By-Laws.

1. That no stock whatsoever be allowed to run free of charge on the Commonage, and the following charges shall be payable in respect of the stock mentioned hereafter.

2. That horses and cattle be charged at the rate of twenty shillings per head per annum, for any number not exceeding eight, the bona fide property of any one person or firm, and that no person or firm shall be allowed to run more than eight.

3. That sheep shall not be allowed to run on the Commonage, excepting butchers' sheep kept only for killing purposes, and to the number of one hundred only. The minimum charge for such sheep to be three-pence per head per annum.

4. Goats to be charged at the rate of five shillings per head per annum, and no person or firm to be allowed to run more than six head.

That all stock running on the Commonage, except in accordance with these By-Laws, will be treated as trespassing on the Commonage.

6. That it shall be compulsory for all and every owner of stock, living within the bounds of the Roebourne Municipality or Commonage, and making use of the Commonage, to give a correct list of horses, cattle, sheep and goats, or any other stock he intends running during the year, and to obtain from the Council, or the lessee of the Commonage, a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.

7. That no stock be kept on the Commonage, unless the property of persons residing within the bounds of the Roebourne Municipality or Commonage.

That all arrears in respect of Commonage, 8. remaining unpaid for three months after they have become due, shall be sued for by the Council in the Local Court, and any stock in respect of which such proceedings are taken shall be liable to be seized and sold by order of such Court, to satisfy such arrears and costs of suit.

9. That all owners of stock neglecting to comply with these rules shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, exclusive of costs, in addition to the charges as stated in these By-Laws.

10. That all fees and fines recovered shall be for and on account of the Roebourne Municipality.

That any person or persons running stock on the Commonage may change them at any time, irrespective of brands, so long as such person or persons do not exceed the number for which they pay.

12. That stray stock from adjoining runs, if proved to be accidentally on the Commonage, shall be liable only to poundage and trespass fees if at once removed.

13. That no entire horse, or bull (except the property of the Municipality), be allowed on the Commonage, and any such stock found shall be liable to be destroyed if not removed by the owners after they shall have had notice from the Council.

Plans must be carefully plotted, showing all abutting Locations, all distances shown in links, and Government roads should be colored or shaded " mine," and subdivisional roads " burnt sienna." Allangles and distances must be given and width of all roads shown. Where a portion only of a block is cut up, a connection must be shown on the Plan to the outer boundaries of the original Location; in the event of the size of the block not allowing this to be done, it will be necessary to show on the margin of the plan the entire block plotted to scale, with portion for which Plan is lodged shown thereon.

Stoppage at Pick-up Platforms.

Trains marked thus * will only stop at platforms when required to pick up or set down passengers. Passengers desiring to alight at any of the platforms must give notice to the Guard at the previous Station, in order to prevent their being carried beyond their destination.

The departure of Trains will be delayed or otherwise, under special circumstances, at the discretion of the Commissioner.

Departure or Arrival not Guaranteed.

The Commissioner of Railways does not guarantee the departure or arrival of the Trains at the time stated, nor will the Department be responsible for delay or any consequence arising therefrom.

Periodical Tickets.

Periodical Tickets between all Stations can be obtained on application to the Traffic Manager through Station Masters. They are not available by Special or other Trains than those notified in this Time Table.

Periodical Ticket holders, when travelling by Train, will be required to produce their Tickets when called upon to do so by any of the Officers or Servants of the Commissioner of Railways. A Passenger holding a Periodical Ticket neglecting or refusing to produce or deliver it up for inspection, when so required, must pay the regular fare.

A Periodical Ticket is not transferable; and if any such Ticket be found in the possession of any person to whom it was not issued, who shall attempt to travel therewith, it shall be retained, and absolutely forfeited, unless it shall appear that the proper holder thereof had not connived at such improper use.

Commissioner of Railways' Office, Perth, 7th April, 1891.

In addition to the usual charge, a deposit of 10s. will be required on all Periodical Tickets, which will be returned on delivering up the said Ticket; but if not so delivered up within 24 hours after the expiration of the time for which the Ticket was issued, the said deposit shall be absolutely forfeited.

A new Periodical Ticket in lieu of one lost will only be issued on payment of ten per cent. on the original cost of such lost ticket (See By-Laws 13 and 14).

Note.—All Periodical Tickets are issued subject to any alteration which may be made in the Trains during their currency, and no allowance or compensation will be made to the holders on account of any alteration in the time, or reduction in number of Trains. No allowance or extension of time will be made on the ground of the holder of a Periodical Ticket having through sickness or disaster, or any other cause whatever, failed to use the ticket during the period or any part of the period for which it was issued.

Passengers' Tickets.

Any person (unless having a free pass) taking a seat at any Station where there is a Booking Office, or remaining in any carriage used on the Railway, as a passenger therein, without having first paid his fare, and obtained a ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 (See By-Law No. 1).

Children,

Children under three years of age, Free; above three and under twelve years, Half-fare.

Return Tickets.

Return tickets will be available only on the day of issue, or from Saturday to Monday, with the exception of Tickets issued to or from places beyond Guildford, which will be available for seven days, inclusive of day of issue, but exclusive of Sundays.

Return tickets issued to Stations beyond Beverley will be available for one month.

Special Trains. Excursions, Picnics.

Rates for Special Trains can be obtained from the Traffic Manager, Perth, to whom persons wishing to engage Special or Excursion Trains must give at least three days Notice in writing; and it is to be distinctly understood that the Commissioner of Railways does not bind himself to let Special or Excursion Trains on Public Holidays. A concession of single fare for the double journey will be made to bond fide Excursion or Picnic parties of not less than 20, on special application to the Traffic Manager.

Passengers' Luggage.

First Class Passengers are allowed, of ordinary luggage, 84tbs.; Second Class, 56tbs. Any excess and articles of merchandise will. be charged for at Parcels Rates. Passengers are strongly recommended to have their names and the Station to which they are proceeding distinctly marked on their luggage, and to satisfy themselves that it is placed in the Train. The Commissioner of Railways will not be responsible for any luggage unless it is specially booked and paid for, and the owner's name and its destination distinctly marked thereon (See By-Law 15).

Smoking.

Smoking will only be permitted in the compartment of a Carriage set apart for that purpose (See By-Law 26).

Gratuities.

Servants of the Commissioner of Railways are prohibited from receiving any gratuity from the public, on pain of dismissal.

Irregularities,

It is requested that any irregularity may be immediately reported to the Traffic Manager, Perth.

Former Time Tables cancelled.

N.B.—All Time Tables published previous to this date are now cancelled.
