PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, } By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered by proclamation to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name the same and define the boundaries thereof; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare that portion of the Colony comprised within the boundaries of the Yilgarn Goldfield, and inclusive of "Southern Cross" and "Knutsford" Townsites, to be a Magisterial District, under the name of the "Yilgarn Magisterial District":—

The boundaries of the York, Toodyay, and Victoria Magisterial Districts, respectively, are hereby amended in so far as they are affected by the boundaries of the Yilgarn Magisterial District as hereinbefore described.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this 19th day of January, 1891.
