By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., ""The Transmitted Stock Act

PERTH:

W HEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," it is provided that it shall be lawful

for the Governor of the said Colony to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purpose of the said Act; AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the Governor, to set apart a Temporary Quarantine Station at Fremantle : Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, do hereby set apart as a Temporary Quarantine Station at Fremantle, for the purposes of the said Act, all that piece or parcel of land, being Fremantle Town Lot 363, as shown in the plans and records of the Survey Department of the said Colony.

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this 15th day of April, 1891.


