By His Excellency Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS SIR ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies, did on the twenty-ninth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, make the following Proclamation, that is to say:—

"THE FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA ACT, 1885."

By His Excellency Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A PROCLAMATION.

I SIR ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim, pursuant to the provisions of "The Federal Council of Australasia Act" (48 and 49 Victoria, Cap. 60), that, having assented in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen to the Bill passed in the Fourth Session of the Federal Council of Australasia, held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, and published with this my Proclamation,—that is to say, "A Bill to facilitate the Recognition in other Colonies of Orders and Declarations of the Supreme Court of any Colony in matters of Lunacy,"—the said Bill has, under and by virtue of Sections Seventeen and Twenty of the said Act, the force of Law as specified in the said Section Twenty.

Given under my hand at Hobart, in Tasmania aforesaid, this twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

AND WHEREAS the Bill in the said Proclamation mentioned is one affecting this Colony of Western Australia:

And whereas it is provided by the 21st section of the Imperial Statute, "The Federal Council of Australasia Act, 1885," that every Act assented to in the first instance shall be proclaimed in any Colony affected thereby:

Now therefore I, Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, G.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that the following Act, passed in the fourth Session of the Federal Council of Australasia, held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, and assented to by the Governor of the Colony of Tasmania in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, has the force of law in the Colony of Western Australia, that is to say:—

"The Australasian Orders in Lunacy Act, 1891,"

and I hereby command all persons to take notice hereof, and to govern themselves accordingly.

AN ACT to facilitate the Recognition in other Colonies of Orders and Declarations of the Supreme Court of any Colony in matters of Lunacy.

[23 January, 1891.]

Preamble

48 and 49 Vic., ch. 60.

FHEREAS the Legislatures of the Colonies of Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania. and Western Australia have, pursuant to the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," referred to the Federal Council the matter relating to the recognition in other Colonies of Orders and Declarations of the Supreme Court of any Colony in matters of Lunacy, for the exercise of Legislative authority thereon:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Federal Council of Australasia, assembled at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

THIS Act may be cited as "The Australasian Orders in Lunacy Act, 1891."

Interpretation.

2. IN this Act—

"Registrar" shall mean and include the Prothonotary, Chief Clerk, Registrar, or other Officer having authority to affix the Seal of the Supreme Court of any Colony.

WHEN any Order or Declaration made by the Supreme Court of any Colony in the exercise of its jurisdiction in Lunacy shall be produced to and a copy thereof deposited with the Registrar

in Lunacy to have like effect in other Colonies

of the Supreme Court of any other Colony, such Order or Declaration shall be sealed with the Seal of the last-mentioned Court and shall have the like force and effect and have the same operation in such other Colony, and every Master, Guardian, Committee, and Receiver acting thereunder shall perform the same duties and be subject to the same liabilities in such other Colony as if such Order or Declaration had been originally made by such last-mentioned Court.

Provided, that a Guardian, Committee, or Receiver appointed under any such Order shall not have or exercise any power or authority in any Colony other than that in which the Order or Declaration was made, until his appointment has been confirmed by the Supreme Court of the Colony in which the power or authority is proposed to be exercised, or a Judge thereof, which confirmation may be granted upon such terms as to the Court or Judge may seem fit, or may be refused.

NO such Order or Declaration shall be sealed as aforesaid until all such stamp duty and other fees, if any, have been paid, and such Certificate of payment, if any, has been produced as would have been payable or required respectively if such Order or Declaration had been originally made by the Supreme Court the Seal whereof is sought to be affixed.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, I assent to this Act.

THE German Government has given notice (dated 25th October, 1890), that the Commander of the German steam vessel "Erlangen" has reported having struck on a sandbank with 15 feet of water over it, lying in the Fairway of Pollard Channel, with Sunday Islet bearing W. \(^3_4\) S. and the largest of the Cockburn Islands N.N.W. \(^1_2\) W.

Approximate position—Lat. 11° 55½′ S.; Long. 143° 21½′ E. Note.—Should the above given position of the sandbank be correct, it would be directly in the track recommended by Captain Blackwood; the line, therefore, showing the track southward of Cockburn reef should be removed from the Admiralty Charts.
