WHEREAS by "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," it is provided that the Birthday of the Sovereign shall be observed as a Bank Holiday, and whereas Her Majesty's Birthday this year falls on Sunday, and it is by the said Act provided that when a day fixed as a Bank Holiday falls upon a Sunday, the next following Monday shall be a Bank Holiday; AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that it is inexpedient that Monday, the 25th May in this year, should be a Bank Holiday: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the aforesaid recited Act, do declare and proclaim that Monday, the 25th day of May, 1891, shall not be a Bank Holiday; and I do hereby, with the like advice, appoint WEDNESDAY, the 27th day of May, 1891, to be a Bank Holiday, instead of the 25th day of May aforesaid.

FINDING OF THE COURT.

Pronounced in Open Court in the hearing of Henry Curtis Swan, late Master of the British barque "Raven."

We find that the British barque "Raven" was stranded near Dyer's Island, in the South Passage, between Rottnest Island and the Southern Reefs, on the evening of the 11th instant, through your default, and that the charges preferred against you have been fully proved.

We, therefore, under the powers granted unto us under the Local Ordinances, 28 Vic., No. 2, 40 Vic., No. 4, and 51 Vic., No. 6, cancel your Master Mariner's Certificate of Competency, No. 151, but with permission to use a Chief Mate's Certificate.

Men who fail to qualify in a class to repeat the practice again in that class.

147. Every man who commences the course will fire the 60 rounds through the three periods, with the following exception:—

- (a) Those who fail to make 55 points in the first period cannot go on to 500 and 600 yards until they do so; but must repeat the practice at 200 and 300 yards, in a separate squad.
- (b) Similarly, a man failing to make 55 points in the second-class must fire again at 500 and 600 yards in a separate squad.

148. At the conclusion of the annual course, men will be classified as follows:

	CLASSIFICATION.
3rd Class Shots	{ All men failing to score 55 points and upwards, and thus passing into the second class.
2nd Class Shots	{ Men who have passed into the 2nd class, but failed to score 55 points therein, and thus pass into the 1st class.
1st Class Shots	{ Men who have passed into the 1st class, but failed to score 60 points therein.
Marksmen	{ Men who when firing in the 1st class obtain 60 points and upwards.

- 1st. By the total aggregate hits.
- 2nd. By the value of each shot in the range practices taken in inverse order, commencing with the longest distance.
