys from any of the Elementary Schools.

Terms and Vacations.

The year is divided into 3 terms, with vacations of 6 weeks at Christmas; 1 week at Easter, during which it is optional for boarders to remain at the School without additional charge; and 5 weeks at Midwinter.

The present term at the High School will end on Wednesday, the 17th instant, and the next term will begin on Saturday morning, January 31st, 1891, at 9 o'clock.

New boys will be expected to attend for the purpose of examination at 2 p.m. the preceding day.

It would be a convenience if parents, who intend to send boarders, would communicate with the Head Master at an early date.
