THEREAS under and in pursuance of "The Small Debts Ordinance, 1863," by Proclamation dated the 17th day of February, 1864, the then Governor of the said Colony appointed the last Monday in each and every month as the day for holding the Local Court in the District of Fremantle; And whereas the last Monday in March of the present year is a Public Holiday, and it is expedient for the said month of March to alter the time for holding the said Court in the said District; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said Ordinance, appoint Monday, the 6th day of April proximo, as the day for holding the said Court in the said District, in lieu of Monday, the 30th day of March aforesaid.

THEREAS it is enacted by the 4th section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 12, intituled " An Ordinance for the better Registration " of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of "Western Australia," that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may for the purpose of such Ordinance divide the said Colony into such and so many Registry Districts as he shall think fit, one of them being the Registry District of Perth, and may in like manner by any subsequent Proclamation from time to time alter such division; Now THEREFORE I, Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS Robinson, G.C.M.G., the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, in addition to the districts already proclaimed, that all that portion of the territory of Western Australia known and designated as "The Yilgarn Magisterial District," proclaimed on the 19th day of January, 1891, shall be constituted a Registry District for the purpose of the said Ordinance.

ENTRANCE TO NORTH OR HOWE CHANNEL.

OTICE is hereby given, that the South-East extreme of the North banks has grown to the eastward about one-third of a mile, and a small sand patch with only 18 feet on it at low-water ordinary spring tides, and extending 2 cables S.E. by E. and N.W. by W., has been discovered about a cable to the westward of the line of leading lights. Cape Moreton Lighthouse bears from this Patch S.E. by E. ½ E. easterly.

Vessels using the North Channel must, therefore, be careful not to get to the westward of the line of leading lights when nearing this danger.

GOVERNMENT BONUS.

Golden Valley, Southern Cross, and Parker's Range.

THE Government are prepared to offer a Bonus to such Companies or persons as may be willing to sink a shaft at the following places, viz., Golden Valley, Southern Cross, and Parker's Range, for the purpose of proving the field.

Such shafts to be sunk to a depth of 300 feet, with the view of cutting the shoot of the goldbearing stone at that depth; and to a further depth of 200 feet, at which depth (500 feet) a cross-cut drive to be made from the shaft to the reef.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that an Enumeration of the Population of West-ERN AUSTRALIA will be taken upon Sunday, April 5, 1891; upon which date, also, in addition to the Census of the People, certain particulars relating to Live Stock, &c., in the Colony will be required.

For the purpose of obtaining such information, Printed Forms will be delivered on or before the 4th day of April, 1891, at all habitations and tenements throughout the Colony, and such Returns will be called for on Monday, 6th April, or as soon after that date as practicable.

Public attention is particularly drawn to the following sections of "The Census Act, 1891" (54 Vic., No. 7) :-

Clause 10 (Penalty for non-compliance with Act) use 10 (Penalty for non-compliance with Act):

"Any occupier or person in charge as aforesaid
"who shall refuse or wilfully neglect to fill up,
"to the best of his knowledge or information
"and belief, the form left at his dwelling, or to
"sign and deliver the same, or if any such
"occupier or person being unable to read or
"write shall, on the application of a sub"enumerator or collector, refuse to afford him
"the necessary information for the purpose of
"enabling such sub-enumerator or collector to
"fill up such form on behalf of any such occupier "fill,up such form on behalf of any such occupier "or person, or shall refuse or wilfully neglect to "answer, or untruly answer any inquiry made "by a sub-enumerator or collector, or wilfully "make, sign, or shall deliver, or cause to be "made, signed, or delivered any false return or "statement of any particular in such form, or "shall obstant any newson in the performance "shall obstruct any person in the performance of any duty under this Act, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds."

Clause 13 (Penalty for divulging contents of form):
"If any enumerator, sub-enumerator, collector,
"clerk, or other officer employed by the Super-"intendent of Census shall divulge the contents "of any form, except as required by this Act, "he shall, for every such offence, be liable to a "penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds."

Specimen copies of the forms to be used, also model schedules and instructions showing the manner in which the forms should be filled in, may be seen at any Police Station, and the Police acting as collectors will supply any information or assistance to persons seeking such.
