THE following Proclamation, received by His Excellency the Governor from His Excellency Sir ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, K.C.B., the Governor of Tasmania, is published in accordance with the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament (48 & 49 Vict., Cap. 60), intituled "The Federal Council of Australasia Act, 1885.'

By His Excellency Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A PROCLAMATION.

THEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of HEKEAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Victoria, Cap. 60, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Federal Council of Australasia shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of each of the Colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation:

And whereas the present Session of the said Federal Council And whereas the present Session of the said Federal Council has been held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient that the said Federal Council shall be prorogued: Now therefore I, SIR ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief as aforesaid, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me, do, by this my Proclamation, prorogue the said Federal Council.

My Lord, 10th December, 1890.

The English subject, James Randall, having died intestate at La Ensenada de Todos Santos, Lower California, the Civil Judge of that place has issued a summons citing the heirs of the said Mr. Randall, who are supposed to be in Australia, to appear in person, or through their representatives, within eight months from the 18th of October (date of the summons), in order to make good their might. rights.

As there is no Mexican Consul in Australia, and having been instructed to obtain the publication of the summons in that British Colony, I venture to address myself to your Excellency and to ask, if there is no objection to such a course, that the accompanying copy and translation of the summons by the Judge of Lower California may be transmitted to the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in order that it may be sent by the Colonial Office, if thought right, to the proper authorities in Australia for publication, and in order that that summons may thus come to the knowledge of the heirs of the late James Randall.

HIS School was founded in 1876, under Act of Council, 40 Vict., No. 8, the Governors being a Corporation with perpetual succession.

In order to meet modern requirements, and to fit boys for Colonial life or for mercantile pursuits, it has been decided to make the study of dead languages optional. Parents of boys may however feel not less sure than heretofore of finding thorough classical instruction for their sons. The University Exhibitions, open for competition throughout the Colony, have in each case been awarded to a High School boy.

Scriptural instruction is given, out of school hours, to boys whose parents or guardians wish them to receive it.

Fees.

The present scale of fees is as follows:—

For each boy over 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £3 6s. 8d. per term.

For each boy under 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £2 13s. 4d. per term.

In the case of two or more brothers attending the school, a reduction of 10 per cent. will be allowed in the fees for tuition.

The fees for each resident boarder are at the rate of £60 per annum for a boy over 12 years of age, and £50 per annum under 12 years, inclusive of the tuition fee.

Boys are received from the age of eight years and upwards.

Scholarships.

There are two High School Scholarships of the annual value of £50, open to competition by boys from any of the Elementary Schools.

Terms and Vacations.

The year is divided into 3 terms, with vacations of 6 weeks at Christmas; 1 week at Easter, during which it is optional for boarders to remain at the School without additional charge; and 5 weeks at Midwinter.

The present term at the High School will end on Wednesday, the 17th instant, and the next term will begin on Saturday morning, January 31st, 1891, at 9 o'clock.

New boys will be expected to attend for the purpose of examination at 2 p.m. the preceding day.

It would be a convenience if parents, who intend to send boarders, would communicate with the Head Master at an early date.
