Hydrographic Remarks

Affecting Admiralty Chart No. 1047, corrected IX., 88, Cape Ford to Buccaneer Archipelago.

The Holothuria Banks are situated 6 to 7 miles West of the position assigned to them on the published chart. There is no reef of rocks, as represented, between the parallels of 13° 17′ S. and 13° 25′ S. North of the reef marked "Breaks," which is properly in Latitude 13° 26′ 5″ S., Longitude 125° 54′ 30″ E., the soundings show from 8 to 19 fathoms, sand and coral bottom, as far North as 13° 7′ S.; the point of the bank being in the meridian of 126° 10′ E. The reef marked "Breaks" is seldom visible except in strong winds.

A Shoal has been found with 7 fathoms over it, coral bottom, in Latitude 13° 7′ S., Longitude 125° 59′ E., which has not yet been completely examined. There may be less water.

CAUTION.—The water on and around the Holothuria Banks is extremely thick. Great caution is required in the navigation, as the tides are strong, and, even on the shallowest spots, the water does not break except in strong winds.

When navigating between Port Darwin or Cambridge Gulf and Southern Ports, the best parallel on which to cross the Holothuria Banks is Latitude 13° 15′ S. Daylight should be chosen.

Captain Jameison, of the s.s. "Otway," states that he struck upon a small coral bank in Latitude 14° 1′ S., Longitude 125° 21′ E.

The "Penguin" searched for this danger without success.

Pending further examination, it is recommended that the locality be avoided.

The Montalivet Islands are 4 miles to the South and 3 miles to the East of the position assigned to them on the published Charts.

Affecting Chart No. 1048, corrections XII., 88, Buccaneer Archipelago to Bedout Island.

A cast of ? fathoms, sand bottom, was obtained in latitude 16° 43′ S., longitude 121° 37′ E. There may be less water; but no danger was seen from the masthead. It seems probable that the Baleine Bank may be incorrectly placed on the chart.

Affecting Chart No. 1055, corrections VII., 88, Bedout Island to Cape Cuvier.

The alleged position of the "Strathmore" Rock was passed over by the "Penguin," on a day peculiarily favorable for seeing a danger of this description. Nothing was seen from the masthead.

Cape Cuvier, about which there has been some doubt, was found to be placed in its correct position on the published Chart.

In order to meet modern requirements, and to fit boys for Colonial life or for mercantile pursuits, it has been decided to make the study of dead languages optional. Parents of boys may however feel not less sure than heretofore of finding thorough classical instruction for their sons. The University Exhibitions, open for competition throughout the Colony, have in each case been awarded to a High School boy.

Scriptural instruction is given, out of school hours, to boys whose parents or guardians wish them to receive it.

The present scale of fees is as follows:-

For each boy over 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £3 6s. 8d. per term.

For each boy under 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £2 13s. 4d. per term.

In the case of two or more brothers attending the school, a reduction of 10 per cent. will be allowed in the fees for tuition.

The fees for each resident boarder are at the rate of £60 per annum for a boy over 12 years of age, and £50 per annum under 12 years, inclusive of the tuition fee.

Boys are received from the age of eight years and upwards.

Scholarships.

There are two High School Scholarships of the annual value of £50, open to competition by boys from any of the Elementary Schools.

Terms and Vacations.

The year is divided into 3 terms, with vacations of 6 weeks at Christmas; 1 week at Easter, during which it is optional for boarders to remain at the School without additional charge; and 5 weeks at Midwinter.

The present term at the High School will end on Wednesday, the 17th instant, and the next term will begin on Saturday morning, January 31st, 1891, at 9 o'clock.

New boys will be expected to attend for the purpose of examination at 2 p.m. the preceding day.

It would be a convenience if parents, who intend to send boarders, would communicate with the Head Master at an early date.
